JUSTICE COSTELLO OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS
SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BELL.

RESOLVED THAT THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE SEWER DISTRICT
AND GENERAL TOWN HELD IN THE TOWN HALL ON TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 5,
1961 BE APPROVED AS SUBMITTED.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES,
JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD,
YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

SUPERVISOR'S REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF AUGUST 1961 WAS SUBMITTED
TO THE BOARD AND ORDERED PLACED ON FILE.

BARRY SINCLAIR AND HARRY EVERTSEN APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD.

BARRY SINCLAIR STATED:

"I WISH TO BRING BEFORE THE BOARD A VITAL MATTER
CONCERNING THE YOUTH OF THE TOWN. WE WOULD LIKE
TO ORGANIZE A DRUM AND BUGLE CORPS UNDER THE
DIRECTION OF OTTO NINNOW.

WE HAVE 21 INTERESTED MEMBERS AT PRESENT AND
THIS COULD CLIMB TO TWO AND THREE TIMES THAT
NUMBER.

THIS ORGANIZATION WOULD ENCOURAGE GOOD CITIZEN-
SHIP AND COULD REPRESENT THE TOWN AT VARIOUS
CIVIC FUNCTIONS.

WE NEED \$2600 INITIALLY TO BUY INSTRUMENTS AND
UNIFORMS AND WE ARE ASKING THE TOWN BOARD FOR
THIS AMOUNT. AFTER THAT, THE CORPS WOULD BE
SELF-SUPPORTING FROM ITS MEMBERSHIP DUES."

SUPERVISOR LEONARD ADVISED THE BOYS THAT HE WOULD ASK THE TOWN
ATTORNEY FOR A LEGAL OPINION AS TO WHETHER OR NOT THE BOARD COULD
AUTHORIZE FUNDS FOR THIS PURPOSE.

MR. CEDRIC LUCE APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD. HE STATED THAT HE HAD HEARD A RUMOR THAT THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT WAS GOING TO REGRADE SOUND AVENUE FROM MCKAYS, OFF OF WEST LANE, WEST TO PENNY'S ROAD, SO THAT ROAD WATER WOULD DRAIN INTO A HOLLOW ON MRS. WELLS PROPERTY, AND, IF SO, THAT IT WOULD BE A BIG MISTAKE.

SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS ZEMBKO STATED THAT THIS WAS NOT THE PLAN OF THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT. HE WAS PLANNING, HOWEVER, TO RESURFACE SOUND AVENUE FROM NORTHVILLE TURNPIKE TO PENNY'S ROAD DUE TO THE HEAVY TRUCK TRAFFIC AT THIS POINT.

COUNCILMAN BELL OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY.

RESOLVED THAT THE LONG ISLAND LIGHTING COMPANY BE AND IT IS HEREBY AUTHORIZED TO INSTALL IMPROVED STREET LIGHTING IN THE SOUTH JAMESPORT LIGHTING DISTRICT AND THE JAMESPORT LIGHTING DISTRICT, AS PER LONG ISLAND LIGHTING COMPANY SURVEY AND SKETCH, DATED AUGUST 14, 1961 AND FILED IN THE TOWN CLERK'S OFFICE ON AUGUST 15, 1961.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

MATTER REFERRED TO THE TOWN ATTORNEY.

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED SEPTEMBER 6, 1961 FROM THE STATE TRAFFIC COMMISSION WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD RELATIVE TO THE INSTALLATION OF A TRAFFIC SIGNAL AT THE INTERSECTION OF OSBORNE AVENUE AND COURT STREET.

THE STATE TRAFFIC COMMISSION ADVISED THAT IT HAD NO JURISDICTION OVER THE INTERSECTION BECAUSE NO STATE HIGHWAYS ARE INVOLVED.

THE TOWN CLERK WAS INSTRUCTED TO REQUEST THE LITTLEFIELD-ALGER SIGNAL COMPANY, ROCKVILLE CENTRE, N.Y., TO MAKE A SURVEY FOR THE INSTALLATION OF A TRAFFIC SIGNAL AT SAID INTERSECTION.

