

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Wednesday, June 28, 1933 at 2 P.M.

Raymond S. Welch, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

The minutes of the Town Board meeting held June 14th. 1933 were read and on motion and vote duly adopted.

A communication from the Department of Health, State of New York was read, enclosing statement outlining some of the points of the public works section of the National Recovery Act, and advising that the State Department of Health has recommended the installation of a sewer system and sewage treatment works in order to correct the existing unsanitary conditions resulting from inadequate sewage disposal facilities in the Village of Riverhead and prevent serious pollution of Peconic River and urging that consideration be given this matter.

On motion duly made by Justice Frederick, seconded by Justice Stackpole, it was Resolved That the Supervisor appoint a committee to look into the matter of a sewer system and sewage disposal plant in the Village of Riverhead under the provisions of the National Industrial Recovery Act, and be it further Resolved That said committee be and the same is hereby authorized and empowered to engage counsel and an engineer in connection with this matter if necessary.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly carried.

A communication was read from Joseph E. Walsh, of the Prize Committee of the North Fork Volunteer Firemen's Association requesting that the Board donate a cup for the Tournament which is to be held at the Fair Grounds on July 22, 1933.

It was decided that Justice Rubenstein obtain a suitable cup for the tournament and that the individual members of the Town Board would pay for same.

A communication was read from I. S. Stivers, Secretary of the Riverhead Yacht Club, calling the attention of the Board to the continual violation of the Town Dock rules in the Village of Riverhead and asking that the regulations be posted at the dock and that same be enforced.

The communication relative to the violation of the Town Dock regulations was referred to the Highway Committee for investigation with power to act.

A communication was read from William B. Trainer, Town Clerk of the Town of Huntington, N.Y., setting forth a copy of a resolution adopted by the Town Board of Huntington, N.Y. relative to the charges made for public utility services in Suffolk County.

On motion duly made by Justice Stackpole, Seconded by Justice Frederick and duly carried it was Resolved That this Board condemn the action of the Long Island Lighting Company for the service charge of \$1.00 per month for home owners and business property and recommends to the Public Service Commission the establishment of reasonable meter security charges and be it further Resolved That the Public Service Commission have a reduction made in the rates of the Long Island Lighting Company commensurate with present costs and be it further Resolved That this Board will co-operate with the Board of Supervisors and other Town Boards in Suffolk County in any action taken for the reduction of rates of public utility services in Suffolk County.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein, seconded by Town Clerk Burns and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow upon certificate of indebtedness the sum of Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars to pay on account of audited bills of June 27, 1933.

Mr. Danielson, Harry J. Newton, Eugene E. Ruland and Asher Holeston, addressed the Board relative to the

lack of proper drainage facilities of Merritts Pond, advising that under present conditions, damage would result to the property adjacent thereto.

On motion by Justice Burnside, seconded by Justice Stackpole and duly carried it was Resolved That the matter of the drainage of Merritts Pond be and the same hereby is referred to the Highway Committee and the Superintendent of Highways with power to act in the matter and be it further Resolved That said Committee be and the same hereby is authorized and empowered to employ counsel and an engineer if found necessary.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein, seconded by Justice Stackpole and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor appoint a committee to wait on the Trustees of Roanoke Lodge I.O.O.F., relative to the wash rooms on the first floor of the hall and also relative to the lights and telephone in the building.

Supervisor Homan appointed Justice Rubenstein and Justice Frederick to serve on such a committee.

The committee reporting on the proposal to divide the Sixth Election District, reporting in favor of dividing said district, it was decided to form the ninth Election district from that portion of the Sixth Election District which lies north of the Railroad track.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein, seconded by Town Clerk Burns and duly carried it was Resolved That the Sixth Election District be and the same hereby is divided into two Election Districts known as the Sixth and the Ninth Election Districts of the Town of Riverhead described as follows:

Election District No. 6.

Beginning at the intersection of the center line of East Avenue with the center line of the Long Island Railroad and running easterly along the center line of the Long Island Railroad to the center line of Trout Brook, thence southeasterly by and with the center line of Trout Brook and Terry's Creek to Great Peconic Bay, thence westerly along Great Peconic Bay and Peconic River to a point which is in line with the easterly line of Fisher's Property, thence northerly along the easterly line of Fisher's property to the center line of Main Street, thence easterly along the center line of Main Street to the center line of East Avenue, thence northerly along the center line of East Avenue to the point or place of beginning.

Election District No. 9.

Beginning at the intersection of the center line of Union Avenue, with the center line of the Long Island Railroad and running northerly along the center line of Union Avenue to the center line of Northville Turnpike, thence northeasterly along the center line of Northville Turnpike to the center line of Saw Mill Brook, thence southeasterly by and with the center line of Saw Mill Brook to the center line of Main Street or the South Country Road, thence northeasterly along the center line of Main Street or the South Country Road to the center line of Hubbard Avenue, thence easterly along the center line of Hubbard Avenue to the center line of Trout Brook, thence southerly by and with the center line of Trout Brook to the center line of the Long Island Railroad thence westerly along the center line of the Long Island Railroad to the point or place of beginning.

There being no further business, on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, July 12, 1933 at 2 P.M.
