THE TOWN ATTORNEY REPORTED THAT HE WAS AWARE OF THIS MATTER

- (A) MORE RIGID ENFORCEMENT OF EXISTING ORDINANCES AND LAWS, SPECIFICALLY THE MULTIPLE DWELLING LAW AND THE FIRE PREVENTION ORDINANCE.
- (B) A BUILDING CODE.
- (C) A HOUSING CODE.
- (D) APPOINTMENT OF A HOUSING AUTHORITY.
- (E) ANY OTHER APPROPRIATE ACTION.

THE LEAGUE FEELS THAT SUCH A COMMITTEE COULD BE OF GREAT HELP TO THE BOARD IN SEARCHING FOR SOLUTIONS TO ONE OF RIVERHEAD'S GREATEST PROBLEMS." END.

THE TOWN CLERK WAS INSTRUCTED TO REPLY THAT THE MATTER WOULD BE GIVEN SERIOUS CONSIDERATION BY THE BOARD AT AN EXECUTIVE SESSION IN MAY.