THE REPORT OF EXAMINATION OF THE ACCOUNTS AND FISCAL AFFAIRS OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD FOR THE PERIOD JANUARY 1, 1958 TO DECEMBER 31, 1960, WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AND ORDERED FILED.

TWO NOTICES OF PUBLIC HEARING RELATIVE TO AMENDMENTS TO THE BUILDING ZONE ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF BROOKHAVEN WERE SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AND ORDERED FILED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED SEPTEMBER 11, 1961 FROM THE LONG ISLAND LIGHTING COMPANY WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD STATING THEY HAD INSTALLED IMPROVED STREET LIGHTING ON 19TH STREET, WADING RIVER LIGHTING DISTRICT, AS PER PRIOR REQUEST OF THE BOARD.

A PETITION DATED SEPTEMBER 13, 1961 SIGNED BY NUMEROUS RESIDENTS ON OSPREY AVENUE AND SIGAL AVENUE, WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD.

THEY REQUESTED THAT AN INVESTIGATION BE MADE OF TRAFFIC CONDITIONS IN THIS AREA, THAT UNNECESSARY COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC BE RESTRICTED, THAT "CHILDREN AT PLAY" SIGNS BE POSTED, AND THAT A LOWER SPEED LIMIT BE CREATED.

MATTER REFERRED TO THE CHIEF OF POLICE.

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED SEPTEMBER 11, 1961 FROM MR. & MRS. CHARLIE CZUJKO, AQUEBOGUE, WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD REQUESTING THAT A ZONING PERMIT BE DENIED TO THE APPLICANT FOR A SLAUGHTER HOUSE ON EDGAR AVENUE, AQUEBOGUE.

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED SEPTEMBER 11, 1961 FROM THE JAMESPORT-SOUTH JAMESPORT CIVIC ASSOCIATION WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD IN OPPOSITION TO THE COUNTY "WET-LANDS PROJECT".

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED AUGUST 25, 1961 FROM MR. AL SIGAL, RIVERHEAD, WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD SUGGESTING MEANS TO EASE TRAFFIC CONDITIONS ON PECONIC AVENUE AND ROANOKE AVENUE.

MATTER REFERRED TO THE CHIEF OF POLICE.

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BELL.

RESOLVED THAT FRED NICHOLS, RIVERHEAD, BE AND HE IS HEREBY AUTHORIZED TO OPERATE THE REFRESHMENT STAND AT THE IRON PIER BEACH DURING THE OPERATION OF THE "GO-CART" PROGRAM, PROVIDED HE OBTAINS THE NECESSARY HEALTH DEPARTMENT PERMITS.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY REPORTED THAT HE HAD A CONFERENCE WITH EDWARD GOOZDA, PORT JEFFERSON, N.Y., RELATIVE TO THE PURCHASE BY THE TOWN OF A PARCEL OF LAND OWNED BY MR. GOOZDA, ADJACENT TO THE TOWN DUMP, AS ADDITIONAL TOWN LAND WAS NEEDED FOR DUMPING PURPOSES.

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY FURTHER REPORTED THAT MR. GOOZDA WAS WILLING TO SELL ABOUT 17 ACRES OF LAND, BUT THAT HE DID NOT WISH TO BE PAID FOR SAME IN ANY ONE YEAR, AND, FURTHER, THAT HE WOULD HAVE MORE CONFERENCES WITH MR. GOOZDA RELATIVE TO THIS MATTER.

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY PRESENTED A SCHEDULE OF SALARIES AND CLASSIFICATIONS FOR THE EMPLOYEES OF THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT.

AFTER DISCUSSION, SAID SCHEDULE WAS ORDERED FILED.

JUSTICE ZALOGA OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BELL.

RESOLVED THAT A SPECIAL MEETING OF THE TOWN BOARD BE HELD ON SEPTEMBER 28, 1961 AT 10 A.M. IN ORDER THAT THE BOARD MAY MEET WITH MR. GEORGE W. MOORE OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, AND FOR ANY OTHER BUSINESS THAT MAY COME BEFORE THE BOARD.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

AFTER BEING DULY ADVERTISED SEALED BID FOR FOUR (4) MOBILE RADIOS FOR USE OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT WAS OPENED AS FOLLOWS:

MATTER TABLED UNTIL THE NEXT MEETING.

