

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Tuesday, October 31, 1933 following the Public Hearing on the Budget.

Raymond S. Welch, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein, seconded by Justice Burnside and duly carried It was Resolved that the Town Board of Riverhead allow one voting machine to be placed in the Democratic Headquarters and one voting machine in the Republican Headquarters, for the purpose of allowing the public to be instructed in the operation of the voting machines, there to be no expense to the Town of Riverhead, whatsoever, for the moving of the machines or any other expense, the political parties of the town being responsible for such expenses.

It was decided that no Notice be given in the local papers of instructions on the Voting Machines as the political parties would take care of such notices.

Mr. Vail of the Long Island Lighting Company, addressed the Board requesting that the Lighting Contract for the Riverhead Lighting District be signed. It was decided to refer the contract to Attorney Lockwood to ascertain if the interests of the Town were properly taken care of in said contract.

On motion duly made by Justice Frederick, seconded by Justice Rubenstein and duly carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow upon certificates of indebtedness, the sum of \$3,000.00 to pay on account of Audited Bills of October 31, 1933.

Supervisor Homan referred to the Audited Bills Committee, the matter of mosquito extermination as presented to the Board of Supervisors, under An Act to Amend the public Health law, in relation to the establish

ment of mosquito extermination commissions in certain counties, to define their powers and duties and to provide for the payment of their expenses and disbursements, and requested that said Committee examine the matter.

There being no further business, on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, November 8, 1933 at 8 P.M., at which time the budget will be adopted.
