

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on January 14, 1964 at 10:30 A.M.

Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Zaloga. RESOLVED, That the minutes of a Special Meeting of the Town Board held in the Town Hall on December 30, 1964, be approved as submitted.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Zaloga. RESOLVED, That the minutes of the meeting of the Town Board held in the Town Hall on January 2nd, 1964 be approved as corrected.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A communication dated January 9, 1964 from the Planning Board was submitted to the Board relative to the petition of Donald S. Cohen, Mitchell D. Smith and Abe R. Druss for an amendment to the Zoning Ordinance.

Said communication stated in part as follows:

"NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That this Board does recommend to the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead the change from Business 3 Use District to Business 1 Use District for the area as shown on the map accompanying the petition of Donald S. Cohen, Mitchell D. Smith and Abe R. Druss, dated December 2, 1963, provided that the petitioners covenant with the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead that the land which they own within the proposed area to be changed be restricted from erecting any single family residences and two family residences thereon, which said provision will allow for a transition from Business 3 Use District in which no residences are permitted to the Business 1 Use District in which all types of residences are permitted." (End).

Communication ordered filed.

Attorney George L. Cruser appeared before the Board and requested the Board to call a Public Hearing on the petition of Donald S. Cohen, Mitchell D. Smith and Abe R. Druss, relative to an amendment to Town Ordinance No. 26, Zoning Ordinance, Town of Riverhead.

Councilman Young offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Zaloga.

Pursuant to Section 265 of the Town Law and Article V, Section 501 of the "Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York" being Town Ordinance No. 26 of the Town of Riverhead, a public hearing will be held by the Riverhead Town Board at the Town Hall, Roanoke Avenue and Second Street, Riverhead, New York, on February 4, 1964, at 11:00 A. M. o'clock on a proposal to amend the "Zoning Map of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York."

By changing from "Business 3" Use District to "Business 1" Use District a parcel of land, bounded as follows:

BEGINNING at a point on the westerly line of Roanoke Avenue, which said point is formed by the intersection of the division-line between the lands of Clarence Anderson and now or formerly of Louis Stakey and Raymond L'Hommedieu with the westerly line of Roanoke Avenue, and running thence from said point of beginning southerly along the westerly line of Roanoke Avenue 300 feet; thence westerly on a line parallel to the northerly line of Old Country Road 1047.29 feet to the land of Clarence Anderson thence northerly along the easterly line of land of Clarence Anderson to a point distant 1050 feet as measured at right angles to the northerly line of Old Country Road thence easterly and northerly along the lines of the Farm 1 Use District to the Business 1 Use District thence easterly along the Business 1 Use District to the westerly line of Roanoke Avenue thence southerly along the westerly line of Roanoke Avenue 250 feet, more or less, to the point or place of beginning.

A communication from Cobb and Floyd, Attorneys at Law, Amityville, N. Y., dated Dec. 19, 1963, relative to Claim of Bernard Langhorne was read.

Communication was ordered filed and referred to Shepard Scheinberg, Town Attorney and Justice Thomas R. Costello.

A copy of Petition signed by many taxpayers of the Town of Riverhead, original of which was forwarded to Austin M. Sarr, Dist. Engineer, State Dept. of Public Works, Babylon, N. Y., requesting survey of Traffic conditions and control on Route 25, east and west, in the Town of Riverhead was submitted to the Board.

Communication was ordered filed.

A communication from the Board of Education, Central School District No. 2, Riverhead, N. Y., comprising of a resolution was read as follows:

"WHEREAS; The school population is expanding rapidly and the facilities to handle this increase are extremely limited.

and WHEREAS: the new proposed Mobile Home Parks can do nothing but aggravate this situation.

and WHEREAS: Riverhead Town is the first town from the western end of Long Island where these Parks can be readily established due to Nassau County and western Suffolk Town zoning regulations.

BE IT RESOLVED: That the Board of Education of Central School District No. 2, Towns of Riverhead, Southampton and Brookhaven, Riverhead, New York, does hereby request that the Riverhead Town Board amend its Zoning Ordinance so that it is in agreement with its western neighbors and further request that this action be undertaken as soon as possible.

Unanimously adopted this tenth day of December, 1963."

Communication ordered filed, and referred to the Riverhead Town Planning Board for study and report.

A communication from the Town of Riverhead Zoning Board of Appeals, reading in part, "That due to an increasing number of requests the Zoning Board of Appeals is receiving for the establishment of trailer parks, that it is the opinion of the Zoning Board that legislative action be taken to minimize the area in which camps and mobile home parks may be established and to provide stricter criteria under which the Board may judge an application," was submitted to the Board.

Communication ordered filed.

