Supervisor Janoski: "Unfinished business we have a special permit for general aviation airport, that is presently before the Town Board.

From Thurm, we will be calling a Public Hearing on that this evening.

From Ngen Ock Lee, we are awaiting an engineer's report, it will be acted upon in a resolution this evening.

I would recognize anyone who wishes to be heard at this time, Hank."

Henry Fioto, 642 Northville Turnpike, "Members of the Board, at the last meeting at the end I had spoken in regards to the parking problem at Peconic Avenue and Vic who is not here tonight, had made it very clear that he had mentioned that he had spoken to every merchant on Peconic Avenue and we submitted seven names of all the merchants on Peconic Avenue who no one ever, nobody ever spoke to them. The affidavit was turned in. There was only eight merchants on Peconic Avenue, the one merchant is the one that's in the Barber Shop and I won't go into that, you fellows have the ax to grind, but I also have here eight hundred signatures of merchants, of customers on Peconic Avenue protesting the ban on

the parking on Peconic Avenue. I would like to also like to make note of the airport situation with all the write up it had and as long as it had (inaudible) there was only 3,000. This eight hundred customers in ten days. At this time I'd like to turn this in. ( At this time Henry Fioto handed in a petition with eight hundred three names) Filed in the Town Clerk's Office.

It was my basic understanding originally that the at the town's last meeting and I spoke to some of the members of the board. It was told to do that all the merchants were contacted and I spoke to some of the members of the board and they have all received copies of the this affidavit signed by the merchants and I'd like to know if the town intends to talk to the merchants because they had asked of that or is the town going to move ahead regardless in what the resolution is or whether, I'd like to have something definite if possible."

Supervisor Janoski: "It's my understanding that several of the merchants have been contacted and that you are scheduled to be tomorrow afternoon at 3:00 P.M.

Henry Fioto: "Well, who did they contact because nobody contacted my daughter and there's only seven merchants and I spoke to merchants today so I'd like to find, this is what happened last time."

Supervisor Janoski: "Oh Hank, I can only say that I'm informed that you're going to be in tomorrow at 3:00. There have been attempts to contact everyone of them, that, I know that some of them have been contacted, Mr. Liguri for example, I do know that he was talked to because I was present when the telephone call came back from him. As far as to who else was reachable I don't know."

Henry Fioto: "Well, I spoke to Moreno, Mr. Moreno early this evening and as far as I know he wasn't contacted and I spoke to the one next door to the the delicatessen early this evening and they haven't been contacted and as far as I know the guy in the barber shop never said he was contacted."

Supervisor Janoski: "You may be right. Now, there has been attempts to contact those people."

Henry Fioto: "Well, is there anybody I can contact too, so we can get this together?"

Supervisor Janoski: "I'm telling you Hank, that tomorrow we scheduled at 3:00 to have such a meeting and if you would like to be there, be there."

Henry Fioto: "Yes, I would. I'm not sure I'll get some of the merchants there too."

Supervisor Janoski: "Well, as I say, we are attempting to contact them. We have reached some of them and they've been told that we would like, we are available tomorrow at 3:00, the entire Town Board.

I would recognize anyone who wishes to be heard at this time. Dick Benedict."

Dick Benedict, Fanning Blvd, Riverhead: "Oh yeh, I don't believe it was brought up at my meetings or I must have overlooked it."

Supervisor Janoski: "You must have because it can only be done by resolution."

Dick Benedict: "Oh, thank you."

Supervisor Janoski: "There are about three minutes remaining before the first Public Hearing, Bill."

Bill Nohejl, Wading River: "In reference to Louis Stark, solutions for property owned in Wading River, Irene, do you have anything in correspondence to fill me in on that, what's it about?"

Irene Pendzick, Town Clerk: "Most of it was to buy his land."

Councilman Prusinowski: "It's down in Wading River Estates."

Bill Nohejl: "Is that where it is?"

