An invitation to the Town Board to attend the Annual Inspection and Memorial Services on 5/3/92

Supervisor Janoski: "Before taking up the resolutions, I will recognize anyone who wishes to be heard on any subject. Steve..."

Steve Haizlip: "Steve Haizlip from Calverton. My subject is, I want to inquire from the Highway Committee here about Francis Blvd. It goes into the UPS. That road is in sad shape and maybe the building down there is private property, but yet it's serving the public, just like Harrow's, when we kept yelling about that one and John Lombardi was here. He was the Highway Committeeman at the time and he did some pushing with those and we got some repairs."

Councilman Prusinowski: "Steve, I'll check, but I don't think that's a Town road, but I'll check."

Steve Haizlip: "But, regardless if it's a Town road or not, that man has got the public coming in there and big holes and you're dropping in there and beating up frames and shock absorbers and so forth, so what can we, you know, the guy should provide a decent road because the public is being served and UPS is paying big rent and so is Grumman for their warehouse and so forth. You know, just because it's crowded and then it serves the public, you just don't let it fall apart. That was what Timber Park was until they pushed and got something done on it."

Supervisor Janoski: "Steve, Timber Park was repaired by the Town using federal funds. It wasn't that we forced the owners there to repair these roads. We did approve a site plan for that building a couple of years ago and I'll check to see what the requirements were for that site plan, but I'm not aware that that's a public access building, that they provide service to the public there. As far as I know, it's only employees, that UPS facility..."

Councilman Prusinowski: "That's public."

Steve Haizlip: "That's public."

Supervisor Janoski: "Is it?"

Steve Haizlip: "Oh there's people that comes all the way from over by Moriches and everywhere to come into there, to be served."

Supervisor Janoski: "Well, I'll check on it to see what the site plan, I know that we had them plant a couple trees out front, and what else was required, I don't remember."

Steve Haizlip: "Well, I don't know how they got the sign, Francis Blvd. It's posted big as anything giving you a hint."

Councilman Prusinowski: "Probably somebody in the family who owned the property and they named it, so... "

Steve Haizlip: "Alright."

Supervisor Janoski: "There's one in Wading River called Frost St. I think, which, I don't know if you're familiar with it, it goes down to the old railroad station up near 25A."

Steve Haizlip: "I don't get over there much."

Supervisor Janoski: "It's not a street really."

Steve Haizlip: "Okay. You know, I want to make a comparison of justice in this country. It's compared to who you are and what type of law echelon you are and higher echelon. You know, I'm reading in NEWSDAY now, about a Grumman V.P., this is public information. I'm not revealing anything that isn't already out. Grumman V.P. Frank Macina, taking the thousand dollars a week kickback, so he gets indicted. Now in the investigation, they find out that another guy, Bill Copola. He admitted guilt of taking \$75,000 kickback, so when he goes to the first trial, the judge says, you do \$500 dollars and you get a \$50 dollar fine, or a \$50,000 dollar fine, I beg your pardon. Now, here's the kicker. The man puts \$25,000 in his pocket and walks away and Leona, she goes to jail. Thank you."

Supervisor Janoski: "You're welcome. Is there anyone else who wishes to address the Town Board? Henry... "

Henry Pfeifer: "Henry Pfeifer, Wading River. Some little while ago I called your attention to the possibility of restocking Peconic River with an adrogenous type fish. Those are the kind of fish that spend their childhood in fresh water, their teenage in saltwater and come back for their love life back at their point of origin, such as trout..."

Supervisor Janoski: "And salmon."

Henry Pfeifer: "And salmon and so forth and I indicated that the DEC was presently around, this time of year, stocking other ponds, other rivers, other streams on eastern LI and I wondered if you found that it was feasible to pursue this further?"

Supervisor Janoski: "Not yet."

Henry Pfeifer: "Thank you."

Supervisor Janoski: "You're welcome. Is there anyone else wishing to address the Board? Let us take up the resolutions."

Resolution #257

Councilman Creighton: "This authorizes the Supervisor to establish a budget adoption, so moved."

Councilwoman Gilliam: "Seconded."

Supervisor Janoski: "Moved and seconded."

Councilwoman Gilliam: "No, for my reasons previously stated with regard to the bond issue."

Councilman Creighton: "I should say that this is for the day care center which will be built at Stotzky Park. What this does is authorize a budget adoption to spend the money to get going on it. I vote yes."

The Vote: Prusinowski, yes; Janoski, yes. 3 Yes, 1 No, 1 Absent.

Resolution #258

Councilwoman Gilliam: "Awards bid for construction of day care center at Stotzky Park, Town of Riverhead, so moved."

Councilman Creighton: "Seconded."


Supervisor Janoski: "Moved and seconded."
