

MINUTES OF A SPECIAL MEETING OF THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD CALLED BY THE SUPERVISOR UPON WRITTEN REQUEST OF COUNCILMAN BELL, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY AND JUSTICE COSTELLO, HELD IN THE TOWN HALL ON TUESDAY, OCTOBER 10, 1961 AT 9:30 A.M.

ALSO PRESENT: JACOB HARDING, TOWN ATTORNEY AND THADDEUS ZEMBKO, SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS.

JUSTICE COSTELLO MADE REFERENCE TO SECTION 112 OF THE TOWN LAW AND STATED THAT THE PRELIMINARY BUDGET SHOULD BE ADOPTED BETWEEN THE 5TH AND 10TH DAY OF OCTOBER, REGARDLESS OF THE FACT THAT PRIOR PRELIMINARY BUDGETS WERE ADOPTED ON VARIOUS OTHER DATES.

TOWN ATTORNEY HARDING STATED THAT IT WAS HIS OPINION THAT THE PRELIMINARY BUDGET ADOPTED ON OCTOBER 3RD BY THE TOWN BOARD WAS NOT INVALID.

JUSTICE COSTELLO OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BELL.

RESOLVED THAT THE PURPORTED RESOLUTION OF OCTOBER 3, 1961, ADOPTING A PRELIMINARY BUDGET AND SETTING A PUBLIC HEARING FOR ADOPTION OF THE ANNUAL BUDGET ON NOVEMBER 9, 1961, BE DEEMED NULL AND VOID AND NOT HAVING BEEN ADOPTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH LAW.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, NO, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, NO. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY PRESENTED THE FOLLOWING WRITTEN COMMUNICATION TO THE TOWN BOARD.

"MR. SUPERVISOR, FOR THE RECORD, I WOULD LIKE TO REPORT AS FOLLOWS: YOU WERE NOT PRESENT WHEN WE CONSIDERED THE BUDGET LAST TUESDAY. WE DID NOT KNOW WHAT YOUR FEELINGS WERE ON THE SUBJECT. I GUESS YOU EXPECTED US TO TENTATIVELY APPROVE THE BUDGET THAT YOU HAD YOURSELF CALLED US TO CONSIDER, BECAUSE AFTER WE TENTATIVELY APPROVED IT, MR. HARDING TOLD US HE HAD A LETTER FROM YOU TO US, WHICH HE HAD BEEN DIRECTED BY YOU TO GIVE TO US AFTER WE APPROVED THE BUDGET.

IN THAT LETTER WE WERE VERY MUCH SURPRIZED TO FIND THAT YOU WERE OPPOSED TO THE BUDGET. IF THIS LETTER HAD BEEN DELIVERED TO US AT THE START OF THE MEETING, WHEN IT PROPERLY SHOULD HAVE BEEN GIVEN TO US, WE MIGHT HAVE BEEN INCLINED TO REDUCE A NUMBER OF THE ITEMS IN THE GENERAL BUDGET.

WE CONSIDER THAT MANY OF THE ITEMS IN YOUR PART OF THE BUDGET COULD BE REDUCED. THOSE ITEMS DO NOT HAVE TO BE SPENT, AND WHOEVER IS SUPERVISOR CAN BE AS ECONOMICAL AS HE DESIRES.

AS WE CONSIDERED THE ITEMS, MR. ZALOGA APPEARED TO BE QUITE IN ACCORD WITH ALL OF THEM, AND WE WERE QUITE SURPRISED TO FIND THAT, WHEN HE HAD THE OPPORTUNITY TO VOTE LAST, THAT HE VOTED "NO". I SUPPOSE THIS TIME ALSO, YOU WILL ASK THE REPUBLICAN MEMBERS TO VOTE FIRST, AND THE DEMOCRATIC MEMBERS TO VOTE LAST.

HOWEVER, SINCE YOU AND JUDGE ZALOGA HAVE CHOSEN TO MAKE A POLITICAL ISSUE OF THE BUDGET, I THINK WE SHOULD GO OVER EACH ITEM AND SEE WHAT EACH MEMBER THINKS OF IT. THEORETICALLY WE ARE ALL SUPPOSED TO BENEFIT BY THE OPINIONS EXPRESSED BY EACH MEMBER.

