

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, on Wednesday, August 30, 1933 at 2 P.M.

Town Superintendent of Highways Raymond S. Welch was present.

The minutes of the Town Board Meeting of August 16th. 1933 were read and on motion duly made, seconded and carried were duly adopted.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein, seconded by Justice Frederick and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow upon certificate of indebtedness, the sum of Four Thousand Dollars, to pay on account of Audited Bills of August 29, 1933.

A communication addressed to the Town Clerk from the Department of Elections of Suffolk County, requesting a list of the Polling Places designated for the 1933 Election and a list of Town Officers to be elected at the General Election, was read.

On motion duly made by Justice Frederick, seconded by Justice Rubenstein and duly carried it was Resolved That the following places be and they hereby are designated as Polling Places for the Election Districts designated in the Town of Riverhead, for the ensuing year.

- Election District No. 1. - - - School House at Wading River, N.Y. ( School District No.1.)
- Election District No. 2. - - - Polish Hall, Marcy Avenue, Riverhead, New York.
- Election District No. 3. - - - H. E. Campbell's Salesroom, West Main St., Riverhead, N.Y.
- Election District No. 4. - - - Town Clerk's Office, Roanoke Avenue, Riverhead, N.Y.
- Election District No. 5. - - - Fire Department Headquarters, Second St., Riverhead, N.Y.
- Election District No. 6. - - - Town Board Meeting Room, Roanoke Avenue, Riverhead, N.Y.

Election District No.7. - - School House, Aquebogue, New York.  
Election District No.8. - - School House, Jamesport, New York.  
Election District No.9. - - Assessors' Office, Town Hall, Roanoke  
Avenue, Riverhead, N.Y.

The Town Clerk was directed to advise the Department of Elections of the places designated as Polling Places and to advise that the Town Officers to be elected at the General Election in November are as follows: Supervisor, Two Justices of the Peace for four year terms, One assessor for a four year term, One assessor for a two year term, a Superintendent of Highways, a Receiver of Taxes, a Town Clerk, and a School Director for a four year term.

A communication was read from William L. Miller of Wading River, in reference to the action taken by the Town Board on the Petitions for traffic signal lights at Wading River, N.Y.

The Highway Committee reported that Special Constables would be stationed at the two intersections where the signers of the petitions requested traffic lights, on Saturdays and Sundays from 10:30 A. M. to 10:30 P.M., for the balance of the season and that a traffic count would be made by said Special Constables for the guidance of the Highway Committee and further that the lateness of the summer season would not permit the installation of traffic signals in time to be of much value for this season. The Town Clerk was directed to advise Mr. Miller accordingly.

A letter was read from Attorney J. Harry Saxstien, asking what action had been taken in the Skinkaytis matter at South Jamesport, N.Y. As this letter had been answered by the Town Clerk, no action was taken on the matter other than to order the communication placed on file.

Bill No. 8984 in the amount of \$8.00 for services rendered by Dr. Vincent A. Doroszka at the request of a Justice of the Peace, which bill had been held over by the Town Board of Audit for action by the Town Board, was presented, and Justice Rubenstein advised that Dr. Doroszka had examined two men brought before him by Special Constables and was of the opinion that the bill should be paid.

On motion duly made by Justice Stackpole, seconded by Justice Frederick and duly carried, it was Resolved That the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to pay bill No. 8984 being in the amount of \$8.00 and in favor of Dr. Vincent A. Doroszka for services rendered.

The sewer Committee advised having had many conferences with Chairman Smith of the local committee and advised that

petitions were ready to be circulated by members of the local town committee for signatures of tax payers. The Committee was ordered continued.

Justice Stackpole advised having written the Office of the Attorney General for advice as to what officer should be appointed by the Town Board to issue permits for short wave receiving sets to be used in automobiles and that she had not received a reply to her letter.

The Highway Committee, to which the matter of an additional traffic standard and light on the south side of Main Street at the end of Griffing Avenue, was referred with power to act, advised that said standard and light had been ordered installed.

John Kruszon, Clerk to the Board of Assessors, advised that he would need a clerk to assist him in writing up the roll for the period of a few weeks.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein, seconded by Justice Frederick and duly carried it was Resolved That the Clerk to the Board of Assessors be and he hereby is authorized to employ a clerk to assist him in the work of writing up the tax roll and extending taxes, for a period not exceeding four weeks, and be it further Resolved That the compensation of said clerk be and the same hereby is fixed at \$25.00 per week.

A renewal contract in duplicate, was presented for street lights in the Riverhead Lighting District by the Long Island Lighting Company for a five year period and was referred to the Lighting Committee for investigation.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein, seconded by Justice Frederick and duly carried it was Resolved That the matter of placing the Town of Riverhead on a Budget system, which was laid on the table by a resolution of the Town Board at a Special Meeting held July 27, 1932, be and the same hereby is placed on the calendar and be it further Resolved That said Special Meeting be re-convened on Saturday, September 9, 1933 at 10.00 o'clock Daylight Saving Time for the purpose of voting on the following resolution " Resolved That the Town Board does hereby elect to make the provisions of Article 6A of the Town Law applicable to the Town of Riverhead.

There being no further business, on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned.
