SEALED PROPOSALS will be received by the undersigned for furnishing lights for the First Lighting District of the Town of Riverhead until the 31st. day of October 1893 for a term of three years. Said proposals must state the system, power and number of lights, the same to be lighted all night twenty-seven nights per month at a cost not to exceed \$1000. per annum. The Board of Town Officers of the Town of Riverhead reserves the right to reject all bids. Description of said district can be obtained at the Town Clerk's Office on application.
