

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Wednesday, September 27, 1933 at 2 P.M.

Town Superintendent of Highways Raymond S. Welch was present.

The minutes of the Town Board meeting of September 13, 1933 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

The resignation of Lorimer M. Raynor as Inspector of Election was presented and on motion duly made by Justice Burnside, seconded by Justice Rubenstein and carried it was Resolved That the resignation of Lorimer M. Raynor, as Inspector of Election be accepted and placed on file.

A communication was read from the Riverhead Water District advising of the budget needed for the Riverhead Water District No. 1 and the Roanoke Heights Extension District and on motion by Justice Burnside, seconded by Town Clerk Burns, and duly carried it was Resolved That the budget as presented by the Riverhead Water District for the year 1934 be accepted and that same be placed on file.

A communication was read from Harry G. Penny, Secretary of the Riverhead Fire Department, enclosing the Estimate for the Budget for the Riverhead Fire District for the year 1934, together with a statement as to the amount of assessed valuation of the Riverhead Fire District as shown on the tax rolls of 1932.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein, seconded by Justice Burnside and carried it was Resolved That the Estimate for the Budget for the Riverhead Fire District be and the same hereby is accepted and that said budget be turned over to the Supervisor for the purpose of having the taxes extended on the tax roll.

A communication was read from the New York Telephone Company, requesting that a permit form enclosed, granting the Town of Riverhead permission to attach a cable with the necessary fixtures for traffic signal purposes, to certain poles owned

jointly by the Long Island Lighting Company and the New York Telephone Company, at Main Street and Main South Road Jamesport, N.Y., be signed by the Supervisor of the Town of Riverhead.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein, seconded by Justice Frederick and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized and empowered to sign permit in favor of the Town of Riverhead, to be granted by the New York Telephone Company and that same be accepted on behalf of said town to attach a suspension strand and cable for traffic signal purposes to certain poles at Jamesport in the Town of Riverhead.

A communication was read from the Department of Health, State of New York, Albany, N.Y., enclosing copy of Chapter 782 of the Laws of 1933, enabling municipalities to secure the benefits of the National Recovery Act. Said communication was ordered placed on file.

Communications were read from the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors and the Department of Audit and Control, Albany, N.Y., said communications acknowledging receipt of certified copies of Town Board resolution, making the provisions of Article 6A of the Town Law applicable to the Town of Riverhead. Said communications were ordered placed on file.

Supervisor Homan presented Bond of the Maryland Casualty Company in the sum of Eighty Four Thousand Five Hundred Fifty-One and 78/100 Dollars in favor of the Town of Riverhead pursuant to the provisions of Section 104 of the Highway Law, for the term beginning January 1, 1933 and ending on December 31, 1933.

On motion by Justice Rubenstein, seconded by Justice Frederick and duly carried it was Resolved That the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, does hereby approve the bond of the Maryland Casualty Company in the sum of \$84,551.78 pursuant to the provisions of the Highway Law, as to its form, manner of execution and the sufficiency of the surety.

Mr. Robert Stivers of Riverhead addressed the Board requesting that the Town Board cause a proposition to be voted upon by the taxpayers of the Town, said proposition being to purchase a tract of land consisting on about twenty-nine acres of land bordering on the Long Island Sound, with a shore frontage of 545 feet, which land borders on the Howell M. Reeve Memorial park. Said tract of land being owned at the present time by Hocker-Wheeler and Brewster and the purchase price being \$18,000.00 The matter was referred to the Highway Committee

for investigation and Mr. Stivers was advised to have a petition drawn up and signed by taxpayers of the Town for the consideration of the Town Board.

The matter of whether or not to publish Election Notices was brought to the attention of the Board and referred to the Audited Bills Committee for investigation.

Mr. Carl Hennecke addressed the Board relative to the Town purchasing a fire extinguisher for the use of the Police Department in extinguishing small fires and automobile fires and the matter was referred to the Highway Committee.

It was decided to meet on October 3, 1933 at 7:30 for the purpose of considering matters pertaining to the Budget for the year 1934.

There being no further business, on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned.
