

Board of Town Officers of the town of Riverhead met at the Town Clerk's Office Saturday June 30' 1894 at 3 o'clock P.M., all members present except Town Clerk in whose absence Daniel R. Young acted as Clerk pro tem.

Supervisor stated that complaints had been made that the Hallett Electric Light Co. were not fulfilling its contract.

On motion the Supervisor and Town Clerk be a Committee to see that Charles Hallett in lighting the Village shall fulfil the terms of his contract and the Supervisor be empowered to use his discretion in paying for the extra lights above sixty.

At 3.30 P.M. the Town Clerk entered and reported that numerous complaints had been made of loafing on the sidewalks particularly Saturday and Sunday Evenings. The Board considered that they had no jurisdiction in the matter.

Justice Millard stated that he had been requested to ask the Board to pass some restrictive measure on firing crackers before the 4' July which was also considered that the Board had no jurisdiction.

Minutes read and adopted and the meeting adjourned.
