X COUNCILMAN BELL OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY.

WHEREAS, AN ERROR WAS MADE CERTIFYING THE ASSESSED VALUATION OF FORMER SCHOOL DISTRICT No. 5 AND FORMER SCHOOL DISTRICT No. 8,

UPON WHICH THE 1960-61 TAX FOR THE PURPOSE OF MEETING SPECIFIC PAYMENTS ON BONDED INDEBTEDNESS STILL OBLIGED BY EACH OF THE DISTRICTS ABOVE MENTIONED WAS LEVIED. AS A RESULT OF CERTIFYING AN ERRONEOUS VALUATION FOR EACH DISTRICT, AN EXCESS SUM WAS LEVIED ON THE 1960-61 TAX ROLL AS FOLLOWS:

FORMER SCHOOL DISTRICT 5 -- \$325.16

FORMER SCHOOL DISTRICT 8 -- \$372.83

WHEREAS THERE WAS AN ACCUMULATED SUM OF \$702.96 IN THE TOTAL AMOUNT LEVIED ON THE 1960-61 TAX ROLL IN EXCESS OF THE AMOUNT OF THE TAX WARRANT SUBSEQUENT TO THE COMPLETION OF THE TAX LEVY ON THE 1960-61 TAX ROLL, CERTAIN ADJUSTMENTS AUTHORIZED BY RESOLUTIONS OF THE SUFFOLK COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS TOTALING \$259.42 WERE MADE BY THE RECEIVER OF TAXES OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, LEAVING A TOTAL OF \$461.54 EXCESS OVER THE TOTAL AMOUNT COVERED BY THE TAX WARRANT AT THE FINAL AUDIT. THE EXCESS OF \$461.54 WILL BE CREDITED TO THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD BY THE COUNTY OF SUFFOLK AND WILL BE REFLECTED IN THE 1961-62 COUNTY TAX EQUALIZED TO THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD. ANNEXED HERETO UNDER SCHEDULE "A" IN THE VALUATION OF EACH DISTRICT, CERTIFIED TAX RATE AND THE SUMS REQUIRED TO BE REFUNDED TO EACH DISTRICT.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT THE SUM OF \$697.99 BE LEVIED AS A GENERAL TOWN TAX ITEM ON THE 1961-62 ASSESSMENT ROLL AND THE AMOUNT SO LEVIED BE CREDITED TO CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT No. 2 AND SAID AMOUNT BE DISBURSED AS THE SAME TIME LIKE FUNDS ARE DISBURSED.

RESOLVED THAT A BUS FRANCHISE BE AND IT IS HEREBY GRANTED TO HENRY W. ADELWERTH AND VITUS F. ADELWERTH, AS CO-PARTNERS, DOING BUSINESS UNDER THE FIRM NAME AND STYLE OF THE BLUE LINE,

FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THIS BUS FRANCHISE SHALL BE FOR THE TERM OF TEN (10) YEARS AND THAT THE FEE FOR THE FRANCHISE RIGHT AND CONSENT HEREBY GRANTED SHALL BE THE SUM OF \$25.00 PER YEAR,

PAYABLE ANNUALLY IN ADVANCE, EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 1962.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, ABSENT. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

TOWN ATTORNEY HARDING PRESENTED A COMMUNICATION TO THE BOARD FROM SUPERVISOR LEONARD AS FOLLOWS:

TOWN BOARD MEMBERS:

"I HAVE HAD THE OPPORTUNITY TO GO OVER THE PROPOSED BUDGET FOR THE YEAR 1962, AS PRESENTED BY THE VARIOUS HEADS OF OUR TOWN DEPARTMENTS. AS I WILL BE ATTENDING A COUNTY OFFICIALS MEETING AND UNABLE TO BE PRESENT, IT SHOULD BE NOTED THAT I AM NOT IN FAVOR OF THE OVER ALL PROPOSED BUDGET.

THE GENERAL TOWN BUDGET APPEARS TO BE LOWER AND WILL RESULT IN A LOWERTAX RATE. VARIOUS ITEMS IN HIGHWAY BUDGET APPEAR TO HAVE BEEN INCREASED OUT OF PROPORTION. STATEMENTS WERE MADE THAT THE BUDGET COULD BE AND SHOULD BE DECREASED BY THE PRESENT SUPERINTENDENT AND HIS ASSOCIATES.

WITH A TREMENDOUS LOSS IN INCOME PARTICULARLY IN THE FARMING AREAS, IT IS IMPERATIVE THAT EVERY EFFORT SHOULD BE MADE TO KEEP OUR TOWN AND HIGHWAY TAX RATE AS LOW AS POSSIBLE.

TOWN ATTORNEY HARDING STATED THAT HE HAD BEEN REQUESTED BY SUPERVISOR LEONARD TO PRESENT SAID COMMUNICATION AFTER THE VOTE ON THE PRELIMINARY BUDGET PROVIDED CERTAIN HIGHWAY ITEMS WERE NOT REDUCED AND THAT THE BOARD STILL HAD THE OPPORTUNITY TO REDUCE CERTAIN ITEMS AFTER THE PUBLIC HEARING ON THE BUDGET.

THE TOWN BOARD CONVENED AS A BOARD OF AUDIT AND EXAMINED ALL TOWN BILLS TO DATE, THE TOTAL OF WHICH WAS AS FOLLOWS: GENERAL TOWN---\$2,871.40. ON MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY AND SECONDED BY JUSTICE ZALOGA, IT WAS RESOLVED THAT THE BILLS BE APPROVED AS RENDERED. THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, ABSENT. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.