A communication from Alden W. Young, dated January 13, 1964, relative to "Recharge Basin for Highway Drainage Project No. 28, Doctor's Path, Aquebogue, N. Y.," outlining estimated cost of construction for said project was read.

Communication ordered filed.

A communication dated January 10, 1964, from the Town of Brookhaven, containing Notice of Hearing on Upzoning Mount Sinai "B" Res. to "A", was read.

Communication ordered filed.

A communication from Althea Lindau, tendering her resignation as temporary, part-time clerk-typist in the Highway Department, effective November 22, 1963, was read.

Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Grodski.

RESOLVED, That the resignation of Althea Lindau, as Part-time Clerk-Typist in the Highway Department, effective as of November 22, 1963, be and is hereby accepted.

A communication from Robert W. Miner, tendering his resignation as Assistant Recreation Director for the Town of Riverhead, effective January 19, 1964, was read.

The communications of Althea Lindau and Robert W. Miner were ordered placed on file.

Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Grodski.

RESOLVED, That the resignation of Robert W. Miner as Assistant Recreation Director for the Town of Riverhead, be and is hereby accepted, effective January 19, 1964, and

FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Board hereby commends the said Robert W. Miner with sincere appreciation for the untiring and conscientious efforts which he has rendered to the Town of Riverhead Recreation Program as Assistant Recreation Director, and

FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Board extend to Robert W. Miner, good wishes for success in his new position with the Village of Rockville Centre.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A communication from Anthony F. Gadzinski, Insurance Agent, dated January 10, 1964, calling attention to the Queen Insurance Co. of America Policy No. QKF199164, effective January 15, 1964 to January 15, 1969, presently billed to the Town for \$494.58. Mr. Gadzinski offered coverage in a mutual company at a premium of \$420.30, affecting a saving of \$74.19 to the town.

Communication was ordered filed.

A discussion on Town Insurance was entered into by the Town Board. The question as to what procedure to follow to affect greater benefits and savings on premiums in all town departments was resolved as follows:

That all Insurance of the Town be examined by an Insurance Survey Group for comprehensive study and report.

The Town Clerk was directed to acknowledge the communication of Anthony F. Gadzinski and to express to him the appreciation of the Town Board for his continued and conscientious interests in behalf of the Town of Riverhead.

A communication from William L. Miller and Son, relative to Queen Insurance Co. of America Policy No. QKF199167 in the amount of \$60,000 coverage on the new Riverhead Town Police Headquarters, replacing binders originally effective when building was acquired on October 17, 1963, was read. The communication outlined that Company Engineers made an inspection and evaluation of the property and that a report was submitted to Police Chief Grodski.

The communication was ordered filed and referred to the Insurance Survey Group.

At 11:00 A. M. Notice of Public Hearing and affidavit of posting was read and submitted to the Board relative to the establishment of Extension No. 3 of the Riverhead Lighting District, in the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York.

Proof of publication of notice of public hearing and affidavit of posting ordered filed.

Supervisor Vojvoda declared the Hearing open to anyone wishing to be heard in favor of or objecting to this proposed establishment of Extension No. 3 of the Riverhead Lighting District.

No one wishing to be heard in favor of or in opposition to the establishment of Extension No. 3 of the Riverhead Lighting District, and no communications relative thereto having been received, Supervisor Vojvoda declared the Hearing closed.

Councilman Young offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Grodski.

The petition in this matter, together with the necessary map attached thereto, having been filed with the Town Board and an Order having been duly adopted by said Board on December 17, 1963, calling for a hearing of all persons interested in the matter on the 14th day of January, 1964, at 11:00 o'clock in the forenoon, at the Town Hall, 220 Roanoke Avenue, Riverhead, New York, and a hearing having been duly held at such time and place and it having been duly resolved and determined at such hearing that the petition was duly signed and acknowledged as required by law and was otherwise sufficient and the Town Board having determined that it is in the public interest to grant the relief sought, and the Town Board having further determined in the affirmative;

(a) That the petition complies with the requirements of Section 191 of the Town Law as to sufficiency of signers according to the boundaries of the proposed extension.

(b) That the petition is signed and acknowledged as required by law and is otherwise sufficient,

(c) That all the property and property owners within the proposed extension are benefited thereby,

(d) That all the property and property owners benefited are included within the limits of the proposed extension,

(e) That it is in the public interest to grant the relief sought, and

The permission of the State Comptroller not being required for the extension of said District, as provided by Town Law, Section 194, Subdivision 6; it is hereby

RESOLVED AND ORDERED that an Extension of the Riverhead Lighting District, to be known as Extension No. 3 of the Riverhead Lighting District, as described below, be and the same is hereby established, to wit:

BEGINNING at a point in the existing boundary line of the Riverhead Lighting District, said point being at the intersection of the southerly line of the land of the Long Island Rail Road with the center-line of Mill Road and running thence from said point of beginning southerly along the existing boundary line of the Peconic River; thence westerly along the center-line of the Peconic River to a point, which is in a prolongation southerly of the division-line between the lands of the Town of Riverhead and M. Phillips Estate and of O. Warner; thence northerly along the prolongation and the division-line between the lands of the Town of Riverhead and M. Phillips Estate and of O. Warner to a point in the southerly line of the land of the Long

Island Rail Road; thence easterly along the southerly line of the land of the Long Island Rail Road to the point or place of beginning.