A RESOLUTION DATED SEPTEMBER 18, 1961 FROM THE PLANNING BOARD WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

"WHEREAS A PUBLIC HEARING FOR THE APPROVAL OF A PLAT, SHOWING A REALTY SUBDIVISION, KNOWN AS "WOODLAND ACRES, SECTION III", LOCATED AT WADING RIVER, NEW YORK, FILED BY MR. CHARLES A. WOOD OF WADING RIVER, NEW YORK, WAS HELD ON SEPTEMBER 13, 1961, AT 7:30 P.M. BY THIS BOARD, AFTER ADVERTISEMENT IN THE NEWS-REVIEW PUBLISHED ON SEPTEMBER 7, 1961, AND
 WHEREAS, NO ONE APPEARED TO OBJECT OR TO PROTEST AGAINST APPROVING THE SUBDIVISION, AND

WHEREAS, THIS BOARD FINDS THE SUBDIVISION TO BE CONSISTENT WITH THE GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT OF THE TOWN IN THAT AREA, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THIS BOARD APPROVES THE PLAT FOR FILING IN THE OFFICE OF THE CLERK OF SUFFOLK COUNTY AND DIRECTS THE SECRETARY OF THIS BOARD TO AFFIX HIS SIGNATURE TO THE ENDORSEMENT PRESCRIBED BY THIS BOARD UPON THE PLAN UPON THE COMPLETION OF THE ROADS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CONSTRUCTION SPECIFICATIONS SET FORTH IN THE "RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE DEDICATION OF A PUBLIC HIGHWAY IN THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD", OR ALTERNATIVELY TO FURNISH MONIES TO THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1500 TO COVER THE ESTIMATED COST OF SAID ROAD IMPROVEMENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH AFORESAID SPECIFICATIONS, AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT A COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION BE FORWARDED TO THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD SO THAT THEY MAY ACCEPT THE AMOUNT AS SET FORTH BY THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD PLANNING BOARD AND HOLD SAME UNTIL NOTIFIED BY THE PLANNING BOARD THAT THE IMPROVEMENTS HAVE BEEN MADE TO THE BOARD'S SATISFACTION."

A CHECK IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1500 FROM CHARLES A. WOOD TO THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD WAS ALSO SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD.

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE ZALOGA.

WHEREAS, THE PLANNING BOARD HAS FIXED THE AMOUNT OF \$1500 TO COVER THE ESTIMATED COST OF REQUIRED ROAD IMPROVEMENTS IN REALTY SUBDIVISION KNOWN AS "WOODLAND ACRES, SECTION III" SITUATE AT WADING RIVER, N.Y., NOW, THEREFORE

BE IT RESOLVED, THAT A CASH BOND IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1500 BE ACCEPTED FROM CHARLES A. WOOD, WADING RIVER, TO COVER THE COST OF REQUIRED ROAD IMPROVEMENTS IN REALTY SUBDIVISION KNOWN AS "WOODLAND ACRES, SECTION III", SITUATE AT WADING RIVER, N.Y.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED SEPTEMBER 5, 1961 FROM THE AUXILIARY POLICE WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD STATING THAT ITS SERVICES HAVE BEEN SUSPENDED AS OF SEPTEMBER 16, 1961.

SOME OF THE REASONS GIVEN WERE:

1. LIMITED TRAINING PROGRAM
2. JEEP UNIT IN POOR CONDITION, DIRTY AND HARD RIDING
3. LACK OF PROGRAM THAT WOULD ENCOMPASS ALL DUTIES OF POLICE WORK.

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

AFTER DISCUSSION IT WAS SUGGESTED THAT A MEETING BE HELD WITH REPRESENTATIVES OF THE AUXILIARY POLICE, THE CHIEF OF POLICE, DETECTIVE PALMER, MEMBERS OF THE TOWN BOARD, A REPRESENTATIVE FROM C.D. HEADQUARTERS AND THE LIEUTENANT FROM THE SUFFOLK COUNTY POLICE ATTACHED TO THE AUXILIARY POLICE PROGRAM RELATIVE TO THIS MATTER.

