

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held in the  
Town Office on Wednesday May 11th.1932 at 2 P.M.

Present:-

Raymond C. Welch, Town Superintendent of Highways  
was present.

The Board was advised that Supervisor Homan had been  
detained and on motion and vote Justice Burnside was  
appointed Chairman of the meeting until Supervisor Homan's  
arrival.

The minutes of the Town Board meeting of April 27,1932  
were read and on motion and vote adopted.

A communication was read from Charles O. Downs, former  
Superintendent of Highways advising that he had no highways  
books or other documents belonging to the Town of Riverhead.

The report of the Town Nurse, Miss Marion L. Jacobs,  
for the month of April 1932 was presented and ordered placed  
on file.

Supervisor Homan having arrived, Justice Burnside  
relinquished the temporary chairmanship and Supervisor Homan  
took charge of the meeting as Chairman, thanking Justice  
Burnside for having acted as Chairman.

Mr. Louis Klein, a merchant with a place of business on  
Railroad Avenue, Riverhead, addressed the Board, advising that  
the concern which peddles Good Humor ice cream throughout the  
Town, was taking business away from the local merchants and  
further advising that in his opinion this was unfair to the  
local merchants who pay rent or taxes in the Town of Riverhead  
and requesting that the Town Board take some action to curb  
this practise.

The question arose as to the authority of the Town Board  
to take steps to regulate the peddling of ice cream in the  
Town and the Board having been advised that some action had

by the Town Board of Huntington in a similar case, the Town Clerk was requested to communicate with the Town Clerk of Huntington requesting advice as to the action taken by the Town Board of the Town of Huntington.

On motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried it was Resolved That the Masonic Lodge of the Town of Riverhead be re-imbursed the sum of \$50.00 to help defray the expenses of the Town of Riverhead-George Washington Bi-Centennial Celebration which was held on March 11, 1932 under the supervision of the Masonic Lodge of Riverhead.

Mr. Theodore Sherry of South Jamesport, N.Y. addressed the Board requesting that he be allowed to install gasoline pipes and a pump on the Town Dock to be constructed at South Jamesport, to enable him to sell gasoline to the owners of boats coming to said dock. Mr. Sherry was advised to file a written application with the Town Board.

Whereas an application has been made by the Chairman of the unemployed relief committee for the approval of the Board for the employing of from 10 to 15 men sanding roads in the Village and Town of Riverhead under the supervision of the Town Superintendent of Highways and said application having been approved by the Town Superintendent of Highways, Now Therefore be it Resolved That this Board does hereby approve of the following work to be done under the supervision of the Superintendent of Highways, subject to the approval of the State Emergency Relief Administration:

Project No. 9.

Sanding roads in the Village and Town of Riverhead.

The Audited Bills Committee consisting of Justice Stackpole and Justice Frederick reported having investigated the matter referred to it relative to the recommending of an increase in the salary of Thomas E. Greene, Deputy Welfare Commissioner and were of the opinion that this Board should recommend to the Board of Supervisors of Suffolk County that said salary should be at the rate of \$1000.00 per year owing to the great increase of work connected with that office due to present economic conditions.

On motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried it was Resolved That this Board recommend to the Board of Supervisors of Suffolk County that the compensation of Thomas E.

Greene, as Deputy Welfare Commissioner be fixed at the rate of \$1000.00 per year for the period from May 1, 1932 to May 1st 1933 and be it further Resolved That a certified copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Board of Supervisors of Suffolk County.

On motion and vote it was decided to hold the next meeting of the Town Board on May 25, 1932 at 7:30 P.M.

There being no further business, on motion and vote the meeting adjourned.
