

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Wednesday, March 14, 1928 at 3 P. M.

Charles O. Downs, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

The minutes of the meeting of the Town Board, held February 29th., 1928 were read and on motion and vote adopted.

A petition was presented, signed by property owners within the Lighting District of Riverhead, requesting that street lights be placed on Ostrander Avenue Extension, on Newton Avenue and the highway connecting Fishel Avenue and Union Avenue and was referred to the Lighting Committee for investigation.

Supervisor Homan advised the Board that he had received a communication from Irad B. DeFriest relative to using his garage for a Polling Place in the Sixth District

Robert S. Guy addressed the Board and requested information as to the method of establishing a sidewalk district on Newton Avenue, Riverhead.

Mrs. Ann Hill addressed the Board and offered the Town the use of some of her property about a mile west of the Village of Riverhead, for a Town dump, providing the Town keep the papers burned and the dump looked after properly.

Supervisor Homan appointed Justice Burnside and Justice Conklin, a committee to look into the advisability of accepting the use of land offered by Mrs. Hill for a Town Dump.

Russel E. Griffen, Sales Manager of the Automatic Registering Machine Company, Inc., addressed the Board relative to the needs of the Town for voting machines in the coming election.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED, That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk of the Town of Riverhead, County of Suffolk, New York, or either of them

be and they hereby are authorized,empowered and directed to enter into a contract with the Automatic Registering Machine Co., Inc., for the purchase of two (2) U. S. Standard Voting Machines of the 9 row,30 candidate size,at the net price of Nine Hundred Forty Dollars (\$940.00) each, f.o.b. cars, Jamestown, N.Y.,and be it further

RESOLVED, That,in payment for said voting machines, the Supervisor is hereby authorized,empowered, and directed, upon receipt of said machines, to pay to the Automatic Registering Machine Co., Inc.,the sum of Eighteen Hundred Eighty and no/100 Dollars (\$1880.00).

The Determination and Agreement for the Expenditure of Highway moneys as presented by Superintendent of Highways Charles O. Downs was presented and duly approved.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, March 28,1928 at 2 P. M.
