

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Tuesday, December 6, 1955 at 10:00 A.M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on November 15, 1955, were submitted and on motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Pike, it was Resolved that the minutes be approved as submitted. The Vote---Justices Leonard, Pike and Warner, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes. Justice Yousik, Absent. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Mr. Edmund Buziak, Riverhead, N.Y. appeared before the Board and again requested permission to exercise the usual powers of a police officer for private persons on private property as he has done heretofore.

Justice Warner made the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Leonard:

RESOLVED that Edmund Buziak be authorized to exercise the usual powers of a police officer for private persons on private property. He may wear a police uniform and badge, but is not a Town employee. The Town shall not be responsible for his actions nor for injuries to him while he is acting. This authorization shall be at the pleasure of the Board, but not beyond December 31, 1956. Acceptance of this authorization shall be on the above conditions. The Vote---Justice Leonard, Pike and Warner, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes; Justice Yousik, Absent. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The following communication was read to the Town Board from the Riverhead Town Planning Board :

"WHEREAS the Town Board referred to this Board the matter of the proposed Mobile Home Court on the property of Rollin Hargis at County Road No. 58 and Harrison Avenue, Riverhead, New York, and submitted the proposed plan to this Board, and

WHEREAS this Board reviewed Ordinance No. 9, defining and providing for the regulations of tourist camps, and asked Mr. Hargis who was present at this meeting to elaborate upon the

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restrictions imposed in the ordinance, and

WHEREAS Mr. Hargis did satisfactorily answer these questions,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this plan be approved subject to modifications as outlined by Mr. Hargis verbally and which he stated he would submit to the Town Board, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead."

The communication was ordered placed on file and on motion made by Justice Pike and seconded by Justice Leonard, it was RESOLVED that Mr. Rollin Hargis be granted a permit for the operation of a Mobile Home Court on his property at County Road No. 58 and Harrison Avenue, in Riverhead, N.Y. in accordance with Ordinance No. 9 of the Town of Riverhead. The vote--- with Justices Leonard, Pike and Warner, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes; Justice Yousik, Absent. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Supervisor's Report for the month of November 1955 was submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

The Police Report for the month of November 1955 was submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

The following communication was read from the Riverhead Town Planning Board:

"WHEREAS the last conference of the Town Board and the Planning Board at the Legion Clubhouse resulted in planning for this community to the mutual benefit of all concerned, and

WHEREAS the Planning Board has certain ideas which they would like to present to the Town Board,

WHEREAS the Planning Board is cognizant of the proposed changes in the ordinances,

BE IT RESOLVED that the Planning Board request the Town Board to hold another conference, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead."

The communication was ordered placed on file and the Town Board agreed to set the exact date of such conference at a later meeting .

Justice Leonard made the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Warner:

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"WHEREAS the street or town highway located at Aquebogue in the Town of Riverhead which commences at the intersection of the southerly line of the Main Road or New York State Highway 25 and the easterly line of land of the Aquebogue School District and runs in a southerly direction to the northerly line of Poor Lane Extension, commonly known as Hubbard Avenue is now known as "Cedar Avenue" and

WHEREAS there are two or more streets or highways in the Town of Riverhead known as Cedar Avenue and

WHEREAS said Cedar Avenue above described adjoins the land of Aquebogue School District on the east for a distance of several hundred feet and

WHEREAS the late Albert L. Edgar served as principal of the Aquebogue School from the time the school building was erected in the year 1928 until the date of his death, namely, July 14, 1955, in an outstanding manner and

WHEREAS Mr. Edgar, over this long period of years, held the respect, love and admiration of all the residents of the community as a great educator, friend and neighbor and

WHEREAS the Trustees of the Aquebogue School District and the Owners' of the Real Property adjacent to the said Cedar Avenue, along with other residents of the Hamlet of Aquebogue, have petitioned the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead to officially change the name of said Cedar Avenue to Edgar Avenue,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

THAT the said CEDAR AVENUE be and it is hereby changed to EDGAR AVENUE. That pursuant to Section 64, Subdivision 9 of the Town Law, the Town Clerk shall within ten days hereafter notify the Board of Assessors, the Town Planning Board of Riverhead Town, the County Clerk, the County Engineer of Suffolk County and the Post Office Department of the United States of America at Riverhead, New York."

The Vote---Justices Leonard, Pike and Warner, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes; Justice Yousik, Absent. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A Public Notice No. 3412 was read to the Town Board from the Corps of Engineers, U. S. Army advising that application has been made by Mr. Harold W. Hutchinson, Aquebogue, N.Y. for a Dept. of Army permit to construct two jetties and install two pile clusters in the Great Peconic Bay at Aquebogue, Suffolk County, N.Y. As there were no objections, the communication was ordered placed on file.