Irene Pendzick: "Yeh, it's Wading River Estates. It's a lengthy letter."

Bill Nohejl: "If it's a lengthy letter, I was just concerned as to where it was. Now on the resolution, you're going to have a three quarter ton pickup, what is that for?"

Councilman Lombardi: "It's for the Highway Department."

Bill Nohejl: "For what actually?"

Supervisor Janoski: "John, do you want to tell Bill what you want to use the three quarter ton pick-up truck for. Yes, this will be recorded on the record."

John Ziemacki, Highway Superintendent: "We are bidding for a three quarter ton pick-up because we are planning to use one of the old pick-ups to put a plow on which we purchased a used plow to do some plowing in our cul-de-sacs and some of our dead-end streets where we can't get in with the big trucks and also we're thinking of putting some kind of a paint machine on the pick-up cell. Right now we do not have a vehicle for the paint shop and they have no way of transporting their paint in and the trucks are really high to use the other trucks."

Supervisor Janoski: "Thank you, John."

Bill Nohejl: "I was informed that it was for the Deputy Highway Superintendent, this is what's been going around and I was concerned about that."

Supervisor Janoski: "A lot has been going around."

Bill Nohejl: "Yes, I wouldn't be surprised if it is."

Councilman Boschetti: "We don't have a Deputy."

Irene Pendzick: "There isn't any."

Supervisor Janoski: "There isn't any Deputy after the 31st of December."

Bill Nohejl: "There will be no more Deputy?"

Supervisor Janoski: "No, the creation of the position ends on December 31st. The Town Board would have to re-create the position on January 1st, the Superintendent of Highways has not requested as such, so I would assume and he's right there if."

Bill Nohejl: "Is that true, John?"

Councilman Lombardi: "True, they'll be no Deputy."

Bill Nohejl: "Okay, sorry."

Councilman Lombardi: "That's alright."

Bill Nohejl: "On Sullivan's Trailer Park, they say it's a special permit application. In other words they have to go through a whole new permit in order to get their old permit re-established. No, yes, no. I see yes, I see, no."

Supervisor Janoski: "Well, we have to start all over again, why don't you explain."

Richard Ehlers, Town Attorney: "The judge wants us to make some findings of fact to give back to the courts so that it can make its decision on whether or not the denial of the application was correct, so this is to provide everybody another opportunity to build the record as they see fit both the opponents and pro-ponents."

Bill Nohejl: "Okay."

Richard Ehlers: "So it will end up back in the Supreme Court."

Bill Nohejl: "Okay, thank you."

Supervisor Janoski: "Let the record show that the hour of 7:46 P.M. has arrived the Town Clerk will please read a Notice of Public Hearing. "

The Town Clerk submitted affidavits of publishing and posting of a public notice for a public hearing to be held at Riverhead Town Hall on Tuesday, December 21, 1982 to hear all interested persons regarding the proposed amendment to the Town Code regarding "Parking Time Unlimited", to be known as Local Law No. 10-1982.

The affidavits were ordered to be placed on file.

Supervisor Janoski: "Thank you. Mr. Town Attorney."

Richard Ehlers: "Basically what this Section would do is create some one hour parking zones in the municipal parking lots, particularly in the Peconic River Parking lot on those stalls as designated on the map in pencil near the store fronts about two deep off near the Griffing Hardware Store. There are about six stalls in that vicinity. There are, oh in back of the church on Main Street in the parking lot that runs by First Street, several of the stalls in that area as well. The theory is that there should be some turnover parking lots, parking stall spaces in the parking lots and that they shouldn't be used for permanent parking by employees all day long. There's also six stalls parallel to Peconic Avenue which will service and replace those which have been removed from Peconic Avenue."

Supervisor Janoski: "Thank you. Does anyone wish to address the Town Board on this matter? Hank."

Henry Fioto: "You have a map you say with the what you call."

Richard Ehlers: "Which one was that?"

