

Minutes of the meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on February 1, 1928 at 2 P. M.

Charles O. Downs, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

The minutes of the meeting of the Town Board, held on January 19, 1928 and on motion and vote adopted.

The legal opinion of R. Condon Smith, in regard to the method of establishing a Garbage District was read, and ordered placed on file, for future reference.

An application by the North Fork Water Company, Incorporated, for a water franchise within the Town of Riverhead, was presented.

It was suggested that the Supervisor appoint a committee of two to act in conjunction with the Supervisor to investigate the matter of the application of the North Fork Water Company, Incorporated, for a franchise within the Town of Riverhead, outside of the present water district, and the Supervisor appointed Justice Conklin and Justice Burnside to serve with him on such a committee.

Cecil B. Tooker, representing Raymond H. Nugent, addressed the Board and requested that the Town take steps to clear up the land west of Riverhead, formerly used as a Town Dump.

Supervisor Homan referred this matter to a committee consisting of Supt. of Highways Charles O. Downs and Town Clerk Burns, to investigate and to ascertain if some suitable place may be found for the disposal of garbage and rubbish and report back to the Board.

Charles O. Downs, Supt. of Highways suggested that steps be taken to prohibit the dumping of rubbish in the Town Loam Pit near Riverside Drive and this matter was also referred to the Committee appointed to find a suitable place for the

dumping of garbage and rubbish.

R. Condon Smith, representing Riverhead Post, American Legion, presented petitions signed by over six hundred residents of the Village of Riverhead, requesting the Town Board to co-operate with the Post Office Department by taking such steps and doing such things as will establish city delivery, parcel post service and mail box collection service in the Village of Riverhead.

It was decided that the Matter of taking steps to have city delivery service established in the Village of Riverhead, be held over until the next meeting of the Town Board and in the meanwhile the American Legion was requested to make a survey of the street signs in the Village.

A written permit having been received from the State Department, Division of State Highways, for the erection of traffic signals on the State Highway, the Town Clerk was instructed to advise the Horni Signal Manufacturing Corporation to proceed with the installation of the traffic lights at the abuttment of Roanoke Avenue and Main Street.

On motion and vote, it was Resolved that a condensed report of the expenditures of the Town, beginning with the year 1927 be published in both of the local papers.

On motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on February 16, 1928 at 2 P. M.
