

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, June 6, 1945 at 2:00 P.M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on May 16, 1945 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A report of the joint Committee on the creation of a proposed Garbage Collection District in the village of Riverhead was given and after much discussion, the matter was deferred until Tuesday evening, June 12, 1945 at 8:00 P.M. at which time the Committee will meet with the Town Board.

A communication from Charles O. Conklin tendering his resignation as Police Patrolman for the Town of Riverhead, effective as of June 15, 1945, was read and motion and vote was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that the resignation of Charles O. Conklin as Police Patrolman effective as of June 15, 1945, be accepted with regret. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

A communication was read from the Commissioners of the Riverhead Fire District together with a resolution duly adopted by that Board, stating that whereas the Riverhead Fire District is located in the Towns of Riverhead and Southampton and as the taxes for the purpose of such District are apportioned on the sole basis of the assessed valuation of the real property subject to taxation therein, requested that the Town Board procure an equalization of the taxes within such joint and special District pursuant to the provisions of Section 54A of the Tax Law. The matter was referred to the Town Attorney.

The Police and Welfare reports for the month of May 1945 were submitted to the Board and on motion and vote were accepted and ordered placed on file.

Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes submitted a report of the amount of taxes collected as of June 1, 1945 and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Justice Yousik offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Leonard,

WHEREAS pursuant to resolution adopted October 1st, 1940 by the Town Board, Town of Riverhead, for the purpose of supplying loan, for the repair

of the Town roads, purchased from Franklin H. Young, the premises first hereinafter generally described and more particularly shown on map of survey entitled "Survey for Town of Riverhead, Baiting Hollow, Suffolk County, N.Y. dated September 27, 1944 surveyed by Daniel R. Young, P.E. & L.S. Alden W. Young L.S. Riverhead, N.Y. to wit:

Premises at Baiting Hollow, School District #3 in the Town of Riverhead bounded:- North by Youngs Ave., West by Edward J. Goozda; South by Edward J. Goozda and land owned in common by John Warner Estate and another; East by Nassau Point Club Properties, Inc., containing according to the above survey 7.14 acres, and

WHEREAS said premises are included within and constitute the most Southernly part lying South of Youngs Ave. of the following tax assessment, to wit:-

Town of Riverhead, at Baiting Hollow, School District #3  
Assessed to Franklin H. Young  
North by M. Marycz; East by Town Property and others  
South by E.J. Goozda and others  
West by William & M.C. Linnen Est.  
except Youngs Ave; 25 Acres. and

WHEREAS the Town of Riverhead entered into possession of said 7.14 Acre purchase on or about October 1, 1940 and ever since continued in possession and has used said premises by removing the loam therefrom or a portion thereof for the road purposes aforesaid, and

WHEREAS the Town has paid the purchase price for said premises and has long since been entitled to a deed thereto but the execution and delivery of said deed to the Town has been held in abeyance pending further negotiations with the same seller for acquiring from him other property for the same purpose and said negotiations have now terminated, and

WHEREAS the taxes levied against said 25 acre assessment for the years 1940-1941; 1941-1942; 1942-1943; 1943-1944 and 1944-1945 have been regularly paid by Franklin H. Young, the seller, and as part of the consideration for the sale and purchase of said 7.14 Acre parcel, it was agreed that said portion of the above assessment should be exempt for taxation for the taxable years following October 1st, 1940 on which date the Town made it's purchase and entered into possession of said premises, now therefore be it


RESOLVED that the Board of Assessors of the Town of Riverhead be instructed to apportion from 25 Acre assessment the valuation of said 7.14 acre parcel and that it make it's certificate of such apportionment for the above mentioned years, and be it further

RESOLVED that a certified copy of this resolution together with said Board of Assessors certificate be presented to the County Treasurer of Suffolk County and to the Receiver of Taxes of the Town of Riverhead for the purpose of an application to have the apportionment amount of taxes paid on said 7.14 Acre parcel as the valuation thereof from the Board of Assessors certificate for the years 1940-41; 1941-42; 1942-1943; 1943-1944 and 1944-1945 refunded to Franklin H. Young of Riverhead, N.Y. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Leonard and seconded by Justice Yousik it was RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be authorized to transfer the account in the Suffolk County National Bank under the name- Town of Riverhead - Highway Account - B.F.Howell, Supervisor in the amount of \$30.95 to the General Town Account. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town bills to date.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, June 20, 1945 at 2:00 P.M.
