On motion the following resolution was adopted:

We, the undersigned, constituting the Town Board of the town of Riverhead, in the County of Suffolk, N. Y. do hereby consent that the Commissioner of Highways in said town make an order laying out the alteration to Peconic Bay Boulevard described in the application of Milner Wells and discontinuing a portion of said road as described in said application, pursuant to Sec. 80 of the Highway Law of the State of New York.

On motion the Highway Commissioner was instructed to confer with W. H. Sweezy in regard to the straightening of Sweezy Avenue in the Town of Riverhead.

The following estimate was made as to the amount of money to be raised by tax for highway purposes for the year 1909:

For the repair and improvement of town highways, including sluices, culverts and bridges having a span of less than five feet, \$10000.00

For the repair and construction of the bridge on the Wading River--Manor Road crossing the stream known as Peconic River and located on or near the property of A. M. Robinson, 300.00

For the purchase and repair of machinery, tools, and implements, 150.00

For the removal of obstructions caused by snow, 500.00

For allowance for shade trees, 50.00

For allowance for watering troughs, 10.00

For storage of machinery, and tools, 25.00

On motion the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved that the estimate made by the Highway Commissioner and approved by the Town Board of \$10000.00 be the amount of the First Item in said estimate.

Resolved, that the estimate made by the Highway Commissioner and approved by the Town Board of \$1035.00 be the amount of Items Two, Three and Four in said estimate.

There being no further business meeting adjourned.
