A COMMUNICATION DATED FEBRUARY 3, 1960 FROM THE LONG ISLAND LIGHTING COMPANY WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD ADVISING THAT IMPROVED STREET LIGHTING HAS BEEN INSTALLED IN THE EAST MAIN STREET PARKING AREA, AS PER PRIOR REQUEST OF THE BOARD.

THE ANNUAL REPORT OF THE FIRE DISTRICT TREASURER, WADING RIVER FIRE DEPARTMENT, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31, 1959, WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AND ORDERED FILED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED FEBRUARY 9, 1960 FROM MAJOR WILLIAM E. WHALEY, JR., OFFICER IN CHARGE OF THE STATE ARMORY IN RIVERHEAD, WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD INVITING MEMBERS OF THE TOWN BOARD AND THEIR FAMILIES TO "OPEN HOUSE" AT THE ARMORY ON SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 21, 1960.

A DISCUSSION WAS HELD RELATIVE TO THE INSTALLATION OF A TRAFFIC SIGNAL AT THE INTERSECTION OF ELTON STREET & ROANOKE AVENUE.

NO DECISION WAS REACHED ON THIS PROJECT.

IT WAS THE CONSENSUS OF THE BOARD THAT THE TOWN CLERK WRITE TO LITTLEFIELD-ALGER SIGNAL COMPANY AND HAVE THEM CHANGE THE TIME SETTING ON THE TRAFFIC LIGHT AT THE INTERSECTION OF PULASKI STREET AND ROANOKE AVENUE FROM THE PRESENT 30/30 SEC. RED TO GREEN INTERVAL TO 25/25 SEC. RED TO GREEN INTERVAL, IN THE HOPE THAT THE FLOW OF TRAFFIC WOULD BE SPEEDED UP AT THIS INTERSECTION.

JUSTICE ZALOGA OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BELL.

MODEL FX-400, STYLE D, AT A TOTAL NET COST OF \$6190.00, SUBJECT TO ITS BID AND SPECIFICATION FORM SUBMITTED AND FILED DATED FEBRUARY 10, 1960, AND

FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THIS PURCHASE IS SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE SUFFOLK COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, ABSENT. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

A DISCUSSION WAS HELD RELATIVE TO THE INSTALLATION OF CURBS AND GUTTERS ON THE S/S OF EAST MAIN STREET AT MORRELL & SMITH PROPERTY.

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY REPORTED THAT HE HAD INSPECTED THE SITE WITH OFFICIALS OF THE LONG ISLAND LIGHTING COMPANY AND IT WAS DECIDED AFTER INSPECTION THAT ALL THE ROADSIDE TREES AT THIS SITE WOULD HAVE TO BE TAKEN OUT BEFORE CERTAIN POLES WERE MOVED BACK BY THE LIGHTING COMPANY IN ORDER THAT SAID CURBS AND GUTTERS COULD BE PROPERLY INSTALLED.

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY STATED THAT HE WOULD CONTACT THE PROPERTY OWNERS RELATIVE TO THE REMOVAL OF SAID TREES AND REPORT AT THE NEXT MEETING OF THE BOARD.

A DISCUSSION WAS HELD RELATIVE TO THE ADOPTION OF A DOG ORDINANCE. ASSESSORS THOMAS DANOWSKI AND J. WILSON STOUT APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD AND STATED THAT DOG DAMAGE CLAIMS ARE INCREASING STEADILY AND THAT SOME SORT OF DOG ORDINANCE FOR THE CONTROL OF DOGS SHOULD BE ADOPTED.

TOWN ATTORNEY HARDING REPORTED THAT HE WAS OBTAINING COPIES OF DOG ORDINANCES AS ADOPTED BY OTHER TOWNSHIPS TO GUIDE HIM IN DRAFTING A SUITABLE DOG ORDINANCE TO PRESENT TO THE BOARD FOR APPROVAL OR DISAPPROVAL.

JUSTICE ZALOGA OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY.

RESOLVED THAT EDWARD A. SADOWSKI BE, AND HE IS HEREBY APPOINTED AS A CONSTABLE OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, TO SERVE AT THE PLEASURE OF THE TOWN BOARD AT NO ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, ABSENT. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

JUSTICE ZALOGA OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY.

WHEREAS ON FEBRUARY 2, 1960, SEALED BIDS WERE OPENED FOR TIRES FOR TOWN OWNED POLICE VEHICLES,

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, ABSENT. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

THE TOWN BOARD CONVENED AS A BOARD OF AUDIT AND EXAMINED ALL BILLS TO DATE, THE TOTALS OF WHICH WAS AS FOLLOWS: GENERAL TOWN---\$6,938.29 AND MACHINERY FUND---\$3,049.16. ON MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BELL, IT WAS RESOLVED THAT THE BILLS BE APPROVED AS RENDERED. THE VOTE--- COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, ABSENT. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

THERE BEING NO FURTHER BUSINESS ON MOTION AND VOTE, THE MEETING ADJOURNED TO MEET ON TUESDAY, MARCH 1, 1960 AT 9:30 A.M.
