

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, December 2, 1942 at 2:00 P. M.

Minutes of a meeting held on November 18, 1942 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication was read from Mr. Howard A. Wells, making application for the appointment of Dog Enumerator for 1943. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Boutcher, it was RESOLVED that Howard A. Wells be appointed Dog Enumerator for the Town of Riverhead for the year of 1943, salary fixed by the State Dept. of Agriculture and Markets. The vote, Justices Smith, Ruskowski, Warner and Boutcher, Yes, Supervisor Kelly, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A communication was read from Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes, asking the Board to confirm the appointments of Addie Zaleski and Mary McGoey as Clerks to the Receiver of Taxes, pursuant to Section 20, Chapter 187 of the Suffolk County Tax Act. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Boutcher and seconded by Justice Smith, it was RESOLVED that Addie Zaleski and Mary McGoey be appointed Clerks to the Receiver of Taxes, to serve at the discretion of the Receiver of Taxes, salary fixed at the rate of \$4.00 per day. The vote, Justices Smith, Ruskowski, Warner and Boutcher, Yes, Supervisor Kelly, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Smith offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Ruskowski

WHEREAS, the year 1942 marks the 150th Anniversary of the organization of the Riverhead Township, and

WHEREAS, a celebration was held in the Town to commemorate the occasion, and as a part of which, Mrs. Helen H. Reeve compiled a booklet entitled "RIVERHEAD TOWN - THE RECORD SPEAKS", and

WHEREAS, the officials comprising the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead feel that a reasonable number of such booklets be filed in the Town Clerk's Office to be kept with the permanent records of the Town, now,


therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that ten copies of the aforesaid booklet be filed with Harry J. Kratoville, the Town Clerk of the Town of Riverhead and that such booklets be suitably kept in the Town Clerk's Office with the permanent Town records. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The Welfare Committee submitted a report of the Welfare Department for the month of November, 1942 and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined the Town bills for the month of November, 1942.

There being no further business on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on Thursday, December 16, 1942 at 4:00 P. M.
