

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, July 8, 1936 at 9:00 A.M.

Roger M. Wiley, Town Attorney and William H. Clark, Supt. of Highways were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on June 24, 1936 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A bill from the Estate of Elizabeth Morell signed by Harold B. Smith, Agent in the amount of \$187.50 for two and one half years rent for a drainage pipe through their property was submitted to the Board.

On motion made by Justice Kelly and seconded by Justice Boutcher it was RESOLVED by unanimous consent that the above matter be referred to the County Highway Department.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Kelly it was RESOLVED by unanimous consent that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized and directed to transfer the sum of \$1710.22 from the Receiver of Taxes Account to the General Town Account.

On motion made by Justice Luce and seconded by Justice Boutcher it was RESOLVED by unanimous consent that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized and directed to transfer the sum of \$41.67 from the Surplus Account to the General Town Account for the purpose of paying interest on certificates of Indebtedness for Snow Removal.

The Supervisors report for the month of June, 1936 was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Mr. Sweezy Conklin addressed the Board in regard to bulk-heading the Town Dock and the Town Parking Place which abuts Peconic River. He stated that it is about 50 ft. across McDermott Avenue and about 90 ft. at the Town Parking Place and further stated he would do the necessary bulk-heading for the following prices:

2" x 8" fir timber at \$6.00 per ft.
2" x 8" ~~fir~~ yellow pine (creosoted) at \$8.90 per ft.
4" x 8" ~~fir~~ yellow pine (creosoted) at \$11.00 per ft.

He also advised the Board to fill in the old Town slip at McDermott Avenue with dry material which would take 1000 yards at 15¢ per yard, without cartage or material and cartage for the lump sum of \$400.00.

A petition signed by 23 inhabitants of Jamesport, requesting the Board to appoint a special traffic policeman to serve at the intersection of Main Street and the main highway in that village during July and August. The petition was ordered placed on file.

Mr. Howard Downs of South Jamesport addressed the Board complaining of the unnecessary noise which is continually disturbing his patrons at his hotel from early evening till 2:00 A.M. in the morning and requested Police protection in that vicinity.

Mr. Clifford Raynor of South Jamesport addressed the Board and also complained of the noise in that vicinity and asked the Board for Police protection.

A delegation from Wading River addressed the Board in regard to the heavy traffic at the intersection of the Mannor-Wading River Road and the North Wading River Road which leads to the Wildwood State Park and asked the Board to place a traffic policeman at that corner on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays during the summer season.

On motion made by Justice Boutcher and seconded by Justice Warner, it was RESOLVED that George Condjella be and he hereby is appointed Special Policeman to serve at Wading River on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays from July 11, 1936 and up to and including September 7, 1936, under the supervision of the Special Policeman in Charge of the Police of the Town of Riverhead and it is further

RESOLVED that said Special Policeman serve at the pleasure of the Town Board at a salary of \$3.60 per day. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Boutcher and seconded by Justice Warner, it was RESOLVED that Special Policeman Frank E. Raciniewski be and he hereby is authorized to serve at Jamesport on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays from July 11, 1936 and up to and including September 7, 1936, under the supervision of the Special Policeman in Charge of the Police of the Town of Riverhead, and it is further

RESOLVED that said Special Policeman serve at the pleasure of the Town Board at a salary of \$3.60 per day. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Kelly it was RESOLVED by unanimous consent that the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead request the department of the U.S. Government having charge of navigation to establish a speed limit of six miles per hour for power boats using the Peconic River.

On motion made by Justice Luce and seconded by Justice Warner it was RESOLVED that the Assessors of the Town of Riverhead be authorized to hire a car for necessary transportation in the performance of their duties, at a rate not to exceed \$10.00 for each full day for a total period not to exceed 30 days in any calendar year. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution

thereupon declared duly adopted.

Mr. C. W. Ludlam addressed the Board in regard to lowering the sidewalk in front of his property on the north side of West Main Street during the construction of the Sewer System.

Mr. Clark of the State Highway Department addressed the Board in regard to the above matter, stating that ^{it would not only be a good improvement} but it would also eliminate a double curb, thus widen the highway.

On motion made by Justice Luce and seconded by Justice Warner, it is **RESOLVED** by unanimous consent that the above matter be referred to the Town Attorney.

The Town Board convened at 12:15 noon to reconvene at 1:45 P.M.

Mr. J. D. Whittaker of the Utility Consumers Service, Inc., submitted a report covering a survey of utilities purchased by the Town of Riverhead as a municipal corporation pursuant to a resolution duly adopted September 11, 1935, and on motion and vote was ordered placed on file.

The Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined the Welfare bills for the month of June, 1936.

On motion made by Justice Kelly and seconded by Justice Warner, it is **RESOLVED** that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to pay the Welfare bills for the month of June, 1936 as approved by the Welfare Officer of the Town. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes, Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on July 15, 1936 at 8:30 P.M.
