

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, September 9, 1936 at 9:00 A. M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on August 28th, 1936 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication from the County Department of Highways including a certificate and notice of the closing of a portion of Northville Turnpike was read and ordered placed on file.

A communication from Department of State Division of the Land Office in regard to the building of a bulkhead at the Town Dock and the Town parking place was read and ordered placed on file.

Proof of publication from the Riverhead News of the Notice of the adoption of a resolution authorizing the Supervisor to borrow the sum of \$2000.00 for the purpose of bulkheading the water front along the Town parking place and to fill in and bulkhead the old Town Dock property, subject to a permissive referendum was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was ordered placed on file.

An affidavit of posting the above notice in five public places within the Town pursuant to Law was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was ordered placed on file.

The Supervisor's report for the month of August, 1936 was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Kelly and seconded by Justice Boutcher it was RESOLVED that the next regular meeting of the Town Board be held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, September 23, 1936 at 9:00 A. M., at which time preliminary estimates for the ensuing year will be presented. The resolution was carried by the unanimous vote of the Board.

Mr. George W. Hildreth, Attorney addressed the Board in regard to Willow Street, Fourth Street, Third Street and Second Street in South Jamesport, and requested the Board to open said Streets. The matter was referred to the Town Attorney, Supt. of Highways and the Highway Committee.

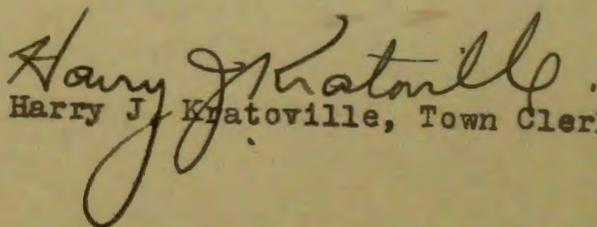
Supt. of Highways Clark addressed the Board in regard to the drainage of surface water from Pulaski Street in the vicinity of Claus Avenue, explaining the situation which now exists. The matter was referred to the Highway Committee for investigation and report.

On motion made by Justice Kelly and seconded by Justice Boutcher was RESOLVED that the Lighting Committee be authorized to purchase one 28ft. extension ladder to be used for any purpose the said Committee deems advisable. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, No. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Boutcher and seconded by Justice Luce was RESOLVED that George Cooper, Special Policeman, be continued at full salary for a period of one month beginning September 15, 1936 at his present salary. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes, Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board convened as a Board of Audit and examined the expense bills for the month of August, 1936.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on September 23, 1936 at 9:00 A.M.
