

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Wednesday, June 8, 1932 at 7:30 P.M.

Raymond S. Welch, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

The minutes of the meeting of the Town Board held May 25, 1932 were read and on motion and vote adopted.

The report of Miss Marion L. Jacobs, Town Nurse, for the month of May 1932 was presented and ordered placed on file.

A communication from the Riverhead Town Planning Board was read, requesting that the Town Board take action to make available, funds, in order that said Planning Board may proceed with the work of planning the Town and make immediately available the sum of \$1,000.00 as provided for its uses in the original resolution creating the said Planning Board.

On motion by Justice Stackpole, it was Resolved That the Riverhead Town Planning Board be authorized to engage an engineer to complete the work of planning and zoning the Town as outlined in the report of Ernest P. Goodrich as submitted to the Town Board in October 1931, at a price of not exceeding the sum of \$11,880.00. This resolution was not seconded.

On motion by Justice Rubenstein, seconded by Justice Stackpole, it was Resolved That the Riverhead Town Planning Board be discharged:

Supervisor Homan thereupon declared that the resolution had not been carried.

On motion duly made and seconded it was Resolved That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow upon certificates of indebtedness, the sum of One Thousand Dollars, as appropriated for the expenses of the Riverhead Town Planning Board, at a meeting held July 28, 1931.

The resolution was thereupon declared carried.

Justice Rubenstein announced that owing to his illness, the Highway Committee and the committee appointed to draw up ordinances regulating the peddling in the Town, had not been able to meet.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor's annual report for the year 1931 be printed in one issue of each of the two local papers.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That this Board does hereby approve of the renting of a room in the building owned by John H. Benjamin Estate, Inc., for Police Headquarters for a period of one year, at a monthly rental of \$35.00 per month for the first six months and at a monthly rental of \$40.00 per month for the next six months.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried the following ordinances was duly adopted and ordered published in three issues of each of the two local papers:

" It shall be unlawful for any person to set off at any time any firecrackers whatever on the public highways in the Town of Riverhead, and it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to build bonfires or set off any fireworks on the public high-

ways in the said Town of Riverhead at any time. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punished in a case of conviction by a fine not exceeding \$50.00 or imprisonment in the county jail for a term not exceeding six months or by both such fine and imprisonment".

The authority to pass this ordinance is found in Article 2 of the Public Health Laws of the State of N.Y.

There being no further business, on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on June 29, 1932 at 7:30 P.M.
