

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, October 15th, 1941 at 2:00 P. M.

Minutes of meetings of the Town Board held on October 2, 1941 and October 8th, 1941 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication was read from the War Department, United States Engineer's Office in regard to the application of DeFriest's Ship Yard, Riverhead, N. Y., for a War Department permit to dredge in Meeting House Creek at Aquebogue, Suffolk County, N. Y. The communication was ordered placed on file.

Justice Kelly stated that he wished to go on record as not opposing the dredging of Meeting House Creek but that he wished to go on record as opposing the way the matter was handled.

Supervisor Sawyer stated that he wished to go on record as saying that the only thing he is interested in is, that the work be done as soon as possible.

A communication was read from John J. Levy, Sheriff, expressing his sincere thanks and appreciation for the splendid help and cooperation his office received from Chief Thomas J. Walker and the entire Riverhead Town Police during the recent hunt for an escaped inmate of the Suffolk County Jail. The communication was ordered placed on file.

Mrs. M. N. Ammann addressed the Board in regard to the planting of trees in the Town of Riverhead. She explained the present situation and urged the Board to place an appropriation for trees in the budget. Mrs. Ammann was informed that the Annual Estimate for the next fiscal year has already been adopted, however, if anything could be done in regard to the matter, it would be done.

Mr. Germond Cochran addressed the Board stating that he has a communication from the representative of the owners of the MacDonald property on Griffing Avenue offering the said property for sale to the Town in the sum of \$12,000.00, for their consideration.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined the Town bills to date.

There being no further business on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on Thursday, November 6, 1941 at 8:00 P. M.
