

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, January 19, 1949 at 2:00 P.M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on January 5, 1949 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication was read from Mrs Kathryn M. McCollom asking the Board to consider an increase in the rental of her property on Griffing Avenue, now used as a town parking field, from \$60.00 per month to \$75.00 per month, due to the fact that she has enlarged the corridor in the rear of the property at considerable expense. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from the Corps of Engineers, U.S. Army, Office of the District Engineer, New York District, 120 Wall Street, New York, N.Y. advising the Board that an application has been made by the Harbor Sound Realty and Development Corporation, 136 East 57th Street, New York, N.Y. successor to the Friars Head Land Corporation, for a further extension of time in which to maintain the structure authorized by Department of the Army permit issued by the Division Engineer, North Atlantic Division, on May 3, 1940. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from New York State Public Service Commission advising the Board that a public hearing will be held in the office of the Commission, 233 Broadway, New York, N.Y. on Tuesday, January 25, 1949 at 10:30 A.M. upon the petition of Grant Seaman, doing business as the Sunrise Transportation Company, for a certificate of public convenience and necessity for the temporary operation of an omnibus line between Riverhead and Patchogue, N.Y. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from Gerard P. Hajek, Adjutant of Van Rennselaer Skidmore Post No. 2476, Veterans of Foreign Wars requesting permission of the Board to use the ground in the rear of the Town Highway barn for a carnival during the week beginning July 25th, 1949. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from Clair Vail, Bazaar Chairman of the Riverhead Firemen's Association requesting permission of the Board to use the grounds in the rear of the town highway barn for a Bazaar on the nights of June 29, 30, July 1, 2, and 4th, 1949. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Zaleski it was Resolved that the request of Van Rennselaer Post No. 2476 for permission to use the ground in the rear of the highway barn during the week beginning July 25, 1949 for a carnival be granted and further Resolved that the request of the Riverhead Firemen's Association to hold a Bazaar on the same grounds on the nights of June 29, 30, July 1, 2 and 4, 1949 be granted, provided that the grounds be left as clean as when entered upon and the necessary liability insurance be posted, the space to be used is to be designated by the Supt. of Highways. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

On motion made by Justice Zaleski and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved that the sum of \$40.00 be expended for advertising in the Booklet of the Riverhead Firemen's Association to be issued in conjunction with the ^{annual} Bazaar. The Vote Justices Warner, Yousik, and Zaleski Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. Total Vote Yes 4, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Zaleski it was Resolved that the Supervisor and the Town Attorney be authorized to go to Albany, New York on a matter pertaining to the Town of Riverhead and that all necessary expenses be paid. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik and Zaleski Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. Total Vote Yes 4, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A communication was read from Charles F. Hallett, Secretary Pro Tem in regard to the program to provide our community with a volunteer list of blood donors, properly classified and typed and that there will be a general meeting of representatives of all local clubs and organizations to be held at the Town Hall, Riverhead, N.Y., on Wednesday, January 26, 1949 at 8:00 P.M. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Zaleski it was Resolved that the following Bonds be approved as to form manner of execution and the sufficiency of the surety:
Bond No. 1140860 of the National Surety Corporation bonding William J. Leonard, Justice of the Peace in the amount of \$1000.00.
Bond No. 357681 of the Glens Falls Indemnity Company bonding Henry M. Zaleski, Justice of the Peace in the amount of \$1000.00.
Bond No. S-228300 of the Century Indemnity Company bonding Frank J. Yousik, Justice of the Peace in the amount of \$1000.00.
The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that the salaries of School Traffic Officers of the Town of Riverhead be increased from \$1.00 per hour to \$1.10 per hour retro-active as of January 1, 1949. The Vote Justices Warner, Yousik and Zaleski Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. Total Vote Yes 4, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes submitted his report as of January 16, 1949 and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file. The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all bills to date.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Friday, February 4, 1949 at 3:00 P.M.
