

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, organized as a Board of Canvasses and held on November 7, 1935 at which date the canvass was completed and signed.

This Board having canvassed and estimated the vote given in the several Election Districts of said Town, at the Town Election held at the time of the General Election on November 5, 1935, do hereby certify, determine and declare that:

Milton L. Burns, by the greatest number of votes was duly elected Supervisor in and for said Town.

Harry J. Kratoville, by the greatest number of votes was duly elected Town Clerk in and for said Town.

Forrest G. Downs, by the greatest number of votes was duly elected Receiver of Taxes in and for said Town.

William H. Clark, by the greatest number of votes was duly elected Superintendent of Highways in and for said Town.

Austin H. Warner and Fred H. Butcher, by the greatest number of votes were severally duly elected Justices of the Peace for the four year term in and for the said Town.

Joseph V. Kelly, by the greatest number of votes was duly elected Justice of the Peace for the two year term in and for said Town.

Thomas Danowski, by the greatest number of votes was duly elected Assessor for the four year term in and for said Town.

Israel D. Luce, by the greatest number of votes was duly elected Assessor for the two year term in and for the said Town.

Howard V. Lane, by the greatest number of votes was duly elected School Director in and for said Town.

This Board having canvassed and estimated the votes relative to the following Town Propositions, given in the several election districts in the said Town at a Town Election, held at the time of the General Election on Tuesday November 5, 1935.

Town Proposition No. 1

Shall the Town of Riverhead establish and maintain a public park on lands belonging to the Town of Riverhead known as the "Howell


M. Reeve Park^m and expend in such establishment not more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

Town Proposition No. 2.

Shall the Town of Riverhead expend for the purpose of gardening and attending grounds of Suffolk County Historical Society in 1936 the sum of \$150.00, and in 1937 the sum of \$150.00

Do hereby certify, determine and declare that the total number of votes cast:- Town Proposition No. 1 was, Twelve Hundred Three votes, - there were Eight Hundred Seventy Six votes for the proposition and Three Hundred Twenty Seven against the proposition.

Do hereby certify, determine and declare that the total number of votes cast:- Town Proposition No. 2 was, Twelve hundred Eight votes, - there were Eight Hundred Thirty Six votes for the proposition and Three Hundred Seventy Two votes against the proposition.