Henry Fioto: "On Peconic Avenue."

(At this time the Town Attorney, Richard Ehlers, shows Hank a map.)

Supervisor Janoski: "Hank, the parking spaces exist."

Henry Fioto: "Yes, but behind these buildings, this is Mr. Moreno's bar, right? From what I understand, this is the first building next to the out is Mr. Moreno's bar. Alright, or is it this? This is Mr. Moreno's bar in here and behind Mr. Moreno's bar from my recollection, as of five o'clock tonight there is a curbing that runs along into here and comes back into here,

there's a little opening in here but there's curbing here and I think the Superintendent of Highways can verify it. So we removed the curbing from here plus there's also parking right now there's spaces right along this section right here. There's approximately six or eight spaces directly, no this building in here, there's only one building there."

Supervisor Janoski: "There's six or seven, I think six in that area that runs parallel to Peconic Avenue. There the last ones closest to Peconic."

Richard Ehlers: "Hank."

Henry Fioto: "In other words, where the building is, in other words this building is longer on here. This building is gone."

Supervisor Janoski: "Yes."

Henry Fioto: "I was going to say, I know there's one building here in the alley way."

Richard Ehlers: "Right."

Henry Fioto: "Well, basically, I'm still opposed to the basic elimination of parking on Peconic Avenue, but I can see they already, they have some of these signs up already, In other words, now we're passing a law after the signs are up and the Griffing Hardware."

Supervisor Janoski: "That was passed some time ago, Hank."

Henry Fioto: "I'm not saying, he just Griffing Hardware."

Supervisor Janoski: "We are acting in a similar fashion as we did adjacent to Griffing Hardware. There was a Public Hearing on that some time ago. The board did pass a resolution establishing the one hour parking there. This is the same thing, that was the reference to Griffing Avenue."

Henry Fioto: "Because some of the merchants have asked me did they have a Special Hearing on that thing and I didn't know that he had just mentioned it. If there was, fine, but I still feel that we don't. I can see the one half hour parking or limited parking, one half hour or what ever it happens to be."

PUBLIC HEARING Continues -

Supervisor Janoski: "An hour."

Henry Fioto: "Well one hour parking, but I still say it will be a hazard. It would be a hindrance on parking on Peconic Avenue to the merchants. I could see it would be a turnover to some of the other stores closer to the other stores or the church, but I don't feel it's really going to help the Peconic Avenue merchants. I am not opposed to you know to the parking, you know, in the parking field itself. I think we do need it because there is, even if you want to stop over there right now, the bank personnel. all their people park there all day long and naturally they're there at eight o'clock in the morning and they're tied up till four or five o'clock at night."

Supervisor Janoski: "That's one of the reasons that we're doing what we're doing."

Henry Fioto: "But I still don't think it will help the Peconic Avenue merchants."

Supervisor Janoski: "Would anyone also wish to address the Town Board, Mr. Kasperovich."

(Mr. Kasperovich handed out sheets of paper to the Town Board Members at this time, regarding the Scavenger Waste Program in Riverhead, which are filed in the Town Clerk's Office.)

Supervisor Janoski: Bill, we're having a Public Hearing on Parking. Does this have to do with, I see scavenger waste here."

William Kasperovich: "Oh, I thought it was over."

Supervisor Janoski: "No, no."

William Kasperovich: "I'm lost in thought."

Supervisor Janoski: "Would anyone wish to address the Town Board regarding this Public Hearing on the Parking in Peconic Avenue establishing certain parking spaces as one hour? That being the case I declare the hearing closed."

PUBLIC HEARING Continues -

No one else wishing to be heard and no communications having been received thereto, Supervisor Janoski declared the hearing closed at 8:13 P.M.

Supervisor Janoski: "Let's move on with the resolutions."

#774 DENIES SPECIAL PERMIT APPLICATION OF NGEN OCK LEE

Councilman Lombardi offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Boschetti.

