

Minutes of the meeting of the Town Board of the  
Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Clerk's Office, Tuesday  
September 12, 1905, at three o'clock P. M.

Present:

- John H. Hagen, Town Clerk

The following were designated as election places  
in said town:

- District No 1, Wading River Hall,
- " " 2, Town Hall,
- " " 3, Opera House,
- " " 4, Harmony Hall.

On motion, Lorimer Raynor was appointed Attendance  
Officer in and for the town of Riverhead, at a compensation  
of \$2.00 per day for actual services rendered, and \$.05  
per mile for each and every mile traveled.

The following act was presented and adopted:

An Act to license and regulate Public Hacks,  
Vehicles, Circuses, Shows, Venders, etc. in the Town of  
Riverhead.

The authority to pass this resolution is found in Chapter 332 of the Laws of 1890.

Sec. 1. On and after the 7th day of September, it shall not be lawful to drive any public Hack or Vehicle, or for any traveling circus or Show to exhibit or parade in the Town of Riverhead, until a license has been obtained from said Town Board.

Sec. 2. Such license for Hack or Vehicle to expire Sept. 12th, 1906, will be granted by the Town Board on payment of a fee of ten Dollars (\$10.)

License for circus or show, including street parade, to expire at midnight on the day for which such license is issued, will be granted on payment of such fee as three members of the Board shall deem just and proper.

Sec. 3. Any person violating the provisions of Sec. 1 and 2 of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be liable to a penalty of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

Clerk was instructed to have the resolution published in the County Review and Riverhead News for four weeks.

The following ordinance was presented and on motion adopted:

AN ACT to Regulate the Riding of Bicycles on the Sidesalks in theTown of Riverhead.

The authority to pass this resolution is found in Chap. 634 of the Laws of 1899.

Sec. 1. On and after the 25th day of September, 1905, it shall not be lawful for any person to ride a bicycle on any sidewalk in the town of Riverhead.

Sec. 2. The term "sidewalk" as herein used means any sidewalk laid out as such by the town or a village or by the owners of the abutting lands which is reserved by custom for the use of pedestrians, and which have been especially prepared for their use, but not including foot-paths or portions of public roads lying outside of the thickly settled parts of the town, which are worn only by travel and are not improved by the public authorities or by the abutting owners.

Sec. 3. Any person violating the provisions of this enactment shall be punished by a fine not exceeding the sum of Five dollars for each offense and in case of the nonpayment of such fine by imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding one day for each dollar of such a fine in the discretion of the Court or Magistrate.
