

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Monday, July 16, 1928 at 7:30 P.M.

The minutes of the meeting of the Town Board, held June 27th., 1928 were read and on motion and vote approved.

A communication was read, received from Edward P. White, Town Clerk of the Town of Southampton, advising that the Town Board of Southampton did not contemplate appointing a dog catcher for the Town of Southampton.

A communication from Harry D. Sleight of Sag Harbor addressed to Supervisor Homan was read in regard to preparing and publishing the Town of Riverhead records in book form.

Mr. James KeHoe of Medford, addressed the Board and applied for the position of Dog Catcher or Dog Warden for the Town of Riverhead.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That James KeHoe be and he is hereby appointed Dog Catcher for the Town of Riverhead effective as of August 1st., 1928 for a period of twelve months.

Almon G. Rasquin addressed the Board and presented an application of Daniel R. Young to lay out a highway in the Town of Riverhead, about 360 feet west of Marcy Avenue from Cemetery Avenue to Parkway Street.

The dedication of a strip of land by Halsey Reeve to the Town of Riverhead, being presented, on motion duly made seconded and carried it is hereby RESOLVED That the Town Board hereby consent that the Town Superintendent of Highways make an order laying out the proposed highway about 360 feet west of Marcy Avenue, from Cemetery Avenue to Parkway Street, described in the application of Daniel R. Young, pursuant to Sections 191 and 192 of the Highway Law.

Mr. Charles Cowan, Mr. Leonard Grabowski and Mr. Smilo, merchants in the Post Office Block were present and requested the Town Board to extend the parking period in front of their places of business in the Post Office Block.

The Lighting Committee recommended that two street lights be installed on Marcy Avenue north of Cemetery Avenue and three street lights be installed on Sweezy Avenue, north of Cemetery Avenue within the Lighting District in the Town of Riverhead.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That the L. I. Lighting Company be notified to install two 80 C. P. street lights on Marcy Avenue, north of Cemetery Avenue and three 80 C. P. street lights on Sweezy Avenue, north of Cemetery Avenue, within the Lighting District in the Town of Riverhead.

A petition having been filed with the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead by Hubert F. Corwin, Ellis S. Duvall and George E. Luce as Water Commissioners of Riverhead Water District, dated June 28, 1928, from which it appears that an enlargement of the Riverhead Water District known as Roanoke Heights Enlargement has been granted and allowed by said Water Commissioners pursuant to Section 299A of the Town Law, and the said Town Board, having considered said application, and after due deliberation had, does hereby approve of the same to the effect that Riverhead Water District and the water supply system therein shall be enlarged in accordance with the petition filed with said Water Commissioners to include the following described additional territory:

Beginning at a point in the northerly boundary of the Riverhead Water District where said district boundary is intersected by the easterly boundary of land now or formerly Silas A. H. Dayton and running thence northward along said easterly boundary of the land of Dayton to its intersection with the northerly boundary of land now or formerly of Ellen Raynor; thence eastward along the said northerly boundary of the land of Raynor to the intersection of said northerly boundary or prolongation thereof with the westerly boundary of land now or formerly of Frank E. Peterson; thence northward along the said westerly boundary of the land of Peterson to the dividing line between the land of Peterson and land now or formerly of Eugene B. Fanning Estate; thence eastward along the said dividing line, prolonged eastward, 2,030 feet more or less to its intersection with the westerly boundary of land now or formerly of Roanoke Heights Development Corporation; thence northward along the said westerly boundary of the land

of Roanoke Heights Development Corporation to its intersection with the southerly line of Middle Road; thence northward in a straight line across Middle Road to the intersection of the northerly line of Middle Road with the dividing line between land now or formerly of Mrs. John E. Fanning and land now or formerly of Chauncey H. Young; thence northward along the last said dividing line to its intersection with a line parallel to the northerly line of Middle Road and six hundred (600) feet northerly therefrom measured at right angles thereto; thence eastward along said parallel line to its intersection with the dividing line between land now or formerly of William P. McCabe and land now of formerly of Frank McCabe; thence southward along the last said dividing line to its intersection with the northerly line of Middle Road; thence southward in a straight line across Middle Road to the intersection of the southerly line of Middle Road with the westerly boundary of other land now or formerly of Frank McCabe; thence southward along the said westerly boundary of the last said land of McCabe to its intersection with the dividing line between the land of McCabe and land now or formerly of Mrs. E. Danielson; thence southward along the westerly boundary of the land of Danielson, to its intersection with the northerly boundary of the Riverhead Water District or with the prolongation of said district boundary; thence westward along the said northerly boundary of the Riverhead Water District to its intersection with the aforesaid easterly boundary of the land of Silas A. H. Dayton, at the point or place of beginning.

There being no further business, the meeting Adjourned to meet August 1, 1928 at 7:30 P.M.