WHEREAS, a special permit application has been filed by Ngen Ock Lee dated June 30, 1982, requesting a special permit to operate a Type 6 Labor Camp on Route 25 in Calverton, and

WHEREAS, this application was referred to the Environmental Quality Review Board, which Board recommended that the application is a Type II action, pursuant to 6 N.Y.X.R.R. Section 617.11, and

WHEREAS, this matter has been referred to the Planning Board for their recommendation, which recommendation in favor of the application, noting certain restrictions, has been received by this Board, and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on the 7th day of December, 1982, and all those persons wishing to be heard were heard,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that this Board makes the following findings:

1. The applicant seeks permission to utilize a two story, wood frame construction, single family residence, as a Type 6 Labor Camp.
2. That applicant has not furnished a site plan by a certified engineer or land surveyor, but has furnished a hand drawing, without reference to square footages, showing two bedrooms, kitchen, living area and bathroom facility on the first floor and two bedrooms and a bath on the second floor.

RESOLUTIONS Continued -

3. That only two applications for a Type 6 labor camp have been reviewed by this Town Board and approved, both of which have required the construction of a masonry block building conforming to the minimum square footage requirements.

4. That the current applicant does not indicate the distance from Middle Country Road (Route 25) where the proposed camp is to be located.

5. That applicant does not show any fire protection or sprinkler system to be installed in the wood frame building.

6. That the Riverhead Town Code, Chapter 108, prohibits multi-family residential use in Industrial A Zone except for Type 6 labor camps.

Henry Fioto: "Thank you and one other thing, at the last meeting the Town Board had advertised for a new chief Building Inspector. Is this going to be a new position?"

Supervisor Janoski: "Yes."

Henry Fioto: "Is there any reason why we're passing over the present Building Inspector, Mr. Wiwczar. I understand he served the town for sixteen years and he has passed the Chief Building Inspector Test. Is there any reason why we're?"

Supervisor Janoski: "Mr. Wiwczar, will be one of the people who would be interviewed and considered for the job."

Henry Fioto: "I was wondering if there was any reason why. I mean, I know, he has served the Town for sixteen years."

Councilman Boschetti: "Hank, just because we advertised for the position doesn't necessarily mean we're passing over anyone. He has an opportunity to apply for that position as anyone else does."

Henry Fioto: "Well, then what will happen if he gets that position? Is that the same, holds two jobs and gets the same pay or he does he move up and then we have a vacancy in his other position."

Councilman Boschetti: "We would still have a vacancy."

Henry Fioto: "And he Fire -----in other words he could wear two hats, like they've been doing."

Councilman Boschetti: "That's right."

Supervisor Janoski: "I don't understand this question."

Henry Fioto: "Well, right now he's the Fire Inspector and."

Supervisor Janoski: "No he is not the Fire Inspector, he is the chairman of the Building Department and a Building Inspector. There is no Fire Inspector at the present time, that is really the basis of the Town's movement in that the Fire Department's of Riverhead, Wading River, Jamesport and Riverhead itself have requested of the Town Board to put in place a Fire Inspector which would involve the creation of a job, Fire Inspector, in the hiring of a person to do that job or the Town Board is moving in the direction of considering perhaps a person of high qualifications to be the head of the Building Department rather than creating the position of Fire Inspector, but we will see in the future just what happens after the interviews are carried out and what seems in the best interest of people of the Town."

Henry Fioto: "Roughly, what will that new job pay?"

Supervisor Janoski: "It's \$19,000., it's very close to \$20,000.00"

Henry Fioto: "Thank you."

Supervisor Janoski: "Nora."

Nora Brewer, Wading River: "I would like to wish, I would like to report to the Supervisor and to the Councilmen, that the Councilmen are doing a terrific job in handing out ----"

Councilman Lombardi: "I just want to say Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year and a lot of Health."


Councilman Artale: "May you all get what you want for Christmas and may you want what you get. See you next year."
