

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, August 6, 1952 at 2:00 P.M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on July 16, 1952 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A petition was read from 27 residents and taxpayers from the Hamlet of Wading River requesting that a full time policeman be stationed at or near their community to prevent further breaches of the peace and violations of the Law. The petition was ordered placed on file.

Mr. Leonard Waxler representing the above residents together with a delegation from Wading River addressed the Board explaining the many problems they have at their beach properties adjacent to the public beach at Wading River such as damaging, disturbing and trespassing to the extent that peace, quiet and enjoyment of their private properties have been interfered with. They made the following suggestions which they thought would possibly alleviate the situation, mark the lines in the parking field more clearly, place "No Trespass" signs on both boundaries of the public beach thus showing where public property ends and private property begins, and paint by order of the Police Department or other authority on the present signs "No Parking after 10 P.M." in the parking area.

The Town Board assured the delegation that the parking field would be marked and the signs placed, however, suggested that they also properly post their private properties with "No Trespass" signs which would give more effect.

Supervisor Kelly declared the Public Hearing on the contracts for fire protection for the Riverhead Fire Protection District open, pursuant to resolution adopted July 16, 1952.

On motion and vote the above public hearing was adjourned to the next regular meeting of the Town Board to be held in the Town Hall on Wednesday August 20, 1952 at 2:30 P.M.

The Supervisor's Report for the month of July 1952 was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The Police Report for the month of July 1952 was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes submitted a final report dated July 25, 1952 for the 1951-52 fiscal year and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

A certification from Milton L. Burns, County Treasurer of Suffolk County that the Bond of Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes of the Town of Riverhead with the Great American Indemnity Company of New York dated November 5, 1951 in the amount of \$25,000.00 has been satisfied and may be discharged of record, the conditions thereof having been in all things fulfilled. The certification was ordered placed on file.

A resolution was read from the Suffolk County Board of Supervisors stating that this Board hereby fixes Monday, November 24, 1952, as the date of the meeting at which taxes for the next fiscal year will be levied. The resolution was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved, that Mrs Norman J. Bruen be and she hereby is appointed Attendance Supervisor for School Districts Nos. 1,2,3,4,12 and 13 in the Town of Riverhead for the year 1952-53, and further

RESOLVED, that Howard A. Wells be and he hereby is appointed Attendance Supervisor for School Districts Nos. 8,9,10 and 11 in the Town of Riverhead for the year 1952-53, and be it further

RESOLVED, that their compensation be fixed at the rate of \$250.00 per year each, payable in ten monthly payments, which compensation shall include all expenses other than those incurred when attending meetings outside of the Town of Riverhead, called by the District Superintendent of Schools, at which time actual expenses are to be paid. The Vote, Justices Yousik, Gatz and Leonard Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The requests for the regulation of night parking at Pier Avenue Beach, Reeves Park Picnic Grounds and the lowering the water level at the Calverton dam was brought to the attention of the Board with no action taken.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved, that the Supt. of Highways be authorized to attend a convention of Supt. of Highways to be held at the City of Rochester, N.Y. on Sept. 15, 1952 and that all his necessary expenses be paid. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all town bills to date the totals of which were as follows: General Town Fund-\$3327.63, Highway Machinery Fund-\$309.80.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, August 20, 1952 at 2:00 P.M.
