

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Twn of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, July 29, 1936 at 9:00 A.M.

Roger M. Wiley, Town Attorney and William H. Clark, Supt. of Highways were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on July 8th and minutes of a meeting held on July 15th, 1936 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication was read from F. W. Jackson & Sons, Inc., making application to the Town of Riverhead to accept the Highway known as Northern Parkway as a Town Highway.

On motion duly made by Justice Kelly and seconded by Justice Boutcher, it was RESOLVED that the offer of F. W. Jackson and Sons, Inc. to dedicate to the Town of Riverhead, the premises lying in the street known as Northern Parkway, pursuant to a letter dated July 20, 1936, be accepted and that the same is approved as a public highway in the Town of Riverhead and upon receipt of a deed therefore, the Supt. of Highways, is requested to enter an order of laying out said street as a public highway. The resolution was carried by the unanimous vote of the Board.

Mr. H. E. Campbell addressed the Board in regard to supplies and upkeep of the Police automobile, stating that he would like to submit a price for all proper maintenance of the Police automobile on a mileage basis. The matter was referred to the Police Committee.

A communication was read from the Riverhead Chapter of the American Red Cross thanking the Board for the co-operation given them during the swimming campaign and requested the Board to continue the service of the life guard at the Pier for the remainder of the summer season.

Mr. Howard Wells addressed the Board and recommended that a life guard be continued at the Pier Avenue Beach until Labor Day.

Mrs. P. V. Ketcham addressed the Board stating that many residents of the Town of Riverhead have expressed their opinion as to the need of a Life Guard at the Pier Avenue beach and asked the Board to consider continuing the present Life Guard at the Pier Avenue Beach till Labor Day.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Boutcher, it was RESOLVED that Horace Corwin be continued as a Life Guard at the Beach at Pier Avenue to serve at the pleasure of the Board from the 20th day of July to the 7th day of September, 1936, salary at the rate of \$20.00 per week for seven days a week from 12 O'clock noon till 8:00 P.M. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A communication was read from the Riverside Engineering Corporation containing a proposal for the construction of bulkheads on the property at present owned by Mrs. Archibald Hallett and leased by the Town as a parking place and across the foot of McDermott Avenue, known as the Town Dock. On motion and vote the proposal was ordered placed on file.

Thomas J. Walker, Special Policeman in Charge of the Riverhead Police Department addressed the Board and recommended that the Traffic Light on the south side of Main Street at Roanoke Avenue be moved a few feet East, in order that the light may be more readily seen by Auto drivers going East on Main Street after stopping for the light, thus eliminating much delay in traffic at that intersection.

On motion made by Justice Boutcher and seconded by Justice Luce, it was RESOLVED by unanimous consent that the above matter be referred to the Police Committee with the power to act.

A communication from the Riverhead Fire Department including their budget voted at their annual election was read and on motion and vote was ordered placed on file.

A communication from the Board of Supervisors of the County of Suffolk including a certified copy of a resolution which was duly adopted, fixing Monday, November 30, 1936, as the date at which time the taxes for the next fiscal year will be levied. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication from Mr. George Gassert in regard to No Parking signs in front of the driveways leading to his place of business was read and on motion and vote the matter was referred to the Supt. of Highways.

The matter in regard to the grade for the sidewalk on the west side of Griffing Avenue was brought to the attention of the Board and on motion and vote the matter was referred to the Supt. of Highways and the Highway Committee.

On motion duly made by Justice Boutcher and seconded by Justice Warner, it was RESOLVED that Lorimer M. Raynor be and he hereby is appointed Attendance Officer of School Districts Nos. 8, 9, 10 and 11 and be it further

RESOLVED that the compensation of the said Attendance Officer be fixed at the rate of \$250.00 per year, payable semi-annually, which compensation shall include all expenses other than those incurred when attending meetings outside of the Town of Riverhead, called by the District Superintendent of Schools, at which time actual expenses are to be paid by the

Town of Riverhead. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher and Kelly, Yes, Justice Luce, Not Voting, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes, 4, Not Voting 1, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion duly made by Justice Boutcher and seconded by Justice Warner, it was RESOLVED that Joseph K. Major be and he hereby is appointed Attendance Officer of Riverhead School Districts Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 12 and 13 and be it further,

RESOLVED that the compensation of said Attendance Officer be fixed at the Rate of \$250.00 per year, payable semi-annually, which compensation shall include all expenses other than those incurred when attending meetings outside of the Town of Riverhead, called by the District Superintendent of Schools, at which time actual expenses are to be paid by the Town of Riverhead. The vote, Justices Warner and Boutcher, Yes, Justices Kelly and Luce, No, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 3, No 2. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion and vote the Town Board adjourned at 12:00 O'clock upon to reconvene at 1:45 P.M.

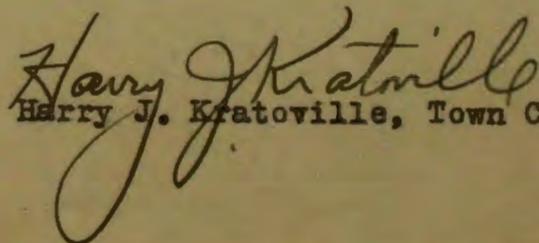
