

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, on Tuesday, November 28, 1933 at 2 P.M.

Raymond S. Welch, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein, seconded by Justice Frederick and duly carried it was Resolved That Justice Burnside be and he hereby is appointed Chairman of the Meeting.

The minutes of the Town Board meeting of November 8, 1933 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted as read.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein, seconded by Justice Stackpole and duly carried it was Resolved That the compensation of the Town Clerk for election services in accordance with Section 49 of the Election Law for the year 1933, be and the same hereby is fixed at \$200.00

A communication from Mrs. H.L. Scammon requesting an additional street light on Ostrander Avenue, was read and referred to the Lighting Committee for investigation.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein, seconded by Justice Frederick and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow upon certificate of indebtedness, the sum of Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars to pay on account of Audited Bills of November 27, 1933.

A communication from the Department of Agriculture and Markets, Albany, N.Y., advising that the Town Board should appoint a dog enumerator to list the owners of dogs in the Town of Riverhead, was brought to the attention of the Board and held over.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein, seconded by Town Clerk Burns and duly carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized

and directed to borrow upon certificates of indebtedness, the sum of \$5,000.00 in anticipation of taxes to retire five Water District Bonds in the amount of \$1000.00 each due on December 1, 1933.

A communication was read from Marvin Shiebler, Secretary of the Suffolk County Semi-Official Mosquito Commission, enclosing a copy of the Mosquito Bill as proposed for Suffolk County and ordered placed on file.

A communication from County Superintendent of Highways A.O. Smith, enclosing letter from Comptroller of the State of New York, relative to Chapter 798 of the Laws of 1931 known as the Relief Act, was read and ordered placed on file.

The compensation of Sadie Goldberg for services as Clerk to assist in the extension of the tax roll for a period of five and one half days was fixed at \$5.00 per day.

On motion duly made by Justice Stackpole, seconded by Justice Frederick and duly carried it was Resolved That the amount of the bond for the Supervisor be and the same hereby is fixed at \$40,000.00

On motion duly made by Justice Stackpole, seconded by Town Clerk Burns and duly carried it was Resolved That the amount of bond for the Justices of the Peace, for the Superintendent of Highways, for the Town Clerk be and the same are fixed at \$1000.00 each, and be it further Resolved That the amount of bond for constables be and the same hereby is fixed at \$500.00

On motion duly made by Town Clerk Burns, seconded by Justice Stackpole and duly carried it was Resolved That the amount of the bond for the Receiver of Taxes be and the same hereby is fixed at \$50,000.00.

A communication from Harry J. Kratoville and William J. Kratoville, advising the Board that they were desirous of dedicating a certain tract of land, 50 feet in width, extending from the Main Road to Hubbard Avenue, to the Town of Riverhead, to be used as a Town Highway, said strip of land having been staked out, monumented at both ends, plowed and harrowed, was read.

The Highway Committee reported having inspected said proposed highway and recommended that the Town take the necessary steps to accept said proposed highway and lay same out.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein, seconded by Justice Frederick and duly carried it was Resolved That the

owners of the tract of land extending from the Main Road to Hubbard Avenue, be notified that the Town Board would accept said tract of land for a public highway upon the dedication of the land by the owners.

Mr. Daniel R. Young, presented a copy of map, which he had drawn up at the request of the Board of Assessors, showing the front footage of property situated in the Village of Riverhead, which he would furnish to the Town of Riverhead, in book form for the Board of Assessors with a duplicate copy for filing in the Office of the Town Clerk, at a total cost of \$325.00.

On motion duly made by Justice Stackpole, seconded by Justice Rubenstein and carried it was Resolved That Daniel R. Young be and he hereby is authorized to furnish the Town of Riverhead with map in book form for use of the Board of Assessors with a duplicate copy for filing in the Office of the Town Clerk at a cost of \$325.00

There being no further business, on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on December 13, 1933 at 2 P.M.
