

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, March 4, 1942 at 2:00 P. M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on February 17, 1942 at 9:00 A. M. were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

Mr. Raymond H. Vail addressed the Board offering to the Town of Riverhead a piece of property in the rear of his home as an addition to the present proposed parking field. He stated that if his property was accepted it would be a very desirable addition to the present proposed site. Mr. Vail stated that no reasonable offer in regard to the amount of the rent would be refused by him.

The Board informed Mr. Vail of the proposition to be voted upon at a Special Election to be held on March 6th, and that nothing could be done before that time. However, if the proposition was carried, his offer would be carefully considered.

Colonel Walter F. Barnes, Town Historian submitted his report for the year 1941.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Smith, it was RESOLVED that this Board express their appreciation and thanks to Colonel Walter F. Barnes, Town Historian for his excellent report of the Town of Riverhead for the year 1941, and further

RESOLVED that the report be filed in the Office of the Town Clerk. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

A petition signed by several taxpayers requesting street lights on Parkway Street between Raynor Avenue and Marcy Avenue was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was referred to the Lighting Committee.

A communication was read from George R. Wells making application for the position of Life Guard during the summer months. The communication was ordered placed on file.

Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes submitted a report of the amount of Taxes collected as of March 2, 1942 and on motion and vote was ordered placed on file.

A report of the Police of the Town of Riverhead/<sup>for the month of</sup> was submitted <sup>February, 1942</sup> to the Board and ordered placed on file.


A communication was read from the State Insurance Fund in regard to Workmen's Compensation for emergency policemen. The communication was ordered placed on file.

Supervisor Kelly advised the Board that if it meets with the Board's approval, he is calling a Civil Defense Rally to be held on Tuesday evening, March 24, 1942 at the Roanoke Avenue School for the purpose of acquainting everyone with Civil Defense. He stated that it is his plan to request at least one representative from each family attend the meeting. There will be one speaker from each of the five different departments of Civil Defense to explain their various functions.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Boutcher, it was RESOLVED that this Board approve the plan for a Civil Defense Rally to be held in the Roanoke School on Tuesday evening, March 24, 1942 for the purpose of acquainting the people of the Town of Riverhead with the functions of Civil Defense. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined the Town bills to date.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, March 18, 1942 at 2:00 P. M.
