Supervisor Vojvoda called the meeting to order at 10:30 A. M.

Justice Zaloga made observation that his comment made on page 248 of the Minutes of the Town Board Meeting held on June 6, 1967, should read, "the law firm of Smith, Tasker, Finkelstein and Lundberg", instead of "County Attorney".

The Town Clerk was directed to make such correction on page 248 of the June 6th, 1967 Minutes of the Town Board Meeting.

Whereupon Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Grodski.

The Bids were filed for the June 20th, 1967 Meeting of the Town Board.

Supervisor Vojvoda asked if anyone wished to be heard.

Mr. Jacob Harding, Riverhead, N. Y., appeared and addressed the Board in regard to the proposed acquisition of certain lands adjacent to Grangebél Park and stated that he knows that this project is the subject of a permissive referendum and there are many voices against it.

Mr. Harding continued saying that Grangebél Park was dedicated to the Town of Riverhead by way of a genuine gift and that it was accepted with the explicit promise that it would remain a park for the use of the people. And in order to help retain its character as a park and to show its practical use as a public park the Town Board wisely saw fit to propose the purchase of additional land adjacent to this park. That the acquisition of this property and the development of Grangebél Park will be a wonderful asset to the Town of Riverhead.

Mr. Harding also stated that he is in favor of such land acquisition for parks and recommended that the members of the Board work on this deal and sell it to the constituents by communicating by radio and letters, for if the matter is left without further action or effort on the Board's part the project may be lost and in the long run the people will be the losers. He urged the Board to enlist the support of the Garden Club and all civic minded groups, to justify its stand with the belief that a little education on the subject can go a long way.

Mr. Harding further stated that it is his opinion that the arguments of the "aginner's" on this proposal are not at all sound, as it appears that when it comes to assessments these people want the property assessed well but when you want to pay a price fairly well based upon that assessment they complain. That they present no facts of their own indicating value---merely saying "it's too much".

Mr. Harding continued saying, "Let us keep faith with the Griffing family who tried to give Riverhead something for its people. Let's have our own park instead of using one which is named for someone who is charging us rent for it."

Mr. Harding further stated that he feels there will be more people coming in to support the Board's proposal and hopes that before the vote is taken that there will be.

Mr. Harding further stated he would be very glad to assist in any way and stressed that the entire Board work to bring this project to a successful conclusion and not let one man have to do all the work.

Mr. Harding concluded his remarks saying that if the Board is successful in the acquisition of these certain lands the people of the Town of Riverhead will be the winners.

Supervisor Vojvoda thanked Mr. Harding for his remarks.

Mrs. Jeanette Demarest, 42 River Road, Riverhead, dated June 2, 1967, requesting something be done about condition of Maple Avenue going into Northville Turnpike, as streets fills up with water when it rains and floods yards and cellars of surrounding residents. Filed.

Supt. of Highways Alex E. Horton reported on the above matter stating that after a rain storm of one hour's duration this water runs into the County pipe which is already filled with water, and which pipe is not large enough to retain both Town and County waters.

Mr. Horton advised that the condition can only be corrected by the laying of a larger pipe or additional pipe, but it would be a costly project.

Supervisor Vojvoda suggested that Mr. Horton confer with the County regarding the laying of a larger pipe and possibly they may be willing to share the costs.

Reeves Park Estates Civic Association, Inc., requesting adequate and full police protection for the summer months. Filed.

Referred to Police Chief Grodski.

John E. Hurley, dated June 13, 1967, requesting drainage easements be executed between the Town of Riverhead and Riverhead Cement Block Company. Filed.
Preparation of Easement referred to Town Attorney.

Town of Riverhead Planning Board, dated June 16, 1967, recommending petition of John and Wanda Wittmeier for a change of zone from Farm 1 - District to Business 1 District of a portion of their property at Route 25, Aquebogue, be granted and that the request for special permit from the Town Board be granted for three additional trailers. Filed.

Referred to Town Attorney.

HIGHWAY MATTERS

Supt. of Highways Alex E. Horton reported that the Riverhead Cement Block Co., desires an Easement be drawn up by the Town, for their protection on the matter of a drainage pipe which was installed on their yard some years ago to correct a drainage problem in front of their property.

Mr. Horton also reported that the matter of correcting Mrs. Wilson's drainage problem on Sound Shore Road is still pending as Alden W. Young has not had time to work on same.

HEADS OF DEPARTMENTS

Police Chief Grodski reported that all beaches and waters and approaches thereto have been posted.

Donald Rhuda, Recreation Supervisor informed the Board that he had discussed with Chief Grodski the matter of assigning a special man at Stotzky Park during the time of 8 P. M. to 10:30 P. M. to eliminate any possibilities of problems arising there, as the Park is occupied 6 nights a week, especially during the summer months when Mondays through Wednesdays being the peak of the week due to the varieties of activities scheduled.

HEADS OF DEPARTMENTS continued:

Police Chief Grodski stated he suggested that Malcolm Stewart who is willing to accept such assignment would be a logical person to handle such work as he could use the scooter which is equipped with radio and he could summon for help if the need arose.

After discussion on the matter, the Board concurred that a man be assigned to Stotzky Park during the summer months.

Mr. Rhuda spoke on the problem of erosion taking place on the west side of Columbus Avenue road and recommended that curbs and gutters be erected in that area to correct the situation.