IF IT IS YOUR INTENTION TO REFUSE TO PASS A BUDGET, BECAUSE YOU FEEL YOU COULD OBTAIN SOME POLITICAL ADVANTAGE, THAT IS YOUR PRIVILEGE. HOWEVER, I DO NOT INTEND TO HAVE ALL BUSINESS OF THE TOWN CEASE JUST BECAUSE NO BUDGET IS PASSED. WE CAN NOT VERY WELL GET ALONG WITHOUT WATER, OR SEWER, OR POLICE PROTECTION, OR HIGHWAY CARE. WE NEED TO PASS A BUDGET, AND IT NEEDS TO BE REASONABLE.

I WAS ONE OF THOSE WHO ASKED YOU TO CALL THIS MEETING. I NOTICE THE NEWSPAPERS REPORT YOU SAY THAT IT IS A "TECHNICALITY" AND "SPLITTING HAIRS" TO CALL THIS MEETING. BY THIS TIME YOU SHOULD HAVE LEARNED THAT THE TOWN BOARD HAS ONLY THE AUTHORITY AND POWERS GIVEN TO IT BY LAW, AND IF THE LAW REQUIRES THAT THE PRELIMINARY BUDGET BE APPROVED BETWEEN OCT. 5TH AND OCT. 10TH, THAT IS THE ONLY TIME IT CAN LEGALLY BE DONE. IT MAKES NO DIFFERENCE HOW MANY BUDGETS YOU MAY HAVE PASSED ILLEGALLY IN FORMER YEARS.

YOU CALLED FOR THE MEETING ON OCTOBER 3RD, AND YOU SET UP THE AGENDA THAT THE PRELIMINARY BUDGET HAD TO BE APPROVED AT THAT TIME. THE TOWN BOARD PAYS A TOWN ATTORNEY. WE LEFT IT TO YOU AND HIM TO SEE THAT THE PROCEDURES REQUIRED BY LAW WERE FOLLOWED. IF WE CAN NOT RELY UPON THE TOWN ATTORNEY TO GIVE US CORRECT AND IMPARTIAL INFORMATION ON THE LAW, THEN I BELIEVE IT IS TIME FOR US TO OBTAIN COUNSEL WHO CAN PROPERLY ADVISE US.

I SUGGEST WE PROCEED WITH THE ITEMS IN THE PROPOSED BUDGET. "

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

A GENERAL DISCUSSION WAS HELD RELATIVE TO THE DETAILED ESTIMATES SUBMITTED BY THE RESPECTIVE BOARDS AND DEPARTMENTS.

MR. J. LEO SAXSTEIN APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD AND STATED THAT VARIOUS ITEMS IN THE BUDGET SHOULD BE MORE SPECIFICALLY ITEMIZED TO REFLECT A TRUER PICTURE OF THE EXPENDITURE.

HE ALSO MENTIONED THAT MONEY SHOULD NOT BE SPENT FOR RECREATION PARTICULARLY ADULT RECREATION, IN A YEAR WHEN FARMERS WERE RECEIVING \$1.00 FOR THEIR POTATOES.

HE ALSO OBJECTED TO THE ITEM IN THE BUDGET "COMPREHENSIVE PLAN" UNDER PLANNING BOARD. HE FELT THIS WAS A WASTE OF MONEY.

MRS. RITA SIMANDL, MRS. MILES FAIRLEY AND MR. JOHN BENEDICT, REPRESENTING THE RECREATION COMMISSION, APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD AND EXPLAINED THE VARIOUS ITEMS IN THE RECREATION DEPARTMENT BUDGET AND REQUESTED THAT THIS BUDGET BE APPROVED AS SUBMITTED.

MR. WILLIAM BUZ APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD AND STATED THAT SALARIES SHOULD BE KEPT AT A DECENT LEVEL IN ORDER THAT CAPABLE PEOPLE BE ATTRACTED TO HOLD TOWN JOBS.

MR. ROBERT STIVERS APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD AND STATED THAT THE BUDGET SHOULD BE ADOPTED IN FULL AS IT WAS ON OCTOBER 3RD, AS HE FELT THAT THE TOWNSPEOPLE WOULD ACCEPT IT.

