

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, on Wednesday, December 20, 1933 at 2 P.M.

Raymond S. Welch, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

The minutes of the Town Board meeting held December 13, 1933 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

On motion duly made by Justice Stackpole, seconded by Justice Frederick and duly carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow upon certificate of indebtedness, the sum of Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars to pay on account of Audited Bills of December 19, 1933.

The following official bonds were presented for the approval of the Town Board, prior to filing with the County Clerk:

Bond No. 23080 of the United States Casualty Company, bonding Robert Burnside, as Justice of the Peace in the amount of \$1000.00

Bond No. 23081 of the United States Casualty Company, bonding George E. Luce, as Justice of the Peace in the amount of \$1000.00

Bond No. 23082 of the United States Casualty Company, bonding Harry J. Kratoville, as Town Clerk, in the amount of \$1000.00

Bond No. 11,407 of the Continental Casualty Company, bonding William H. Clark, as Superintendent of Highways, in the amount of \$1000.00

Bond No. NYBO-07-2-34 of the United States Fidelity and Guaranty Company, bonding Milton L. Burns, as Supervisor, in the amount of \$40,000.00

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein, seconded by Justice Frederick and duly carried it was Resolved That bond No. 23080 of the United States Casualty Company, bonding Robert Burnside as Justice of the Peace, Bond No. 23081 of the United States Casualty Company, bonding George E. Luce, as Justice of the Peace, Bond No. 33082 of the United States Casualty Company, bonding Harry J. Kratoville, as Town Clerk, Bond No. 11,407 of the Continental Casualty Company, bonding William H. Clark, as Superintendent of Highways, in the amount of \$1,000, and Bond No. NYBO-07-2-34 of the United States Fidelity and Guaranty Company, bonding Milton L. Burns, as Supervisor, in the amount of \$40,000.00, be and the same hereby are approved as to form, manner of execution and the sufficiency of the sureties, and be it further Resolved That the Town Clerk be and he hereby is directed to file said bonds with the County Clerk.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Frederick, it was Resolved That the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized and directed to transfer the sum of \$300.00 from the Bridge Fund to Item No. 1 Highway Account, and the sum of \$200.00 from the Bridge Fund to the Machinery Fund of the Highway Account, for the purpose of providing the means of working men under Project N.1, Civic Works Administration.

Supervisor Homan thereupon declared that the resolution had been duly carried.

Justice Rubenstein reporting for the Highway Committee advised that the committee had visited Ambrose Page, of the Civic Works Administration, at Patchogue, N.Y. and were advised that if the Town Board would approve projects that the administration would be enabled to put many men to work and that the Town would only have to furnish the material and tools and the trucks to transport the men to and from work, and the Highway Committee recommended that the Board approve projects.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein, seconded by Town Clerk Burns and duly carried it was Resolved That this Board does hereby approve as a project for the consideration of the Civic Works Administration, the completion of the Sound Shore Road, which project is to be known as Project No. 1.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein, seconded by Justice Stackpole and carried it was Resolved That this Board does hereby approve as a project for the consideration of the Civic Works Administration, the building of sidewalks or paths along public highways in the hamlets of Jamesport, Aquebogue, Calverton, Wading River, Northville and in the Upper Mills section of the Town of Riverhead, which project is to be known as Project No. 2.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein, seconded by Town Clerk Burns and duly carried it was Resolved That this Board does hereby approve as a project for the consideration of the Civic Works Administration, the completion of the Saw Mill Brook Road, which project is to be known as Project No. 3.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein, seconded by Justice Frederick and duly carried it was Resolved That this Board does hereby approve as a project for the consideration of the Civic Works Administration, the widening and straightening of the Wading River-Manor Road, at Wading River, which project is to be known as Project No. 4.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein, seconded by Justice Frederick and duly carried it was Resolved That this Board does hereby approve as a project for the consideration of the Civic Works Administration, the building of a bulkhead at the end of the Town Park Road and the widening of the road for parking space, at said Town Park Road, which project is to be known as Project No. 5.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, it was Resolved That this Board hereby approve as a project for the consideration of the Civic Works Administration, the building of a road to extend from Hubbard Avenue to Indian Island, when the land has been dedicated to the Town and the highway accepted by the Town Board, which project is to be known as Project No. 6.

The matter of making application to have said projects accepted by the Civic Works Administration was referred to the Highway Committee.

There being no further business, on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on December 28, 1933 at 2 P.M.
