

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, November 9, 1938 at 2:00 P.M.

Communications were received from the New York Telephone Co. and the Long Island Lighting Co. acknowledging receipt of resolutions forwarded to their respective Companies, relative to the very fine service rendered by them during the hurricane disaster of Sept. 21st. The communications were ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Zaleski and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved that the Town of Riverhead renew its membership with the Association of Towns of the State of New York and that the membership fee of \$33.00 for the year 1939 be paid. The Vote, Justices Zaleski, Kelly, Warner and Boutcher, Yes, Supervisor Homan, Yes. Total Vote, Yes 5, No 0. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Supervisor Homan submitted his report for the month of October 1938 and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Mr. Gordon Lipetz, Attorney, representing F.W. Jackson & Sons of Hampton Bays, N.Y. addressed the Board and submitted a dedication and map of proposed highway known as "Southern Parkway" for its acceptance as a Town Highway. He stated that the proposed Highway has been worked and loamed by the owners and is now ready for the consideration of the Town Board. The dedication and map was referred to the Highway Committee and the matter ordered placed on the next Board calendar.

Mr. L. Gilson Griffing addressed the Board in regard to an advertisement in the "Suffolk County Book" to be issued during the World's Fair to publicize the east end of Long Island. Supervisor Homan advised that there was no provision made in next years budget for such advertisement, however the Town Board would consider the matter very carefully and see what could be done and further that he would be very glad to take the matter up with the Board of Supervisors for their consideration.

On motion made by Justice Kelly and seconded by Justice Boutcher, it was Resolved that the Supervisor be authorized to obtain liability insurance covering the parking field on the MacDonald property on Griffing Ave. and also the parking field on the Hallett property off Seconic Ave. The Vote, Justices Zaleski, Kelly, Warner and Boutcher, Yes, Supervisor Homan, Yes. Total Vote, Yes 5, No 0. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Miss Jean E. Hallock of Riverhead addressed the Board in regard to publicity for the Town of Riverhead over WICC of Bridgeport, Conn. on the program "Here's Long Island" in which she herself takes part from 10:45 A.M. to 11:00 A.M. every Wednesday. She explained the benefits

which are derived from such broadcasts and the territory which WICC covers at the low cost of \$15.00 per program. She urged the Board to take the matter into consideration.

On motion made by Justice Kelly and seconded by Justice Zaleski it was Resolved that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to enter into a contract with WICC Bridgeport, Conn. to publicize the Town of Riverhead on the program "Here's Long Island" for six consecutive programs over a period of six weeks for the sum not to exceed \$15.00 per program. The Vote, Justices Zaleski, Kelly, Warner and Boutcher, Yes, Supervisor Homan, Yes. Total Vote, Yes 5, No 0. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion and vote, Justice Kelly was duly appointed to act as a publicity committee in and for the Town of Riverhead.

On motion made by Justice Zaleski and seconded by Justice Warner, it was Resolved that Edward Vonatzski of Jamesport, N.Y., be and he hereby is appointed special policeman for the Town of Riverhead to serve on school duty at Jamesport, and it is further,

Resolved that the said special policeman serve at the pleasure of the Town Board between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 9:00 A.M., 11:00 A.M. to 1:00 P.M. and 3:00 P.M. to 4:00 P.M., under the direction and supervision of the Town Board; and it is further,

Resolved that his compensation be fixed at the rate of 50 cents per hour. The Vote, Justices Zaleski, Kelly, Warner and Boutcher, Yes, Supervisor Homan, Yes. Total Vote, Yes 5, No 0. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A communication was read from Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes recommending the appointments of Helen Maks, Helen Panowich, Edith Stakey, Louise E. Downs and Ida E. Vail to serve as special clerks to the Receiver of Taxes. Said recommendations made pursuant to section 20 chapter 311 of the Laws of 1920. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Kelly and seconded by Justice Boutcher, it was Resolved that the appointments of Helen Maks, Helen Panowich, Edith Stakey, Louise E. Downs and Ida E. Vail as special clerks to the Receiver of Taxes be and they hereby are affirmed and further,

Resolved that said special clerks serve at the discretion of the Receiver of Taxes, salary fixed at the rate of \$4.00 per day. The Vote, Justices Zaleski, Kelly, Warner and Boutcher, Yes, Supervisor Homan, Yes. Total Vote, Yes 5, No 0. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Kelly and seconded by Justice Zaleski, it was Resolved that the Bond for the Receiver of Taxes be fixed at \$50,000.00 and further,

Resolved that the Holdup and Robbery Bonds be fixed at \$10,000.00 each. The Resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

There being no further business, on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on November 30, 1938 at 2:00 P.M.
