

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, August 20, 1952 at 2:00 P.M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on August 6, 1952 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication was read from Harry B. Ward, District Supt. of Schools confirming the appointments of Mrs Norman J. Bruen and Howard A. Wells as Attendance Supervisors for common school districts of Riverhead Town for the school year 1952-53. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from Arch Bishop Thomas E. Molloy of Brooklyn advising the Board that St. Isidore's Paris of Riverhead as well as himself are very pleased to deed a strip of land to the Town of Riverhead for the purpose of widening Marcy Avenue. The communication was ordered placed on file.

Supervisor Kelly declared the ajourned public hearing on the matter of contracts for fire protection for the Riverhead Fire Protection District open and anyone who wished could be heard at that time.

Mr. Lester M. Emmett and Mr. William B. Gellatly representing the Wading River Fire Department, Inc. discussed the matter of their contract with the Town Board.

No one else wishing to be heard the hearing was thereupon declared closed.

On motion made by Justice Gatz and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved that the sum of \$13,500.00 be appropriated for the purpose of purchasing fire protection for the Riverhead Fire Protection District for the year 1953, and further

RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead enter into contracts with the Riverhead Fire District, the Wading River Fire Dept. Inc., the Manorville Fire Department, Inc. and the Jamesport-South Jamesport Fire Department, Inc. for such fire protection and that the said sum of \$13,500.00 be prorated between the aforesaid Fire Departments, according to the assessed valuation of their respective areas to be serviced, and be it further

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HOW IS FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY PROVEN?

There is more than one method to meet the financial responsibility requirements of the law. Nearly all New York motorists will choose to fulfill their obligation by purchasing an owner's policy of liability insurance. The law requires that you have in force an owner's policy of liability insurance with limits of at least \$10,000/\$20,000 and \$5,000 covering every automobile registered in your name. This means that you are insured up to \$10,000 for injury or death to one person in one accident caused by your motor vehicle, up to \$20,000 for injury or death to two or more persons in one accident, and up to \$5,000 for damage to property of others. Higher limits are available, of course, although not required by law.

Other forms of auto insurance designed to protect you or your car continue to be highly desirable but are not required by the new law.

An insurance company fully qualified to do business in New York will furnish to you the necessary Certificate of Insurance (Form FS-1) providing you carry a policy which includes the necessary liability coverages.

WHAT ARE THE OTHER METHODS TO PROVE FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY?

Rather than carry an owner's policy of liability insurance, some New York motorists will use one of the following alternatives permitted by the new law to prove their financial responsibility:

Financial security bond in the amount of \$25,000 executed by the owner of the motor vehicle and a surety company or by the car owner and two individual sureties each owning real estate worth \$25,000.

Financial security deposit of \$25,000 in cash or securities of a prescribed kind with

present Riverhead Fire Protection District be dissolved as soon as possible in order that smaller districts may be established. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Gatz and Leonard Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Venerable Charles W. MacLean addressed the Board in regard to the situation at the Iron Pier. He stated that the compaxion of the Beach has changed considerably during the past few years. He stated that until recent years, the beach, with few exceptions, was used solely by Riverhead Town residents but now it is mostly used by non-residents, especially at night to all hours. He said that the disturbances and the litering of the beach with broken bottles and other debris has become a nuisance. He also called the Board's attention to the parking situation and made the following suggestions: that the parking space be marked and that additional Police check-ups be made at night. The Board assured him that the matter will be looked into.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that the Littlefield Alger Co. be authorized to install a traffic light at the intersection of Roanoke Avenue and Second Street in accordance with their plans and specification dated June 12, 1952 for the sum not to exceed \$1,000.00, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Littlefield Alger Co. be authorized to install a traffic signal light at the intersection of Northville Turnpike and Elton Street for the sum not to exceed \$1300.00. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Gatz and Leonard Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Gatz offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Leonard,

RESOLVED, that this meeting adjourn in memory of Forrest G. Downs. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all town bills to date the totals of which were as follows: General Town Fund-\$316.00, Highway Machinery Fund-\$1273.26.