Supervisor Vojvoda advised Mr. Rhuda to add this matter to the list of drainage, curb and gutter projects to be undertaken by the Town.

Justice Zaloga reported he had received information that there was vandalism at the Jamesport Marina over this past weekend and suggested to Chief Grodski that the Police Department give more patrol attention to the area.

Police Chief Grodski advised the Board that all Town properties are under close Police surveillance.

Donald Rhuda stated that he has a report on the matter and it does not disclose that the damages sustained to the boats were caused by acts of vandals.

Robert L. Tooker, Esq., spoke to the Board on a situation occurring at the Iron Pier Beach where youngsters using the parking lot stream in and out of it at a high rate of speed spinning their wheels and causing the sand to fly. He further stated that this is mostly done between the hours of 10 and 11 o'clock in the evenings and suggested that the area be patrolled at intervals.

Supervisor Vojvoda asked if improved lighting might help correct this situation.

Mr. Tooker agreed that it would be of much help. He stated that it is a nice place to drive in and look at the waters, but the road is lined with tire marks where the youngsters using their cars spin in and out of the lot.

Police Chief Grodski stated that he would assign a patrol to all Town beaches.

At this point Supervisor Vojvoda recessed the meeting to hold a Public Hearing.

PUBLIC HEARING - 11:00 A. M.

Town Clerk submitted affidavits of Publication and Posting of Notice of Public Hearing on proposals to amend Zoning Ordinance No. 26, of the Town of Riverhead, relating to subdivision plats. Affidavits ordered filed.

Thereupon Supervisor Vojvoda declared the Hearing open and asked anyone wishing to be heard in favor of or against the proposed amendment to so speak.

Robert L. Tooker, Esq., appeared on behalf of Petitioners stating the proposed amendment meets with the approval of Mr. Lundberg, Special Council to Zoning Commission and urged the Board to give its consideration to the passing of the amendment.

No one else wishing to be heard and no communications having been received thereto, Supervisor Vojvoda declared the Hearing closed and re-opened the meeting.

Robert L. Tooker as President of the Central Suffolk Hospital Ass'n., asked permission to make the following comment: "You may have read in the newspapers last week of the troubles Central Suffolk Hospital has been having with the County Welfare Department. I would like to say, first of all, that those troubles are well on their way to resolution and second of all, that we very much appreciate Bob Vojvoda's help, before we got to the County Board of Supervisors and since then. I think it is going to work out well as there seems to be a very healthy attitude on the part of the Welfare Department to resolve these difficulties and I don't want any one to get the idea that the Hospital is irritated or displeased. We know Mr. Kirby has a difficult job to do and I am pleased to say it is working out."

Town Attorney Shepard M. Scheinberg made the following comment in connection with farm trailers: "Some of the farmers are now attempting to obtain variances to the farm trailer ordinance and it has been rumored that the Zoning Board of Appeals is going to go along with it---to allow additional trailers as well as shortening the distance from the road to the plat. Now you know the Zoning Board of Appeals has the authority to do this, so it might be wise for the members of the Board to speak to the Appeals Board to get this straightened out because if this is so, the whole amendment will go down the drain."

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, has caused all matters and things to be done which are required by the Town Law and other statutes made and provided in connection with the amendment of Town Ordinance No. 26 of the Town of Riverhead, known as the "Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York. "

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead hereby amends the existing Ordinance No. 26, entitled, "Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, " in accordance with Article V, Section 501 of said Ordinance and in accordance with the New York Town Law, Section 265, as follows:

Article II - Section 210L - Savings Clause

The provisions of Section 210B, as amended, effective May 7, 1966, shall not apply to subdivision plats having heretofore and on or before January 1, 1966 received preliminary approval by the Planning Board of the Town of Riverhead under the provisions of Section 210B, then in force; provided, said plat or the first section thereof is filed with the recording officer of the County before the 1st day of September, 1967. The exemption made hereby shall apply for a period of three years from the date of filing said plat or the first section thereof.

And the Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to enter the said amendment in the minutes of the Town Board, and to publish a copy once in the News-Review, the official newspaper published in the Town, and to post a copy of the same, on the sign-board maintained by the Town Clerk, pursuant to Subdivision 6 of Section 30 of the Town Law, and file in her office affidavits of said publication and posting.

WHEREAS, STEVE MITACCHIONE, JOSEPHINE MITACCHIONE and LONG ISLAND GREEN SLOPES CORP. as Principals and CONTINENTAL CASUALTY COMPANY as Surety have filed a Performance Bond in the amount of \$5,500.00 guaranteeing to the Riverhead Town Board faithful performance in the completion of the roads to be constructed in the proposed subdivision known as "GREEN SLOPES", which Bond sets forth completion of the roads in a period not exceeding two years, all being pursuant to Section 277 of the Town Law, Section III, Paragraph F of the Rules and Regulations of the Planning Board for the Subdivision and Platting of Land,

RESOLVED, That any expenses incurred in connection with the defense of this action be authorized as a general town expense.

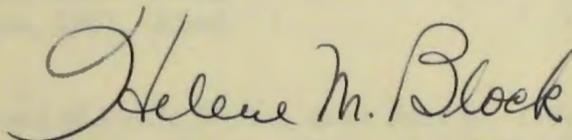
