

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, September 23, 1942 at 2:00 P. M.

Seth A. Hubbard, Town Attorney and Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on September 2, 1942 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication was read from Col. Walter F. Barnes, President of the Suffolk County Historical Society, asking the Board to increase their appropriation in the budget from \$150.00 to \$300.00 for the year 1943. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from Mr. Nugent M. George in regard to the right-of-way to the Sewage Disposal Plant from Riverside Drive, which adjoins his property. The communication was referred to the Town Attorney.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Smith, it was RESOLVED that there shall be submitted to the qualified electorate for vote thereon at a Special Election to be held co-incidental with the General Election to be held on November 3, 1942 between the hours of 6 A. M. and 7 P. M. at the various polling places fixed by law for the said General Election the following proposition:

PROPOSITION No. 1

Shall the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead be authorized and empowered to expend a sum not exceeding Twenty-Five Thousand (\$25,000.00) Dollars for the dredging and improvement of Meeting House Creek at Aquebogue, in the Town of Riverhead, New York. The vote, Justices Smith, Muskowski, Warner, and Butcher, Yes, Supervisor Kelly, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Muskowski and seconded by Justice Warner, it was RESOLVED that the preliminary estimates for the year, 1943, pursuant to Section 111 of the Town Law be placed on file as follows:

WHEREAS, he has recently been accepted for service in the United States Army, now therefore, be it