Recreation Director Kenneth Rowland submitted a report to the Town Board on the matter of establishing a Rifle Range in the Town of Riverhead.

The report was ordered filed.

The proposition of establishing a Rifle Range was referred to the Recreation Committee for further study and report.

The matter of the West Second Street Parking Field, presently leased to the Town of Riverhead by Isidore Scheinberg and Saul Wolf was discussed by the Town Board.

Supervisor Vojvoda advised the Members of the Board that he would request the County Board of Supervisors to take the rental of this Parking Field under consideration, and further advised that should the County Board of Supervisors not meet this offer favorably, that the Town of Riverhead would under advisement renew the lease with Messrs. Scheinberg and Wolf, subject to permissive referendum.

The matter of the performance bond of Roanoke Homes, Inc., was brought to the attention of the Town Board by Town Attorney Shepard Scheinberg.

Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Costello.

WHEREAS, "Roanoke Homes, Inc." of 67 Long Neck Blvd., Flanders, Riverhead, New York as principal and Continental Casualty Company, an Illinois corporation authorized to do business in the state of New York having an office and place of business at 76 William Street, New York, New York, as surety did bind and obligate themselves, their successors and assigns, jointly and severally in the sum of \$26,000.00 to the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York as obligee under a performance bond dated December 12, 1961, which was conditioned upon the principal for the period beginning Dec-

ember 12, 1961, and ending December 12, 1963, to well and truly keep and in every respect comply with and conform to the provisions of the Resolution passed at a meeting of the Planning Board of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, held on the 25th day of May, 1961 requiring improvements of highways in the area known as "Section 2 'Roanoke Homes', Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York," and

WHEREAS, The said "Roanoke Homes, Inc". as principal has not fully complied with the aforesaid May 25, 1961 Resolution of the Planning Board, and

WHEREAS, The aforesaid Bond is in default, and

WHEREAS, The Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, considers it in the best interest of the Town that the period in which "Roanoke Homes, Inc." as principal has had to comply with the aforesaid May 25, 1961 Resolution of the Planning Board, be extended for a period of five (5) months to, but not including, the 1st day of June, 1964, provided that all grading of roads must be completed by April 1, 1964, all curbs must be installed by May 1, 1964, and all oiling of pavements and all other work must be completed by June 1, 1964, and

WHEREAS, in order to obtain the aforesaid five (5) months extension of time with the several conditions, a Resolution is required from the Planning Board to that effect,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Board strongly recommends that the Planning Board approve by means of a Resolution an extension to the time set forth in the performance bond of "Roanoke Homes, Inc." and Continental Casualty Company covering highway improvements to the area known as "Section 2, 'Roanoke Homes', Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York," for a period of five (5) months to, but not including the 1st day of June, 1964, provided that the aforesaid performance bond carry a rider which requires all grading of highways to be completed by April 1, 1964; all curbs to be installed by May 1, 1964; and all oiling of pavements and all other work to be completed by June 1, 1964.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The request of Norman Golub, Hicksville, N. Y., concerning an industrial subdivision at Raynor Avenue, Riverhead, N. Y., was discussed by the Town Board.

It was resolved that Mr. Norman Golub be advised to prepare and submit preliminary plans in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the Riverhead Town Planning Board and said plans to be reviewed by the Planning Board.

Supervisor's Report for the month of December, 1963 was submitted to the Board, and ordered filed.

Building Inspector's Report for the month of December, 1963 was submitted to the Board and ordered filed.

Tax Receiver's Statement of Tax Collections as of January 2, 1964 was submitted to the Board and ordered filed.

An Inventory Report of Highway Machinery, Tools and Equipment was submitted to the Board by Alex Horton, Supt. of Highways and ordered filed.

The Annual Police Report for the year 1963 was submitted to the Board by Police Chief Stephen J. Grodski and ordered filed.

The Members of the Town Board examined the Annual Report of the Police Department and expressed an observation that the various categories as tabulated by the Police Chief, entailed concentrated effort. The Board unanimously commended Police Chief Grodski on the application he employed to finalize the report in such comprehensive sequence, and further directed that the commendation be so recorded on the minutes of this meeting.

