

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, October 1, 1947 at 2:00 P.M.

Arthur H. Lundberg, Town Attorney and Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on September 17, 1947 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

Mr. Lester M. Emmett, Attorney and Mr. Seldon Heatley of Wading River addressed the Board and requested that Wading River be given a full time Police Patrolman and to allow the formation of a constabulary to be on call under the supervision of the Chief of Police and the Town Board.

A communication was read from the Suffolk County Civil Service Commission stating that their records indicate that Marion C. Worth, Part-time Junior Clerk has now earned more than \$700.00 and that there is a definite rule that part time positions must be positions that are for less than half time or less than \$700.00 per annum and if the Town Board wishes to make Mrs Worth a provisional appointment, it will be necessary to first canvass the junior clerk list. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved, that the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead request the Suffolk County Civil Service Commission to allow the retention of Mrs Marion C. Worth as part time Junior Clerk to help complete the extension of the Tax Roll until November 30, 1947, for the reason that she is familiar with the work. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

A communication was read from Mrs Fanny C. Schluer of Jamesport, N.Y. complaining that some one is dumping garbage on her property off of Peconic Bay Blvd. and asked the Board to do something about it. The communication was referred to the Town Dump Committee.

A communication was read from Joseph Greenberg requesting that a sidewalk be laid on East Ave. Ext. and Southern Blvd. The communication was referred to the Highway Committee and the Supt. of Highways.

A communication was read from the U.S. War Dept. stating that an application has been made by Mr. Everett C. DeFriest of 313-315 East Main St., Riverhead, N.Y. for a War Dept. permit to construct bulkheads and marine railways and to dredge in Peconic River at Riverhead and that any objections to the proposed work should be submitted to them prior to Oct. 6, 1947. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Leonard and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that the Long Island Lighting Company place one 80 C.P. Street lamp on Pole #3 on Southern Blvd. and one 80 C.P. street lamp on Pole #9 on East Avenue Extension in the Riverhead Lighting District. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

A communication was read from Supervisor Kelly to Tax Receiver Forrest Downs advising that he had received the sum of \$236.27 from the Tax Receiver for penalties in full of tax collections of the 1946-47 Tax Warrant. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Leonard and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved that ~~###~~ Supt. of Highways Young be authorized to lay approximately 400 feet of sidewalks on the East side of Roanoke Avenue and approximately 500 feet of sidewalk on Northville Turnpike in the Town of Riverhead. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town and Highway Machinery bills to date.

Pursuant to Section 111 of the Town Law, detailed estimates of the amount of revenues to be received and the amount of expenditures to be made during the next fiscal year for every administrative officer, board, department and commission of the Town of Riverhead was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote were ordered placed on file as follows:
