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MINUTES of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of
Riverhead, held in the Town Clerk's Office, Saturday, April
23d, 1916 at 2:30 P.M.

Minutes of previous meeting read and on motion
adopted.

On motion it was ordered that Supervisor be
authorized to transfer \$300.00 from Contingent Fund to
Miscellaneous Fund.

A petition, having been filed with the Town Clerk
of the Town of Riverhead on the 8th day of April, 1916
by Herman H. Wells and others, praying for the establish-
ment of a lighting district in the territory included
within school districts Nos. 7 and 8 of said Town and
said petition having been presented to the Town Board
of the Town of Riverhead at a meeting of such Board duly
held at the office of the Town Clerk in said Town on the
8th day of April, 1916, and said Town Board having by reso-
lution of April 8, 1916, caused a notice of the time and
place of action upon such petition to be published for one
week in the Riverhead News and The County Review, two pub-
lic newspapers published in said Town, and said Town Board
having met at the time and place specified in said notice,
to-wit, at the Town Clerk's office in said Town on the 22d
day of April, 1916, at 2:30 o'clock P.M., to act upon said
petition, and proof of publication of said notice in each
of said newspapers having been duly filed with the Town
Clerk of said Town Board having duly considered said peti-
tion and having determined that said petition is in due
form and signed by a majority of the tax payers of such
proposed lighting district, and no one having appeared in
opposition to said petition.

RESOLVED, that a lighting district be and the
same hereby is established in the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk
County, New York, to be known as the Aquebogue Lighting
district, which district shall include the territory within

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the boundaries of school districts Nos. 7 and 8 and in said Town and generally bounded and described as follows:

DISTRICT No.7.

Bounded by a line beginning at a point where the stream leading into the Brook Pond crosses the Northville Turnpike, and following said Turnpike to its intersection with Doctor's Path; thence following Doctor's Path northward to a point one-half way between the North and South Roads; thence running to the northwest corner of District No. 8; thence bounded on the east by the line making the west boundary of District No. 8; thence on the south by the Bay and Peconic River to Sawmill Brook Pond and stream to the place of beginning.

DISTRICT No.8.

Bounded on the east by a line commencing on the Main South Road at a point 10 chains east of Tuthill's Path and running north 23° 30' west to District No. 11, also on the east by a line running south 23° 30' east commencing on the Main South Road 13½ chains east of Tuthill's Path and extending to the L. I. R. R.; also by a line commencing on the L. I. R. R. and running south 23° 30' east to the Bay. The three lines above mentioned forming the west boundaries respectively of lands owned by W. S. Benjamin, Geo. W. Tuthill, and Edward Young. Bounded on the south by District No. 14 and Peconic Bay; bounded on the west and north by a broken line commencing on the Bay at a point where a line running north 23° 30' west and which crosses the South Road 1450 feet west of West Lane meet said Bay and continued 3000 feet north of said South Road, and then running east to within 300 feet of West Lane; thence running northerly parallel to West Lane to a point 4380 feet north of South Road; Thence by a line running north 80° east to Church Lane; thence bounded on the north by a line one-half way between the North and South Roads to the east boundary.

There being no further business, meeting adjourned