SUPERVISOR LEONARD STATED THAT THE AUXILIARY POLICE HAVE PERFORMED EXCELLANT WORK FOR THE TOWN AND HE HOPED THAT THIS MATTER COULD BE WORKED OUT TO THE BENEFIT OF ALL CONCERNED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED SEPTEMBER 15, 1961 FROM MISS BETTY M. BLUE, RIVERHEAD, WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD REQUESTING THE INSTALLATION OF CURB AND GUTTERS ALONG FURTHER LANE AND DALY DRIVE IN RIVERHEAD, ADJOURNING HER PROPERTY.

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

JUSTICE ZALOGA OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY.

WHEREAS APPLICATION FOR CONSTRUCTION OF CURBS AND GUTTERS HAS BEEN MADE BY BETTY M. BLUE, FURTHER LANE, TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT CURBS AND GUTTERS SHALL BE CONSTRUCTED ALONG FURTHER LANE AND DALY DRIVE, ADJACENT TO THE PROPERTY OF BETTY M. BLUE, ALL PURSUANT TO A CONTRACT, THE FORM OF WHICH IS HERETO ANNEXED.

CONTRACT FOR CONSTRUCTION OF CURBS AND GUTTERS

TOWN HIGHWAYS

THIS AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, AND BETTY M. BLUE, OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, ADJACENT PROPERTY OWNER.

THE TERMS OF THIS AGREEMENT ARE AS FOLLOWS:

1. THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD AGREES TO CONSTRUCT CURBS AND GUTTERS ALONG FURTHER LANE AND DALY DRIVE, TOWN HIGHWAYS IN THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD.
2. THE GRADES AND LINES WILL BE ESTABLISHED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS.
3. THE MATERIALS WILL BE DELIVERED AND THE LABOR PERFORMED AT TIMES AND IN A FORM AND MANNER SPECIFIED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS.
4. THE TIME AND COMMENCEMENT AND COMPLETION OF THE WORK SHALL BE DETERMINED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS.
5. ALL LABOR USED AND ALL METERIALS FURNISHED SHALL CONFORM TO NEW YORK STATE SPECIFICATIONS.
6. THE REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE OF THE CURBS AND GUTTERS SHALL BE THE OBLIGATION OF THE TOWN.
7. THE ADJACENT PROPERTY OWNER, IN CONSIDERATION OF THESE PRESENTS AND OTHER CONSIDERATIONS HEREIN PERFORMED AND TO BE PERFORMED BY SAID TOWN, DOES HEREWITH PAY TO THE SAID TOWN THE FOLLOWING SUM:

WHICH IS THE SUM TO REIMBURSE THE TOWN FOR THE COST OF THE MATERIALS.

STANDARD B & P "N"

THAT THE EXPENSE TO THE TOWN SHALL NOT EXCEED THE SUM OF \$250.00.

THAT THE SUPERVISOR BE AUTHORIZED TO SIGN THE SAID CONTRACT IN BEHALF OF THE TOWN WHEN THE MONEY TO BE PAID BY SAID BETTY M. BLUE IS TURNED OVER AND THE CONTRACT HAS BEEN SIGNED BY THEM, AND THEN

THAT THE SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS BE DIRECTED TO PERFORM THE WORK.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

THE TOWN BOARD CONVENED AS A BOARD OF AUDIT AND EXAMINED ALL BILLS TO DATE, THE TOTAL OF WHICH WAS AS FOLLOWS: GENERAL TOWN---\$10,889.86 AND MACHINERY FUND---\$898.21. ON MOTION MADE BY JUSTICE ZALOGA AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, IT WAS RESOLVED THAT THE BILLS BE APPROVED AS RENDERED. THE VOTE--- COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES, THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

THERE BEING NO FURTHER BUSINESS ON MOTION AND VOTE, THE MEETING ADJOURNED TO MEET ON THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 28, 1961 AT 10 A.M. FOR A SPECIAL MEETING AND ON TUESDAY, OCTOBER 3, 1961 AT 9:30 A.M. FOR A REGULAR MEETING.
