

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Wednesday, September 13, 1933 at 2 P.M.

The minutes of the Town Board meeting of August 30, 1933 were read and on motion and vote duly adopted.

The minutes of the Special Meeting of the Town Board held on September 9, 1933 were read and on motion and vote duly adopted.

A petition was read from taxpayers requesting that a larger street lamp be installed at the corner of Elton Street and Roanoke Avenue, in the Village of Riverhead, and was referred by the Supervisor to the Lighting Committee for investigation and report.

J. Harry Brown, addressed the Board, advising that he spoke for a committee, appointed by the Civic Club of Riverhead, which committee had considered the question of a suitable name for the new town road, which extends from Pier Avenue to Penny's Landing Road, and that said committee recommends that the new road be named "Nunnakoma Trail" being an Indian name meaning "By the Shore". This committee also recommended that the road commonly called "Sound Avenue", be known as "Queens Highway", the name by which it is known and designated on old deeds and records, and that suitable signs be erected on said road at each intersection designating said road at "Queens Highway", also signs be erected at each intersection indicating the direction and distance of Riverhead. No action was taken on these recommendations at this time.

Advice having been received from the Department of Election that Inspectors of Election should be designated for the newly created Election District Number 9, which district is a portion of the former Sixth District, on motion duly made by Justice Frederick, seconded by Justice

Stackpole and duly carried, it was Resolved That the following persons be and they hereby are appointed Inspectors of Election for the respective districts designated.

The question was raised as to whether or not the Town should publish a list of the Polling Places in the Town and it was stated that lists of polling places were published by the Department of Elections.

Justice Stackpole read a letter which she had received from the Office of the Attorney General, in reply to her letter requesting advice as to what person should be designated by the Town Board to issue permits for the use of short wave receiving sets in automobiles. Said communication advised that the Town Board could designate whoever it desired to issue such permits.

On motion duly made by Justice Stackpole, seconded by Justice Frederick and duly carried it was Resolved That the Town Clerk be and he hereby is designated by this Board to issue permits as per Section 1916 of the Penal Law, to applicants desiring to operate short wave receiving sets in automobiles, and that such permits be issued for the term of the calendar year, upon payment of the fee of \$1.00 and that a record of all permits so issued be recorded in a book kept for that purpose.

There being no further business, on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on September 27, 1933 at 2 P.M.
