

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, May 21, 1947 at 2.00 P.M.

Arthur H. Lundberg, Town Attorney and Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on May 7, 1947 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

The Supervisor's Report for the month of April, 1947 was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The Receiver of Taxes submitted a report of the amount of taxes collected as of May 16, 1947 and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Supervisor Kelly advised the Board that he had executed two Capital Notes in the Suffolk County National Bank for the sum of \$5,500.00 each at 3%, pursuant to a resolution duly adopted on May 7, 1947.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Zaleski it was Resolved that the proposal of The Bartlett Tree Expert Company dated March 15, 1947 in reference to the care of certain trees within the limits of the Town of Riverhead for the sum of \$1,000.00 be accepted. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

A communication was read from the Riverhead Post, American Legion requesting the Board to have the flag pole at the World War Monument painted before Decoration Day. On motion and vote, the Supervisor was instructed to inform the American Legion Post that the Monument and pole were on the property of the Suffolk County Historical Society property and for that reason, the matter should be referred to that Society as the Board had no jurisdiction over private property.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that the Supervisor be delegated to contact the proper person to act as co-ordinator for the Youth Program for the Town of Riverhead under the administration of the Town Board. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

The offer of Dr. Perry Elmont to rent his property/to the Town for use as a parking field was presented to the Board for their consideration.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that Richard Heinan be appointed Special Policeman for the

Hamlet of Wading River, beginning May 24th, 1947, at a salary of \$1.00 per hour, working Saturdays, Sundays and holidays and one hour on week-days from 7:00 P.M. to 8 P.M. at the Wading River Post Office. The Vote Justice Leonard Absent, Justices Warner, Yousik and Zaleski Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. Total Vote Yes 4, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved, that John Gatz be appointed Special Policeman for the Town of Riverhead, beginning May 24th, 1947, at a salary of \$1.00 per hour, working Saturdays, Sundays and holidays, 8 hours per day, and is to be assigned to police Railroad and Pulaski Streets on said days and any other duties designated by the Chief. The Vote Justice Leonard Absent, Justices Warner, Yousik, and Zaleski Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. Total Vote Yes 4, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Zaleski it was Resolved, that the Supervisor be authorized to transfer the sum of \$845.95 from the current Surplus Account to the following accounts:

The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

The contract for street lighting for a period of five years between the Long Island Lighting Company and the South Jamesport Lighting District was submitted to the Board. On motion and vote the contract was approved and signed by the members of the Board.

Supervisor Kelly welcomed the members of the Brookhaven Town Board and turned the meeting over to Supervisor Philipp A. Hattemer of the Town of Brookhaven.

Supervisor Hattemer stated that the joint meeting was called to order for the purpose of opening bids for the construction of the Manorville Bridge on David Terry Street (River Road) in the Towns of Brookhaven and Riverhead.

Proof of Publication of Notice to Bidders was submitted and ordered placed on file.

The one and only bid was opened as follows:

Lowe Construction Co. Inc., Baldwin, N.Y. for the sum of \$12,892.50

After due deliberation of the Town Boards and the Supt. of Highways of both Towns, Supt. of Highways Still of Brookhaven and Supt. of Highways Young of Riverhead recommended that the bid be accepted.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that the bid of the Lowe Construction Co. Inc. for the construction of the Manorville Bridge in the amount of \$12,892.50 be and the same is hereby accepted. The Vote Justice Leonard Absent, Justices Warner, Yousik

and Zaleski Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. Total Vote Yes 4, No 0. The members of the Brookhaven Town Board voted unanimously in favor of the adoption of the foregoing resolution. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Riverhead Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town bills to date. The highway machinery bills for the period from May 1, 1947 to May 15, 1947 were also audited.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, June 4, 1947 at 2:00 P.M.
