HELD IN THE TOWN HALL ON TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 2, 1960 AT 9:30 A. M.

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE PIKE.

RESOLVED THAT THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE TOWN BOARD HELD IN THE TOWN HALL ON TUESDAY, JANUARY 19, 1960 BE APPROVED AS SUBMITTED.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

SUPERVISOR'S REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF JANUARY 1960 WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AND ORDERED PLACED ON FILE.

POLICE REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF JANUARY 1960 WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AND ORDERED PLACED ON FILE.

MR. EUGENE ROMANO APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD RELATIVE TO THE POSTING OF A BOND FOR IMPROVEMENTS IN "ROANOKE HOMES" SUBDIVISION AT MIDDLE ROAD, RIVERHEAD, AS REQUIRED BY THE TOWN PLANNING BOARD.

MR. ROMANO STATED THAT HE EXPECTED THE BOND IN A DAY OR TWO AND ASKED IF THE TOWN ATTORNEY COULD BE AUTHORIZED TO ACCEPT SAID BOND SO THAT HE COULD PROCEED WITH CONSTRUCTION OF HOMES IN THIS DEVELOPMENT.

IT WAS THE CONSENSUS OF THE BOARD THAT THEY COULD CONVENE AT A SPECIAL MEETING TO ACCEPT AND APPROVE SAID BOND, AND MR. ROMANO WAS INSTRUCTED TO ADVISE SUPERVISOR LEONARD WHEN HE RECEIVED SAID BOND.

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE ZALOGA.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

MR. KENNETH ROWLAND, RECREATION DIRECTOR, APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD AND REQUESTED THAT THE RIVERHEAD LIGHT DISTRICT BE EXTENDED TO INCLUDE THE RECREATION AREA ON PULASKI STREET.

MATTER REFERRED TO ALDEN W. YOUNG.

MR. WICKHAM TYTE, RIVERHEAD, APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD IN OPPOSITION TO ANY PUBLIC HOUSING PROGRAM. HE STATED THAT PUBLIC HOUSING DOES NOT CURE SLUM PROBLEMS, THAT PUBLIC HOUSING TAKES TAXABLE PROPERTY OFF OF THE TAX ROLLS AND THAT ANY PUBLIC HOUSING PROGRAM IS PERMANENTELY SUBSIDIZED.

HE SUGGESTED THAT A COMMITTEE OF QUALIFIED PEOPLE BE GATHERED TOGETHER TO MAKE A STUDY FOR PRIVATE ENTERPRISE TO TAKE OVER THIS PROJECT.

A COMMUNICATION DATED JANUARY 25, 1960 FROM THE LONG ISLAND LIGHTING COMPANY WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

"REFERRING TO YOUR LETTER OF DECEMBER 18, 1959, THE LONG ISLAND LIGHTING COMPANY AND THE NEW YORK TELEPHONE COMPANY REPRESENTATIVES MADE A FIELD SURVEY ON JANUARY 18, 1960 FOR POSSIBLE RELOCATION OF POLES #21 THROUGH #24 ON EAST MAIN STREET, RIVERHEAD. YOUR REQUESTED LOCATION FOR THESE POLES TO CLEAR CONSTRUCTION OF A PROPOSED CURB AND GUTTER IS IN THE CENTER LINE OF A ROW OF LARGE TREES, WHICH WOULD HAVE TO BE TRIMMED EXTENSIVELY FOR ADEQUATE CLEANANCE TO BOTH LIL COMPANY AND N.Y. TEL. COMPANY FACILITIES. THIS TRIMMING, WE FEEL IS EXTENSIVE ENOUGH TO WARRANT THE REMOVAL OF THE TREES WITHIN THE AREA AS DESCRIBED IN YOUR LETTER. PLEASE NOTIFY THIS OFFICE WHEN YOU HAVE DETERMINED THAT THE PROPOSED WORK IS TO START."

AWARD OF BID DELAYED UNTIL MEETING OF FEBRUARY 16, 1960.

IN OBSERVANCE OF BOY SCOUT WEEK, FEBRUARY 7TH TO 13TH, FIVE MEMBERS OF SCOUT TROOPS IN RIVERHEAD "TOOK OVER" THE TOWN BOARD.

THEY WERE RICHARD FREY OF TROOP 96, WHO "PRESIDED" AS "SUPERVISOR", LEE TAYLOR OF TROOP 47 AND PHILIP CORWIN, TROOP 174 WERE "COUNCILMEN" AND BARRY KARLIN, TROOP 132 AND GEORGE BARTUNEK, TROOP 202, "JUSTICES OF THE PEACE".

JUSTICE OTIS G. PIKE READ A PROCLAMATION SIGNED BY SUPERVISOR WILLIAM J. LEONARD PROCLAIMING FEBRUARY 7 TO 13 AS "BOY SCOUT WEEK IN RIVERHEAD", IN OBSERVANCE OF THE 50TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE FOUNDING OF THE BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA.

MR. HOWARD LEVIN, CENTEREACH, N.Y., PRESIDENT, ATTENDED AUTOMATIC LAUNDRYMEN'S ASSOCIATION OF NASSAU & SUFFOLK COUNTY AND A GROUP OF INTERESTED PARTIES, APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD RELATIVE TO THE ADOPTION OF AN ORDINANCE WHICH WOULD REQUIRE AN ATTENDANT AT ALL TIMES AT AUTOMATIC LAUNDRY LOCATIONS.

MR. LEVIN STRESSED THE IMPORTANCE OF SUCH AN ORDINANCE DUE TO THE MANY HAZARDS AND DANGERS THAT EXIST AT AUTOMATIC LAUNDRY LOCATIONS THAT OPERATE WITHOUT ATTENDANTS SUCH AS FIRE, PILFERAGE, ELECTRIC SHOCK INJURIES TO MINOR CHILDREN AND OTHERS. HE HAD SEVERAL AUTOMATIC LAUNDRY MACHINE PARTS WITH HIM AND EXPLAINED TO THE BOARD WHAT WOULD HAPPEN SHOULD ANY OF THE PARTS MALFUNCTION.

MR. JOHN HOFFMANN, RIVERHEAD, OWNER OF AN AUTOMATIC LAUNDRY LOCATION IN RIVERHEAD APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD AND STATED THAT THERE WAS A BIG DIFFERENCE BETWEEN HOME WASHERS AND COMMERCIAL WASHERS AND DUE TO THE SIZE AND AMOUNT OF ELECTRIC CURRENT USED BY THE COMMERCIAL WASHERS THERE WAS NO QUESTION BUT THAT EVERY AUTOMATIC LAUNDRY LOCATION SHOULD HAVE AN ATTENDANT PRESENT, AT ALL TIMES IN THE INTEREST OF SAFETY.

MATTER REFERRED TO THE TOWN ATTORNEY.

THE TOWN BOARD CONVENED AS A BOARD OF AUDIT AND EXAMINED ALL BILLS TO DATE, THE TOTALS OF WHICH WAS AS FOLLOWS: GENERAL TOWN---\$3352.39 AND MACHINERY FUND---\$3733.58. ON MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY AND SECONDED BY JUSTICE ZALOGA, IT WAS RESOLVED THAT THE BILLS BE APPROVED AS RENDERED.