Public Notice #3413 was read to the Town Board from the Corps of Engineers, U. S. Army, advising that application has been made by Mr. George H. Hawkes, Bayside Avenue, South Jamesport, N.Y. for a Department of Army permit to construct a jetty and install a pile cluster, in Great Peconic Bay at South Jamesport, Suffolk County, N.Y. As there were no objections, the communication was ordered placed on file.

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Oliver W. Hubbard, Town Attorney, advised the Board that the next hearing in the matter of the application of the Northville Dock Corporation for a grant of easement in Long Island Sound in the Town of Riverhead, will be held in New York City, 80 Centre Street, at the Commissioners of the Land Office, on December 20, 1955 at 10:00 A.M. and urged the Town Board to authorize him to contact Mr. Ralph Fox of Port Jefferson, N.Y., a Marine Contractor, to act as a witness to represent the Town of Riverhead at this hearing. The Board advised the Town Attorney to contact Mr. Fox as regards the fee he would charge to represent the Town in this matter.

The bids were referred to Engineer Alden W. Young, and Myron C. Young, Superintendent of Highways.

On motion made by Justice Leonard and seconded by Justice Pike it was RESOLVED that the Town of Riverhead purchase one truck for use of the Riverhead Town Highway Department from Mauer Motor Sales Corporation, Riverhead, N.Y. 1956 Model 452-V GMC chassis and dump equipment for the sum of \$4,787.56, as per bid dated December 2, 1955. The Vote---Justices Leonard, Pike and Warner, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes; Justice Yousik, Absent. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Leonard, it was RESOLVED that the Chief of Police be authorized to solicit sealed bids for a 1956 Police Car for the Riverhead Town Police. The Vote---Justices Leonard, Pike and Warner, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes; Justice Yousik, Absent. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Leonard and seconded by Justice Pike it was RESOLVED that the Town Clerk write to the New York State Traffic Commission and request that a survey be made on Route 25 and Wading River Manor Road, Calverton, in the Town of Riverhead, for the purpose of installing a traffic signal light. The Vote---Justices Leonard, Pike and Warner, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes; Justice Yousik, Absent. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Pike and seconded by Justice Leonard it was RESOLVED that three members of the Riverhead Police be authorized to attend a one-day conference, on December 7, 1955, of the Federal Bureau of Investigation at Bear Mountain, New York, and that all necessary expenses be paid. The Vote---Justices Leonard, Pike and Warner, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes; Justice Yousik, Absent. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Leonard and seconded by Justice Pike it was RESOLVED that Mrs. Sophie Waski, Sweezy Avenue, Riverhead, N.Y. be and she hereby is appointed <sup>part-time</sup> clerk in the Office of the Assessors to assist in the extension of taxes, retroactive to November 25, 1955 until such times as her services are terminated, to be compensated at the rate of \$8.00 per day. The Vote---Justices Leonard, Pike and Warner, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes; Justice Yousik, Absent. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice

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Leonard, it was RESOLVED that Mrs. Alice Carey, Riverhead, N.Y. and Mrs. Lillian Mazgulski, Riverhead, N.Y. be appointed part-time clerks in the Office of the Receiver of Taxes, to serve under the supervision of the Receiver of Taxes, salaries fixed at the rate of \$8.00 per day. The Vote---Justices Leonard, Pike and Warner, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes; Justice Yousik, Absent. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Leonard made the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Warner:

RESOLVED that the Supervisor, Justices of the Peace, Councilmen, Town Attorney, Superintendent of Highways, Town Clerk, Tax Receiver, Clerk to the Assessors and members of the Town Planning Board, be authorized to attend the Annual Convention of the Association of Towns of the State of New York, to be held at the Hotel Statler, Buffalo, New York, February 7th-8th-9th, 1956, and that all necessary expenses be paid. The Vote---Justices Leonard and Warner, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes; Justice Pike, No; Justice Yousik, Absent. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Mr. John Zaleski, Coordinator of Civil Defense Rescue Squad, appeared before the Board and gave a summary relative to the organization and training of the Rescue Team and the Rescue Truck for this Team, which the Town Board has agreed to acquire.

On motion made by Justice Leonard and seconded by Justice Pike, it was RESOLVED, by the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead that Anthony F. RESOLVED, that the Clerk of This Board be, and hereby is, directed to furnish a certified copy of this Resolution to Anthony F. Gadzinski Town Clerk, Town of Riverhead to be forwarded to the Commissioner of Education. The Vote--Justices Leonard, Pike and Warner, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes; Justice Yousik, Absent. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town bills to date, the totals of which were as follows: General Town Fund--\$7,103.03 and Highway Machinery--\$2,025.73. On motion and vote it was Resolved that the bills be approved as rendered.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Tuesday, December 20, 1955 at 10 A.M.