MRS. ROBERT TORMEY, CHAIRMAN OF THE ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD AND STATED THAT ASIDE FROM THE SALARIES OF THE CHAIRMAN AND CONSULTANT OF THE PLANNING BOARD, SHE WOULD STRONGLY OBJECT IF MEMBERS OF THE PLANNING BOARD RECEIVED MORE SALARY THAN MEMBERS OF THE ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS, AS SHE FELT THAT THE ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS DOES AS MUCH WORK AS THE PLANNING BOARD.

MEMBERS OF THE BOARD WERE POLLED ON VARIOUS ITEMS IN THE BUDGET AND SEVERAL APPROPRIATIONS WERE REDUCED INCLUDING \$3000. IN THE RECREATION DEPARTMENT BUDGET.

THE SUPERVISOR RECESSED THE MEETING SEVERAL TIMES SO THAT THE BOARD MEMBERS COULD HAVE LUNCH AND DINNER.

COUNCILMAN BELL OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE PRELIMINARY BUDGET OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 1962 BE APPROVED AND FILED IN THE OFFICE OF THE TOWN CLERK, AT RIVERHEAD, NEW YORK, AND MADE AVAILABLE FOR INSPECTION BY ANY INTERESTED PERSON AT ALL REASONABLE HOURS.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD WILL MEET AND REVIEW SAID PRELIMINARY BUDGET AND HOLD A PUBLIC HEARING THEREON AT THE ROANOKE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL AUDITORIUM ON ROANOKE AVENUE, THAT AT SUCH HEARING ANY PERSON MAY BE HEARD IN FAVOR OF OR AGAINST ANY ITEM THEREIN CONTAINED.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, No, JUSTICE COSTELLO, No, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, No. THE RESOLUTION WAS DEFEATED FOR LACK OF AFFIRMATIVE VOTE OF THE MAJORITY OF THE BOARD.

JUSTICE ZALOGA STATED THAT HE WOULD VOTE FOR THE ADOPTION OF THE BUDGET IF THE \$3000. CUT FROM THE RECREATION DEPARTMENT

BUDGET WAS PUT BACK, AND IF THE PUBLIC HEARING WAS HELD AFTER ELECTION DAY TO ALLOW THE JUSTICE ELECTED TO VOTE ON THE 1962 BUDGET.

JUSTICE COSTELLO STATED THAT THE RECREATION PROGRAM SHOULD BE CURTAILED BUT THAT HE WOULD COMPROMISE AND PUT THE \$3000. CUT FROM THE RECREATION DEPARTMENT BUDGET BACK IN.

HE FURTHER STATED THAT HE FELT THE PUBLIC HEARING ON THE BUDGET SHOULD BE HELD BEFORE ELECTION DAY AS THE PUBLIC SHOULD BE ALLOWED TO BE HEARD PRIOR TO ELECTION DAY.

SUPERVISOR LEONARD OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE COSTELLO.

RESOLVED THAT THE TOWN BOARD DOES HEREBY PREPARE AND APPROVE AS THE PRELIMINARY BUDGET OF THIS TOWN FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING ON THE 1ST DAY OF JANUARY, 1962, AND ENDING DECEMBER 31ST, 1962, THE ITEMIZED STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES HERETO ATTACHED AND MADE A PART OF THIS RESOLUTION, AND BE IT

FURTHER RESOLVED THAT SUCH PRELIMINARY BUDGET SHALL BE FILED IN THE OFFICE OF THE TOWN CLERK WHERE IT SHALL BE AVAILABLE FOR PUBLIC INSPECTION BY ANY INTERESTED PERSON AT ALL REASONABLE HOURS, AND BE IT

FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THIS BOARD SHALL MEET AT 8 P. M. ON THE 6TH DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1961, AT THE TOWN HALL, RIVERHEAD, N. Y., FOR THE PURPOSE OF HOLDING A PUBLIC HEARING UPON SUCH PRELIMINARY BUDGET,

FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THE TOWN CLERK GIVE DUE NOTICE OF SUCH PUBLIC HEARING IN THE MANNER PROVIDED IN SECTION 113 OF THE TOWN LAW, AND THAT SUCH NOTICE BE PUBLISHED IN SUBSTANTIALLY THE FOLLOWING FORM:
