

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Tuesday, July 19, 1955 at 10:00 A.M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on July 5, 1955, were submitted and corrected and on motion made by Justice Pike and seconded by Justice Leonard, it was RESOLVED that the minutes be adopted as corrected. The Vote---Justices Leonard, Pike, Warner and Yousik, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Supervisor's Report for the month of June 1955 was submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

A communication dated July 11, 1955 was received from the State Traffic Commission and read to the Board regarding a survey they made on traffic conditions at the traffic circle at the intersection of Route 58 and Roanoke Avenue. The State Traffic Commission made various recommendations. The matter was referred to Supervisor Kelly and the Chief of Police Grodski. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication dated July 13, 1955 was read from the New York State Traffic Commission in reply to our letter requesting that they make a survey of the traffic congestion in the business section of Riverhead. The State Traffic Commission advised that they would make such a survey. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A petition signed by 23 residents of Sound Avenue, Riverhead, was read to the Board, as follows: "We, the undersigned, of this petition make, ~~make~~ the request that signs deemed appropriate by County Road Commission be erected along Sound Avenue for the protection of children, pedestrians as well as farm type vehicles. Such signs may be, CHILDREN AT PLAY, SLOW, FARM TRUCKS CROSSING, and other signs which may warn of populated areas or road conditions and speed limits. We would like the speed limit on signs." The matter was referred to

the Highway Committee, Justice Warner and the Superintendent of Highways and the petition was ordered placed on file.

A request was made by Mrs. Homan of Riverside Drive for the replacement of street light, which she claims the L.I. Lighting Co. removed this past week in front of her residence. The matter to be investigated.

On motion made by Justice Pike and seconded by Justice Leonard, it was RESOLVED that Bruno Cybulski, Riverhead, N.Y. be appointed Riverhead Town Dump Custodian five days per week, Monday thru Friday from 3:00 P.M. to 9:00 P.M. at the rate of \$1.50 per hour, commencing on July 11, 1955,

and further RESOLVED, that Paul Kalgren, Riverhead, N.Y. be appointed Riverhead Town Dump Custodian to serve only on Saturdays and Sundays at the rate of \$10.00 per day, commencing on Saturday, July 16, 1955,

The Vote --- Justices Leonard, Pike, Warner and Yousik, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A communication dated July 14, 1955 was read from Asher Holeston, Northville Tpke. Riverhead, N.Y. requesting curbs and gutters on Ostrander Avenue. The Town Clerk was instructed to write to Mr. Holeston notifying him that in the very near future the Town Board was going to adopt a specific plan as regards the installation of curbs, gutters and sidewalks in the Town of Riverhead. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A petition signed by seven residents of South Jamesport was submitted to the Board with respect to the nuisance created by dogs on Main Street and Third Street in South Jamesport. The petition was placed on file and the matter referred to the Dog Warden.

The Town Board convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town Bills to date, the totals of which were as follows: General Town Fund---\$5406.59 and Highway Machinery Fund---\$957.07. On motion and vote it was Resolved that the bills be approved as rendered.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned, to convene on Tuesday, August 2, 1955 at 10:00 A.M.
