

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Monday, June 18, 1928 at 7:30 P.M.

Charles O. Downs, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

The minutes of the meeting of the Town Board, held June 4, 1928 were read and on motion and vote adopted.

A communication received from Marvin Shiebler, President of the Suffolk County Taxpayers Association, regarding the 1928 Mosquito Campaign was brought to the attention of the Board.

A Petition for an additional street light on Marcy Avenue north of Cemetery Avenue was presented and referred to the Lighting Committee for investigation.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED, That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk of the Town of Riverhead, County of Suffolk, New York, or either of them be and they hereby are, authorized, empowered and directed to enter into a contract with the AUTOMATIC REGISTERING MACHINE COMPANY, Incorporated, for the purchase of two (2) U.S. STANDARD VOTING MACHINES of the 9 row, 30 candidate size, at the net price of Nine Hundred Forty Dollars (\$940.) each, f.o.b. cars, Jamestown, N.Y. and be it further RESOLVED, That in payment for said voting machines, the Supervisor is hereby authorized, empowered and directed, upon receipt of said machines, to pay to the AUTOMATIC REGISTERING MACHINE COMPANY, Incorporated, the sum of Eighteen Hundred Eighty and no/100 Dollars (\$1880.00)

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED that the Town Clerk be and he is hereby instructed to forward copies of the minutes of all future Town Board Meetings to the members of the Town Board as soon as can conveniently be so after each meeting.

Charles O. Downs, Superintendent of Highways, having

investigated the damages done to the land of William F. Morell at Riverhead, N.Y. by the water from the road drain running through his property, recommended that the Town pay William F. Morell the sum of \$75.00 for the years 1927 and 1928.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED that William F. Morell be allowed the sum of \$75.00 for damages to his property by the water from the road drain running through his property for the years 1927 and 1928.

Charles O. Downs, Town Superintendent of Highways, advised the Board that the work of building concrete highways at Aquebogue and South Jamesport would be put out for bids.

Charles O. Downs, Town Superintendent of Highways, advised the Board, that he would require the Contractor, who is to lay the water mains within the Water District, to obtain a permit from him to open the highways in the town and would require a certified check from the Contractor to guarantee that the highways so opened, would be left in good condition after the laying of the water mains had been completed.

The appointments of the Special Constables having been agreed upon, it was decided that the Special Constable using a motorcycle in his duties, may work twelve hours per day and that said Special shall be on duty in front of the school at Riverhead, when necessary to safeguard the school children; that the other Special Constables may work ten hours per day and that one man shall be on duty at Jamesport during the day, one at Riverhead during the day and one at Riverhead during the night and that these Special Constables shall alternate each week.

The Town Clerk was instructed to request that a representative of the Horni Signal Manufacturing Corporation come to Riverhead to regulate the traffic signals and if possible to hook up the traffic signals so that the signals at Griffing Avenue and Main Street and Roanoke Avenue and Main Street may be controlled together.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That it shall be unlawful for any person to set off at any time any fire crackers whatever on the public highways in the Town of Riverhead, and it shall also be unlawful for any person or persons to build bonfires or set off any fireworks on the public highways in the said Town of Riverhead, at

any time. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punished in a case of conviction by a fine not exceeding \$50.00 or imprisonment in the county jail for a term not exceeding six months or by both such fine and imprisonment.

It was decided that the foregoing resolution should be published in the local papers and the necessary posters printed and posted about the Town.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was

Resolved that the Rules and Regulations adopted at the meeting of the Town Board on April 14, 1924, and subsequent meetings be and the same are hereby amended, ratified and confirmed so as to read as follows:

**Regulation No. 1.** No automobile or other vehicle shall be parked within ten feet of a fire hydrant.

**Regulation No. 2.** No automobile or other vehicle shall be parked within a space of ten feet from the center line of any street crossing designated by visible markings on the street and curb.

**Regulation No. 3.** No automobile or other vehicle shall be parked within any restricted area designated by signs or markings placed or posted by authority of the Town Board.

**Regulation No. 4.** Except as hereinafter provided, no automobile or other vehicle shall be parked on any street otherwise than with its right wheels within six inches of the curb or curb line.

**Regulation No. 5.** No automobile or other vehicle, except as hereinafter provided, shall be parked on Main street between the Long Island House and East avenue crossing, otherwise than with the right front tire, fender or spring touching the curb or curb line within a parking space designated by visible markings on the sides of said street and so that all wheels of any vehicle will be clear of the lines indicating such parking space.

**Regulation No. 6.** No automobile or other vehicle shall be parked on Main street, west of Griffing avenue, otherwise than with both right wheels not more than six inches from the curb.

**Regulation No. 7.** No automobile or other vehicle shall be parked within the mapped area, as shown in part on the annexed sketch, at a distance greater than eighteen inches from the nearest vehicle, unless more than twenty-five feet of space exists between the nearest car parked and the one being parked.

**Regulation No. 8.** No automobile or other vehicle shall make a left hand turn in leaving a parking space, but shall proceed to the nearest corner (Roanoke avenue excepted) before turning around.

**Regulation No. 9.** No automobile or other vehicle shall turn around on Main street at the Roanoke avenue abutment.

**Regulation No. 10.** No commercial vehicle measuring more than sixteen feet over all shall park within said mapped area between 10 o'clock A. M. and midnight, prevailing time.

**Regulation No. 11.** No automobile or other vehicle shall stop at the restricted area in the post office block on either side of Main street for more than five minutes, between the hours of 10 A. M. and 8 P. M.

**Regulation No. 12.** All intersecting and abutting streets shall be marked at the center point of intersection or abutment and all automobiles or other vehicles shall keep to the right of such marks in making turns at corners, unless otherwise instructed by the officer on duty at the intersection or abutment.

**Regulation No. 13.** No parking space shall be marked, nor shall any sign be displayed, restricting the parking of automobiles or other vehicles, except upon authority of the Town Board.

**Regulation No. 14.** Any person parking or leaving a vehicle on the highways of the Town of Riverhead does so at his or her own risk.

**Regulation No. 15.** No automobile or other vehicle shall park within the area on Main street between Griffing avenue and Benjamin place for longer than a period of two hours between 9 A. M. and 6 P. M., prevailing time.

Regulation No. 17. The annexed map heretofore referred to contains a general idea of the manner of parking on the streets shown thereon, as contemplated by this resolution, and the same is hereby made a part thereof.

Any person violating any of the provisions of this resolution shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not exceeding fifty dollars.


This resolution shall take effect immediately.
