Supervisor Janoski: "Under unfinished business we have a special permit application of River Center Associates for a family recreation center which is still pending the action of the Town Board.

The special permit application of Halandia Associates for multiple housing which is pending Town Board action.

The special permit application of Barney's Trailer Service extended use which is also pending Town Board action.

We have five minutes. Would anyone care to be recognized? Mr. Nohejl?"

Bill Nohejl, Wading River; "In regard to any information from the Wading River Fire Department."

Supervisor Janoski: "None. Well they have sent us a letter indicating that the present Board of Commissioners does not wish to make a decision and they have handed it over to the incoming Commissioners to make the decision."

Bill Nohejl: "Any idea as to when?"

Supervisor Janoski: "I would hope as soon as possible. They have not indicated . . ."

Bill Nohejl: "I have given it quite a bit of thought that we own the old school house in Claverton, right? The Town doesn't know who owns it."

Supervisor Janoski: "A private individual."

Bill Nohejl: "Oh, I thought the Town owned it. What happened to — I'm getting off. We often hear earmarks \$40,000 for Wading River Community Center."

Supervisor Janoski: "We have earmarked \$40,000 for a Community Center in Wading River."

Bill Nohejl: "Is that money in the Town's hands or just . . ."

Supervisor Janoski: "It is now. It is part of the final year of the block grant which we received."

Bill Nohejl: "We do have it. The Town has received money from this Halandia deal up right on Doctors Path. Am I right?"

Supervisor Janoski: "The Town has received. . ."

Bill Nohejl: "\$20,000, didn't you sign an agreement for the property . . ."

Supervisor Janoski: "We haven't closed that deal yet."

Bill Nohejl: "How about over here, Raspberry Hilton?"

Supervisor Janoski: "That is under consideration for sale at this time."

Bill Nohejl: "What I'm getting at, if we have \$40,000 and quite a bit of this money has been going out, but not coming back to the Town in these sales like Doctors Path, the Raspberry Hilton, I'm wondering if at that time when these monies do come back here that could be sort of appropriated toward the Community Center and maybe we would have two-thirds or three-quarters of the way to our goal. Because of it's use for other purposes, I feel as though I'm going to ask Wading River for it, to be used in Wading River."

Supervisor Janoaki: "Certainly it's worthy of consideration if that's what you're asking."

Bill Nohejl: "What I'm getting at, you know what I'm getting at. If we spend seventy-five and we get twenty-five back,

there's fifty gone otherwise. So why can't some of that be going into a worthwhile project otherwise?"

Supervisor Janoski: "We will certainly consider your suggestion."

Bill Nohejl: "I've been disturbed from what I read in the paper about the overrun on Doctors Path sum_p, \$100,000."

Supervisor Janoski: "Bill I have to tell you that no one on this Town Board is going to discuss that matter."

Bill Nohejl: "Is it a matter for the Town?"

Supervisor Janoski: "It's a matter of litigation. And, therefore, we are not going to discuss it."

Bill Nohejl: "Well I would, if you're not going to discuss it, I — what I was going to ask, who draws up the contract to bid, H2M?"

Supervisor Janoski: "Yes."

Bill Nohejl: "Someone must have had to give the okay to do these overruns."

Supervisor Janoski: "Bill you have a misconception of what the case is and I cannot discuss it with you because it's possible litigation. You have to respect my position on that."

Bill Nohejl: "See what I'm getting at there when I heard about Doctors Path, we've had similar situations. It seems to happen quite often in this Town. We've had the side-walk project down in Main Street and the Ostrander Avenue Sewer — everything seems to end up in litigation. Your bid accepted and things never seem to work out right. I'm concerned why. Because we have to spend money to litigate this and finally make a settlement above what is over original bid price."

Supervisor Janoski: "I will say this. That cost over-

run is a misnumber in this case. And that's about all I'm going to say."

Bill Nohejl: "I can't get any place then. Thank you."


