

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall March 13, 1934 at 10 A. M.

Town Attorney Reginald G. Smith was also present.

Minutes of a meeting held February 27th, 1934 were read and on motion and vote duly adopted.

Communication was read from Department of Taxation and Finance urging that tax maps be prepared as C. W. A. Projects, and ordered placed on file.

Communication was read from the Town of Southampton setting a date for a joint meeting on March 19th at 7 P. M. to discuss water rates, contracts, etc., in connection with the Riverside Water District.

On motion duly made by Justice Stackpole, and seconded by Justice Burnside, it was Resolved, by unanimous consent, that the Committee formerly appointed to take up the matter of the rates for the Water District consisting of Justices Rubenstein and Luce, and Town Attorney Smith, be continued and are hereby authorized to enter negotiations with the Town of Southampton, at a meeting on the 19th of March at 7 P. M.

Communication was read from Richard Schermerhorn, Jr., City Planner-Landscape Architect in regard to gathering data and furnishing material as a basis for a Zoning plan, and was ordered placed on file.

Town Welfare Officer Burr advised the Board that the matter of exchanging office space with the Highway Department has not as yet taken place due to the fact that proper alterations have not been made.

The matter was referred to Justice Luce and Justice Rubenstein as a Committee, and they are also to investigate the number of telephones necessary in the Town Offices.

Justice Luce reported on the proposed road from Roanoke Avenue westerly to the land owned by the Suffolk County Agricultural Society.

Minutes of a special meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on March 16th 1934 at 9:00 A. M., pursuant to Resolution made at Town Board meeting of March 13, 1934.

William H. Clark, Superintendent of Highways was present.

Justice Rubenstein offered the following resolution, which was seconded by Justice Luce.

WHEREAS: The Town Board has determined that the amount levied and collected for the expenditure actually necessary for the removal of obstructions caused by snow are insufficient to pay expenses necessarily incurred, now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to borrow on Certificates of Indebtedness, the sum of Forty-six hundred (\$4600.00) dollars, to be used for the removal of snow. The vote, Justices Burnside, Luce and Rubenstein, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total votes, Yes 4, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly carried.

Communication was read from Alan G. Straight, Principal Operative, Treasury Department, Division of Secret Service, New York District, expressing his appreciation on behalf of the United States Secret Service to the Riverhead Police Department for the very excellent co-operation which was rendered by them and which resulted so successfully in the arrest of Frank Volkman and Michael Gallo in Riverhead. The letter was ordered placed on file.

On motion of Justice Rubenstein which was seconded by Justice Burnside, it was Resolved, by unanimous consent, that the Town Clerk send a letter to the Riverhead Police Department, commending them and thanking the Department for the very efficient service they have rendered the Town, in the above matter.

The Town Clerk was also requested to send a copy of the letter from Mr. Straight to the Police Department.

There being no further business on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned.

The Committee already appointed on this matter was authorized to continue until Superintendent of Highways Clark could give an estimate of the cost of making the road.

The Board discussed the matter of the protection of our baymen from intrusion of people living outside the Town of Riverhead and taking shell fish from our waters. No action was taken at this time.

Justice Luce advised the Board that the Water Plant building was in need of painting.

Supervisor Burns, appointed a Committee of Justices Luce and Burnside to look into the above matter.

The matter of the depletion of snow funds was brought to the attention of the Board.

On motion duly made by Justice Luce and seconded by Justice Rubenstein, it was RESOLVED by unanimous consent, that the Town Board meet on Friday, March 16, 1934 at 9:00 A. M. to borrow necessary funds to meet the March 15th payrolls for snow removal.

The matter of the drainage privileges thru the premises of Mrs. Elizabeth C. Morell was brought to the attention of the Board, and was referred to a Committee of Justices Burnside and Luce.

There being no further business on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned until March 27th, 1934 at 10 A. M.
