Supervisor Vojvoda thanked Mrs. Tormey for the communication and requested that she confer with the Town Attorney.

BOARD OF AUDIT

The Town Board convened as a Board of Audit and examined the following bills submitted on Abstracts No. 21: General Town - \$24,373.26, Highway Item No. 1 - \$8,311.23, Highway Item No. 3 - \$2,605.34 and Highway Item No. 4 - \$418.52.

Councilman Grodski offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

RESOLVED, That General Town bills submitted in the amount of \$24,373.26, be approved for payment, and

FURTHER RESOLVED, That Highway Item No. 1 bills in the amount of \$8,311.23, Highway Item No. 3 bills in the amount of \$2,605.34 and Highway Item No. 4 bills in the amount of \$418.52, be approved for payment.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Zaloga, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Town Justice Zaloga spoke on the posting of campaign material which is still remaining on trees and poles within the Township of Riverhead and requested Police Chief Grodski to take immediate steps that the persons responsible for this unlawful act remove all traces of these postings at the earliest possible time.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT MATTERS

Alex E. Horton, Supt. of Highways spoke on the matter of removing old road signs and erecting new signs in compliance with the law and wondered if an expert should be retained in the matter of advising the type of signs, costs, etc.

After discussion the Town Board referred the matter to Councilman Young, Town Attorney Scheinberg, Police Chief Grodski and the Superintendent of Highways.

HIGHWAY MATTERS continued:

Mr. Horton advised the Board that his office has contacted the Department of Audit and Control in regard to Section 26 of the Local Finance Law which Town Justice Costello read at the Budget Hearing and was informed that the Section pertained to the year 1967 only.

Town Justice Costello stated it could be extended to 1968.

Town Attorney Scheinberg stated that the Section had nothing to do with anything else but the issuance of Serial Bonds because of the excess snow fall during 1964 to December, 1966.

RECREATION

Donald Rhuda, Recreation Supervisor, extended invitation to the Board members to attend the Football Banquet at the Polish Hall at 6:30 P. M. on November 15, 1967.

PERSONAL APPEARANCES

Mr. Henry Fioto, Jr., addressed the Board and asked if the Trailer Park adjacent to the American Legion Building has been granted a permit for extension of facilities.

RESOLVED, That the Town of Riverhead enter into an agreement with the Town of Southampton, as per a renewal endorsement permitting dumping privileges to the Town of Southampton as set forth therein, for the sum of \$2,500.00 for the period from January 1, 1968 to December 31, 1968, and

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Supervisor be and he is hereby authorized to sign said agreement on behalf of the Town of Riverhead.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Zaloga, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Town Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Costello.

RESOLVED, That Edward J. Gadzinski, H.E.A.O. Sanitation Department, be paid the sum of \$28.60 for 11 hours overtime (Columbus Day), at the rate of \$2.60 per hour.

At this point of the meeting, Supervisor Vojvoda called a recess to hold a Public Hearing.

PUBLIC HEARING - 11:10 A.M.

Public Hearing in the matter of revising Ordinance No. 7 to be known as "Ordinance Regulating Peddlers and Solicitors" and repealing Ordinance No. 7 known as the "Peddlers Ordinance", adjourned from October 3, 1967.

Supervisor Vojvoda thereupon declared the Hearing open and asked if anyone wished to speak in favor of or against the aforesaid matter to so speak and also asked the Town Attorney if anyone submitted suggestions for deletions or additions to the aforesaid Ordinance No. 7.

Town Attorney Shepard M. Scheinberg stated that he has received suggestions from Police Chief Grodski relating to peddlers who have hot dog stands and soliciting by telephone.

Mr. Scheinberg further stated that these suggestions are well taken and it will mean that the Ordinance will have to be revised.

No one else wishing to be heard and no communications having been received thereto, Supervisor Vojvoda declared the Hearing closed, and re-opened the meeting.

It was decided that the Ordinance be revised and re-submitted to the Town Board on November 21, 1967.

RESOLUTION

Town Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Zaloga.

WHEREAS, The Town of Riverhead is desirous of relocating a portion of the bed of "Wading River", by certain dredging to an area easterly of its present location and southerly of the mean high water mark of Long Island Sound, and

WHEREAS, Such work shall affect the land of the Long Island Lighting Company, and

WHEREAS, The Long Island Lighting Company has granted its permission and consent to the Town of Riverhead to do said dredging, pursuant to the terms of a letter agreement dated October 24, 1967 directed to the Town of Riverhead;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead finds it in the best public interest to accept the foregoing license as set forth in the agreement of October 24, 1967, and it is

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Supervisor be and is hereby authorized to execute the aforementioned agreement on behalf of the Town of Riverhead.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Zaloga, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

HEADS OF DEPARTMENTS

Police Chief Grodski called the Board's attention to Fuel Oil and Radio Maintenance Bids and was directed to prepare the necessary resolutions and specifications for same.

Police Chief Grodski informed the Board that he is fearful that the proposed toilet facilities to be located in the Grangebél Park area will pose a serious police problem and

asked if it has been determined where the facilities will be erected.

Supervisor Vojvoda advised Police Chief Grodski to review the locations from plans prepared by Donald Denis, Architect, which are on file at the Riverhead Library.

Irene J. Pendzick, Tax Receiver spoke to the Board on the matter of Civil Service rules pertaining to part-time clerks.

Mrs. Pendzick was advised to resolve the matter with the Town Attorney.

At this point of the Meeting Supervisor Vojvoda called a recess to hold a Public Hearing.

PUBLIC HEARING -11:30 A.M.

Public Hearing in the matter of proposals to revise Ordinance No. 29, known as "Ordinance Restraining the Running at Large of Dogs", and to repeal the existing Ordinance No. 29, known as "Ordinance Restraining the Running at Large of Dogs", adjourned from October 17, 1967.

Supervisor Vojvoda thereupon declared the Hearing open and asked if anyone wished to speak in favor of or against the aforesaid matter to so speak and also asked the Town Attorney if anyone submitted suggestions for deletions or additions to the aforesaid Ordinance No. 29.

Town Attorney Shepard M. Scheinberg stated that he has received the following suggestions from Police Chief Grodski:

1. Change Section 3 to include: Dogs habitually entering highways and running and barking at pedestrians and vehicles.
2. The biggest problem of a dog warden and the police department is dealing with complaints on female dogs while in heat. Include Section reading that owners shall secure indoors a female dog who is in heat for a period until the animal is out of the stage.

The reading of the second suggestion provoked much laughter.

A prolonged discussion ensued which was hilarious in context as everyone offered opinions on the "indelicate" subject.

Because of the lack of clinical knowledge concerning canine behavior no feasible solution was reached.

No one else wishing to be heard and no communications having been received thereto, Supervisor Vojvoda declared the Hearing closed, and re-opened the meeting.

It was decided that the Ordinance be revised and re-submitted to the Town Board on November 21, 1967.


WHEREAS, certain additional costs have arisen because of the lapse of time between the original bid by Riverhead Cement Block Co., Inc. and this date; and
