

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, on Wednesday, February 8, 1933.

The minutes of the Town Board meeting of January 25, 1933 were read and on motion and vote duly adopted.

A communication was presented from Robert Cunningham and ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from the Taxpayers Association of Huntington, enclosing a copy of bill which is to be introduced in the present session of the legislature, the chief feature of which provides for the payment of taxes in two installments. This communication was referred to the Audited Bills Committee with a request that the matter be investigated and a report be made at a future meeting of the Town Board.

No report being ready from the Highway Committee in connection with the mosquito control matter at Wading River and the Audited bills committee not being ready to report of the Barter System, these committees were continued.

J. Harry Brown addressed the Board on the merits of the Barter System as now being used in other sections of the country.

John T. Hill addressed the Board and asked that the Town Board request the the resignation of the present Planning Board so that a new Planning Board might be appointed with the view in mind of installing a sewer system and disposal plant for Riverhead Village using the unemployment labor in connection with this work.

The following resolution was unanimously adopted

Resolved That the members of the Town Board present at this meeting, hereby extend to Justice Robert Burnside their sympathy in his present illness and express the hope for his speedy recovery to health; and be it further Resolved That a copy of this resolution be sent to him.

There being no further business, on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on March 1, 1933 at 2 P. M.
