

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Clerk's Office, April 16th, 1920 at 7:30 P.M.

Minutes of previous meeting read and on motion adopted.

On motion made, seconded and carried the following ordinance was passed and ordered published in the two local papers once each in the weeks beginning April 18th and April 25th, 1920 and also 50 card board copies be printed.

Pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 414 of the Laws of 1915, in effect April 25th, 1915, by which authority is given to the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead to manage, control and fix wharfage rates in reference to the use of the Town Dock at the foot of River Street, or Town Dock Road, in the Village and Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead does hereby enact as follows:

FIRST: No boat, barge or vessel shall moor at, remain tied to, or obstruct, the head or Southerly side of said Town Dock, or the Easterly side thereof, for a distance of sixty feet from the South end, for a longer period than six hours, to receive and discharge passengers, or cargo, or for any other purpose, without the written consent of the Supervisor or Town Clerk of said Town, and such consent for occupancy for a longer period shall not be granted except upon cause shown.

SECOND: The captain, master, owner, or other person having charge of a boat, barge or vessel desiring to discharge or take on passengers or cargo across the head of said dock, or on the East side thereof at any point sixty feet from the Southerly end, occupying said space for a longer period than six hours shall secure a written permit therefor from

the Supervisor or Town Clerk of said Town. The owner, captain or person having in charge a boat, barge or vessel occupying the Southerly end of said wharf, or the Easterly side thereof within sixty feet of the South end, for a longer period than six hours, shall be charged and pay wharfage rates in the sum of twenty five cents per hour or fraction thereof to the Supervisor of said Town for any period of occupancy over six hours.

THIRD: No boat, barge or vessel shall occupy the Easterly side of said dock from the North end thereof to a point within sixty feet of the South end thereof for a longer period than twelve hours, and in case of the occupancy of such part for a longer period a written permit shall be obtained by the owner, master, captain or person having the boat in charge from the Supervisor or Town Clerk of said Town, and wharfage not to exceed two dollars per week shall be charged and paid for such occupancy.

FOURTH: The wharfage fees herein referred to are payable in advance.

FIFTH: Wharfage fees, penalties and all moneys received by the Supervisor of said Town for the use of, or in any way concerning said dock, shall be paid by the Supervisor into the contingent fund of said town.

SIXTH: It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to violate any of the provisions of this ordinance and in the event of any person or persons violating any of the provisions hereof they shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than Fifty Dollars or imprisonment of not more than five days or by both such fine and imprisonment, and they shall also be deemed liable to a penalty of Fifty dollars for such offense against any of the provisions of this ordinance, to be recovered in an action brought by the Supervisor, in the name of the Town, against any person violating any of the provisions hereof.

On motion made, seconded and carried it was ordered that State Insurance fund Policy #22974 (workmans Compensation) be cancelled after 30 days notice, notice expiring on May 9th, 1920.

There being no further business meeting adjourned.