Councilman Grodski offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

RESOLVED, That the Plans, Specifications and Contract documents covering the alterations to the building known as "54 West Main Street, Riverhead, New York," be and hereby are approved as satisfactory by the Town Board of Riverhead.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Councilman Grodski offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

RESOLVED, That the Town Clerk of the Town of Riverhead, be and hereby is directed to advertise in the News Review, on January 16, 1964, for sealed bids covering the alterations to the building known as "54 West Main Street, Riverhead, New York."

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Councilman Grodski offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

RESOLVED, That the Town Clerk be and hereby is designated to open publicly and read aloud on Friday, January 31st, 1964, at 11:00 AM at the Town Clerk's Office in the Town Hall, 220 Roanoke Avenue, Riverhead, New York, all sealed bids addressed to the "Town Board of Riverhead, Riverhead, New York," and which bear the designation "Alterations to Building Known as '54 West Main Street, Riverhead, New York' ", and it is further

RESOLVED, That the Town Supervisor and the two Justices of the Peace be and hereby are directed to be present on Friday, January 31, 1964, at 11:00 AM at the Town Clerk's Office in the Town Hall of Riverhead to see all bids publicly opened and to hear them read aloud, and it is further

RESOLVED, That the Town Clerk shall make a record of such bids and present the same at the Town Board Meeting to be held on February 4th, 1964.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution, which was seconded by Justice Costello.

RESOLUTION ADDING AMENDMENT TO WELFARE WORK RELIEF  
PROJECT RESOLUTION ADOPTED ON DECEMBER 17, 1963.

RESOLVED, That the resolution on Welfare Work Relief Project directing employable Home Relief recipients to perform Town Work, adopted by the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead on December 17, 1963, be amended to include parents who are unemployed and receive grants under Temporary Aid to Dependent Children and all recipients of public assistance who are able to perform work.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

RESOLVED, That the County of Suffolk be requested to acquire the balance of the Hollis Warner property as originally recommended for acquisition under the Wetlands program and including a parcel owned by A. Ogeka of approximately 14 acres; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the County of Suffolk, after having made said additional acquisition, be requested to permit the Town of Riverhead to administer the part of such lands which lie south of Riverside Drive and front on Peconic River pursuant to a written agreement for an indefinite term, which agreement is to be made terminable at the Election of the County of Suffolk and which agreement is to provide that the Town of Riverhead, upon the termination of the agreement, is to be reimbursed by the County of Suffolk for the cost of any permanent improvements made to the property by the Town of Riverhead with the written consent of the County of Suffolk.

Councilman Young offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Zaloga.

RESOLVED, That Aurora Egert be appointed as Part-Time Clerk in the Highway Department, effective as of January 14th, 1964, and to be compensated at the rate of \$1.50, total

salary not to exceed \$1500.00 per year, payable semi-monthly.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Costello.

RESOLVED, That Elizabeth Edwards, Deputy Town Clerk, be and is hereby authorized to attend the Annual Meeting of the Association of Towns on Feb. 10, 11 and 12, 1964, and that all necessary expenses be charged to the General Town Fund.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Councilman Young offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Zaloga.

RESOLVED, That the Superintendent of Highways of the Town of Riverhead be and is hereby authorized to pay overtime compensation to Town of Riverhead Highway Employees for the period of January 1, 1964 to January 14, 1964, for Ice and Snow Control on Town and State Highways, in the amount of \$1008.90 for a total of 412 hours.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Councilman Young offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Zaloga.

RESOLVED, That the Town Clerk be and hereby is authorized to advertise in the January 16th, 1964, issue of the News Review for sealed bids for two (2) new 1964 Dump Trucks for the use of the Highway Department, which bids will be received by the Town Clerk at the Town Hall, 220 Roanoke Avenue, Riverhead, New York, up to 9:45 A. M., and will be publicly opened and read aloud at 11:00 A. M. on Tuesday, February 4th, 1964.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Zaloga called to the attention of the Town Board, the matter of the vacancy in the Riverhead Recreation Department brought about by the resignation of the Assistant Recreation Director. After some discussion, the Town Board referred the matter of the vacancy to the Recreation Commission.

The Town Board convened as a Board of Audit and examined all General Town bills as submitted on Warrant dated January 14, 1964, in the sum total of \$11,384.92.

Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Costello.

RESOLVED, That the General Town bills as submitted in the amount of \$11,384.92, be approved for payment.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Zaloga.

RESOLVED, That the Long Island Lighting Company be and it is hereby authorized to make a survey for street lighting in Riverhead Light District, Extension No. 3, established pursuant to resolution of the Town Board on January 14, 1964.


